2019 Lenten Message From the State Deputy

Dear Brother Knights of Saskatchewan,

1. Put your Faith Into Action by participating in the following Faith In Action Programs: Food for Families, Family Prayer, Good Friday Family Promotion, Marion Prayer Program, Holy Hour, Novena for Life, Helping Hands, Wheelchairs, and a Mass For People With Special Needs. 2. Attend the Spiritual Enrichment days held in Saskatoon on March 29th and 30th. This is a great opportunity for a time of Grace and Spiritual Growth.
3. Each council is asked to sign up at least 1 new member from now till the end of April. New members add enthusiasm and new ideas to your council. We need 33 more members to be "ON PACE" to the end of March. I ask each member in Saskatchewan to ask another Catholic man to join our Order.
4. The Annual Survey of Fraternal Activity needs to be completed by the end of March----GKs and FSs need to make sure your form is submitted.
5. All Councils are encouraged to send at least 1 delegate to the State Convention in Moose Jaw on April 26th-28th.
6. All Priests are invited to attend the Chaplains' Meeting held on Friday, April 26th and to attend the Opening Convention Mass. State Council will cover half the mileage and we ask Councils to cover the other half. A letter from State Chaplain Bishop Bryan will be sent to all Council Chaplains and Grand Knights. GKs, please talk to your council chaplains and encourage them to attend.
7. Thanks to all those who assisted in promoting the two projects in the last 2 months: The Vocations Endowment Campaign and the Conscience Protection Campaign. You can all be proud of these two great projects.

I thank all of you for all that you have done and continue to do to promote both programs and membership this Columbian year. Let us continue our good efforts.

I wish each of you a Lenten season filled with meaningful spiritual activities and a time of grace and spiritual growth.

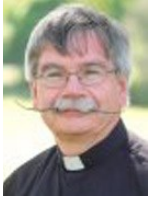

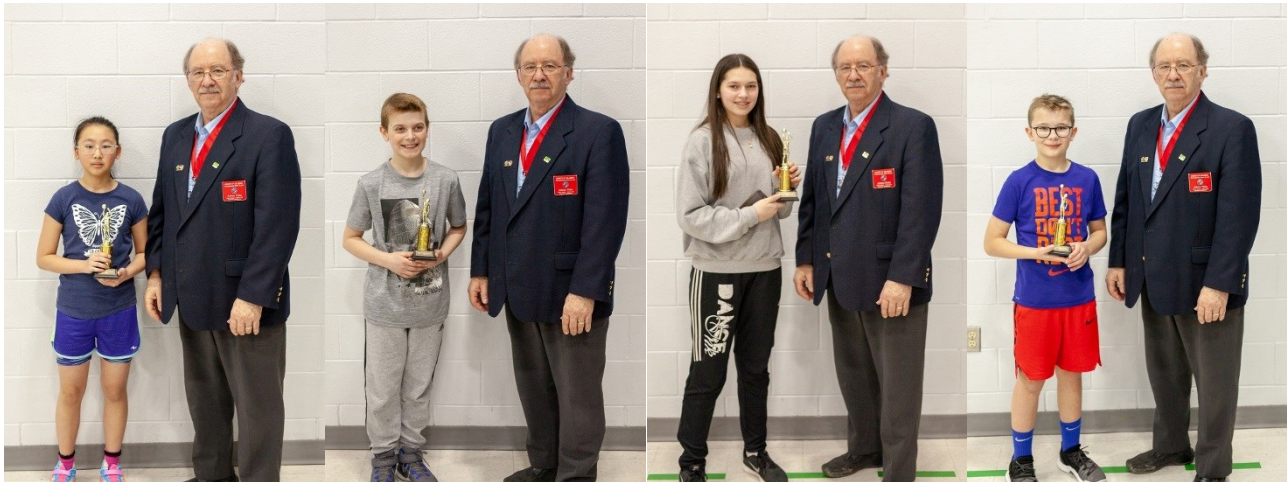

- We are a few weeks into Lent. Many of our fellow parishioners are unaware of opportunities to get involved in traditional Lenten practices of prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Make a difference this Lent - Faith In Action program model lets your council organize great Lenten programs - Friday Simple Suppers, 40 Cans for Lent drive, Helping Hands, Stations of the Cross, Mass, Rosary Program, Building the Domestic Church Kiosk, Sacrament of Reconciliation and Holy Week Celebrations. Good Friday Family Promotion - one of the most important ways to pray in Lent is on Good Friday at your parish's Liturgy of the Lord's Passion and Death. Every Knights of Columbus, your spouse and children should attend the Good Friday liturgy on April 19. It's an important way of building up and sharing the joy of your own domestic church. 2019 State Convention - Moose Jaw - April 26-28

- We are less than 1 1/2 months away from our 2019 State Convention. All councils should have their delegates and alternate delegates selected and registration form filled out and sent in. April 19, 2019 is the deadline for early registration fees.
 - Thank you to all the councils that submitted their Council Activity Program Description Forms, Family of the Year Form and their STSP - State Council Service Program Awards Entry Form. The State Program Directors are currently reviewing all your Council Activity Program Description Form reports and will be selecting, for each of the categories, the top best well-rounded Faith in Action program for that category. Activity Program Awards will be based on three levels - councils over 80 members, councils with 51 to 80 members and councils under 50 members. Awards will be handed out at the State Convention.
 - STSP Form - for each of the following Service Program Categories - Faith, Family, Community and Life, from all the submitted reports, one council from each category, will be selected for the award. Awards will be handed out at the State Convention.
- Family of the Year Entry Form - from all submitted reports, one family will be selected and award handed out at the State Convention.

Supreme Forms:

- **Form 1295-2 – Semi-annual Council Audit** - was due February 15.
- **Form 1728 - Annual Survey of Fraternal Activity** - was due January 31. If you missed the deadline, there is still time to submit your form through Officer's Online.
- **Form 10784 - Fraternal Programs Report Form**

- Use the revised all-in-one form. It replaces 24 individual report forms.

All revised forms are available and can be downloaded from the Supreme website kofc.org/forms. Please review and get familiar with the new revised forms.

Safe Environment - Office of Youth Protection:

- Are your Safe Environment Program requirements completed?

- Grand Knight - training
- Program Director - training
- Family Director - training and background check
- Community Director - training and background check

Remain compliant with updated Safe Environment requirements (see kofc.org/safe for details).

SP-7 - Columbian Award Application - due by June 30, 2019

In order to qualify for the Columbian Award, your council must:

1. Annually conduct and report at least four (4) major involvement programs in each of the sections: Faith Programs, Family Programs, Community Programs and Life Programs.
2. Recommended programs and the required program for each category are listed on the application. Councils are permitted to report programs that are not part of the recommended group as long as the program is reported in the proper category.
3. If your council reports a featured program in any category, ensure that the program's minimum requirements are met and reported on the designated form in order to receive credit for two activities in that category. The minimum requirements for each featured program are located in the Faith In Action Guidebook (#10590).
4. Submit the Annual Survey of Fraternal Activity (#1728). New councils instituted after November 1 of the current fraternal year do not need to meet this requirement.
5. Submit the Service Program Personnel Report (#365) with required roles and meet the Safe Environment Program compliance requirement. The most efficient way for submission is by using the Member Management Application.
6. Maintain compliance with the Safe Environment Program throughout the fraternal year. Report all updates for the Community Director, Family Director, and Program Director roles in a timely manner so that training and background checks can be completed before the end of the fraternal year.

All reported programs should be tangible actions performed by council that engage the membership base, enhance faith and spirituality, and strengthen family life within the parish.

Examples of activities that **should not** be reported on the Columbian Award application: Eucharistic minister, lector, ushers, choir, coaching, school board volunteering, donations (monetary and goods), scholarships, sponsoring of trips and teams, etc.

Founder's Day, March 29, marks the anniversary of our Order receiving its Charter from the State of Connecticut in 1882. Encourage your Council to celebrate this occasion by honouring our Founder Venerable Michael J. McGivney.

One of the best ways to honour our Founder is to join the Father Michael J. McGivney Guild. The Guild serves as a source for information about the life, works and spirituality of Father McGivney. The Guild distributes informational materials about him, receives reports of favours granted through his intercession and oversees the distribution of relics. Guild members receive regular updates on the progress of Father McGivney's cause for canonization and are invited to participate in promoting devotion to this Servant of God. Members of the Knights of Columbus are not automatically Guild Members and must elect to join the Guild. The Guild Newsletter is published bi-monthly except July and August. 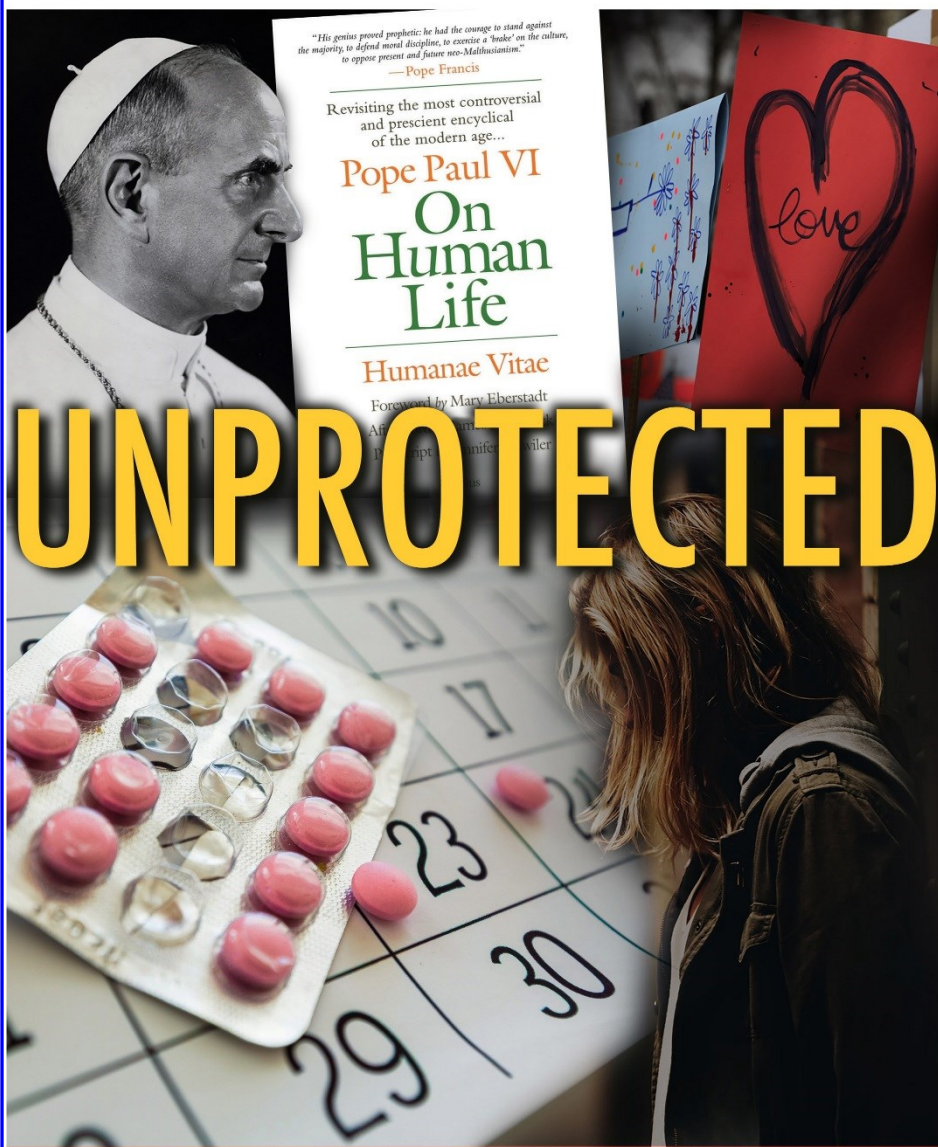

UNPROTECTED

How did our culture become so toxic toward women? #Metoo. Sexting pressure. Hook-up culture. Teenage depression. This is the fallout from the sexual chaos we find ourselves in today. One man foresaw this all so clearly 50 years ago? *Humanae Vitae* is an encyclical written by Pope Paul VI in 1968. It re-affirmed the orthodox teaching of the Catholic Church regarding married love, responsible parenthood, and the rejection of artificial contraception. It accurately predicted many of the perils we face today resulting from sexual immorality which has become mainstream in the aftermath of the sexual revolution. "Unprotected – The Pope, the Pill and Perils of Sexual Chaos" is a powerful new documentary about *Humanae Vitae*. It reveals the devastating effects of 50 years of the sexual revolution, and the counter-cultural movement today that is rising from its ashes.

Holy Family Parish will be screening the documentary and encourages Catholics from across the city to come to participate in the viewing and discussion that follows. This video is particularly well suited to youths in high school and beyond, their parents, educators, and anyone interested in learning more about Catholic teaching on many sexual issues. The viewing will be followed by dialogue and questions with Diocesan Theologian Brett Salkeld.

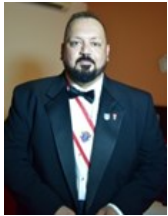

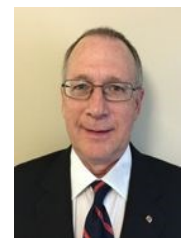

The Sask K of C Charitable Foundation has had the privilege of working together with our Bishops, Councils and parish priests throughout the province in introducing the K of C Vocations Endowment.

We have been extremely blessed with the response and generosity exhibited by members and parishioners in their demonstration of support.

Our target was to have each Council raise \$25.00/member over the 3 year campaign. We also asked each 4th Degree Assembly to donate \$500.00 each. The total target for the 3 years was established at \$270,725.00. The Sask K of C Charitable Foundation agreed to match all donations up to \$250,000.00 over the 3 years.
