By spending time this next month with your Council leadership and members to plan your Programs, Events Calendar and Membership Growth events (Church Drives and Exemplifications) your Council will provide a clear vision of engagement for your Members. A comment I recently heard attending a function in Milwaukee was from 2 Grand Knights conversing (sitting next to me at a table, I don't believe they were aware I was the State Deputy ()—and it had to do with the fact that the State focuses only on in-take of new members and not helping them get their existing members active or engaged.

Engaging council members to attend a Council Meeting may not be of interest to them—but engaging them to participate in a PROGRAM or a CHARITABLE EVENT or a FAMILY FOCUSED EVENT may be. If you can provide them a CALENDAR of all of the events to occur over not just the coming month, but the coming 6-12 months and INVITE THEM TO ATTEND AT LEAST 1 EVENT—do you think you'll have better success than notifying them only a few weeks before? WILL THIS PROVIDE council leaders ample time to reach out with a PHONE CALL to every council member INVITING THEM to these events—and seeing which one is of interest for them to attend or to help with?

NO NEIGHBOR LEFT BEHIND—an initiative from the Knights at the start of COVID was an action for every council to reach out to their Council Members. I had a 500+ member Council that reached out to every member in their Council—and it was met with some NEW ideas and ways to engage their members. So let me ask—if something has been proven to be effective in engaging our members in the past...why don't we continue to do this?? WHY CAN'T WE LEARN FROM THE PAST AND NOT REPEAT FUTURE MISTAKES?? Now—you may have noticed that I've highlighted some 'Yogi'isms' throughout this message...and as I transition from State Deputy messages to Membership Director messages over the next year—I will try to highlight some 'COREY'ISMS' instead. Finish Strong, Plan for Success

Brothers,

As we look at the end of the Fraternal Year, it is important that Councils Finish Strong and Plan for Success in the upcoming Fraternal Year.

In terms of finishing strong, your Councils have worked hard all year, and we owe it to our membership to make sure that our Councils are recognized for that hard work. At a minimum, every Council should submit an SP-7 Columbian Award Application. In addition, Councils should review their Safe

Environment Compliance, as well as the number of Fraternal Benefits Nights that they have been credited with. Finally, Councils should review their roster very carefully to make sure that all new members show up on their Roster.

When it comes to Planning for Success, all Councils should take time to meet with their Pastors. This is a great time to find out where Father needs your help, as well as to review the prior year's programs and their impact on your Parish Community. Following this meeting, it is important to plan out the Councils program for the year, including Exemplifications, Church Drives, Faith Programs, Family Programs, Community Programs, and Life Programs. As you plan your programs, reach out to the membership to

try and get chairs for each program. This is your opportunity to involve new members in your programs. This is also the time to work with your Parish to resolve any date conflicts.

Planning now, will enable your Council to start the new Fraternal Year in July with a strong plan for success. Bring your Council Plan to the District Meeting in July to share with your District Deputy and the other Councils in your District.

In Addition to putting the program plan in place, it is important to get Forms 185 and 365 submitted in a timely manner. When you fill out these forms, make sure that all of the required positions are filled. Please note that the required Directors (Program, Family, Community) for Safe Environment Compliance must all be filled by 3 different people. You must fill all of the required positions in order for Supreme to give you credit for submitting these forms. As you fill positions, take a few minutes to set expectations for those filling the positions. It is important to note that failure to set expectations often leads to lake of activity by those assigned. Expectations do not need to be elaborate, just an understanding of what needs to be done, and how best to follow up. I am asking that every Council take steps to invite more brothers to share the load, by inviting them to take on leadership roles, especially our younger members. To build a bench for the future, we need every Council to help by inviting more men to carry the load.

Imagine the new energy our Councils, Districts, and State will have, when every Council doubles the number of men involved in leadership positions. I know that this is a big ask. I am asking for your help in making this happen to secure our future.

Brothers, again I thank you for the giving me the opportunity to serve as your State Deputy. Working Together we will grow the Knights of Columbus in the State of Wisconsin.

<u>Membership Notes – June 2022</u>



QR CODE



What is this? According to WIKIPEDIA, this is called a "QR code" (an initialism for quick response code) is a type of matrix barcode (or two-dimensional barcode) invented in 1994 by the Japanese automotive company Denso Wave. A barcode is a machine-readable optical label that can contain information about the item to which it is attached. In practice, QR codes often contain data for a locator, identifier, or tracker that points to a website or application. A QR code uses four standardized encoding modes (numeric, alphanumeric, byte/binary, and kanji) to store data efficiently; extensions may also be used.

The Quick Response system became popular outside the automotive industry due to its fast readability and greater storage capacity compared to standard UPC barcodes. Applications include product tracking, item identification, time tracking, document management, and general marketing.

A QR code consists of black squares arranged in a square grid on a white background, which can be read by an imaging device such as a camera, and processed using Reed–Solomon error correction until the image can be appropriately interpreted. The required data is then extracted from patterns that are present in both horizontal and vertical components of the image.

This particular QR code directs users to **kofc.org/join** webpage where prospective new members can learn about the Knights and join as an "E-Member". Can you think of ways to utilize this code to invite new members into your council?

Eucharistic Revival – all councils should assist their Bishops, Priests and Deacons in elevating the solemnity and reverence of Eucharistic Processions.

Engagement



One of the keys to growing your council is inviting families to join – would you agree? Well, how do we do that? One key to growing your social media presence is 'Engagement'. This can be true whether your council is using social media or not, but let's focus on the social media aspect first.

Engagement is key to growing your councils and for that matter your parishes presence on social media. Without engagement, the algorithm (on any platform) will quit showing your content to your followers as well as potential new followers.

So, how do we increase our followers to like and comment on our posts so you can grow?

Here are five simple strategies that you can implement right now:

1. ALWAYS INCLUDE AN IMAGE

Did you know that Facebook posts with an image get 2.3 times more engagement than posts without an image? No matter what social media network you're posting to, always include an image with your status update. It's the easiest way to DOUBLE you engagement.

2. ASK QUESTIONS

According to social media marketing experts "Of all the different types of posts I make, questions generate the most comments." Make sense. The questions don't necessarily need to be deep or related to the Knights. Remember the idea is to invite and encage followers, so be careful of the questions you post.

3. USE HASTAGS

Including hashtags in your social media posts is a quick and easy way to improve your social media marketing results. As long as you're using the right hashtags more people will find your content, engage with it, and follow you!

4. SHARE INSPIRATIONAL CONTENT

With so much negativity in the world, people want to see positive, inspiring, and uplifting content on social media. Plus, most businesses spend so much time self-promoting that your followers will find it refreshing to see a post that's meant to brighten their day, not sell them something.

5. CELEBRATE HOLIDAYS

Not only do holiday posts tend to generate lots of "likes" but they're some of the easiest posts you'll create all year. Under this heading include, hightlighting your councils activities, awards, events.

Beatification Father Michael McGivney

The establishment of the Father McGivney Guild was certainly a milestone marking the path to our founder's canonization. It operates out of the Supreme Council office in New Haven CT. The guild serves as a clearinghouse for information regarding Father McGivney, promotes devotion to his memory, develops and distributes materials about his life and virtue, receives reports of favors received through Father McGivney's intercession, and receives news of possible miracles. Membership in the guild is open to anyone interested in Father McGivney and his cause, including members of the Knights of Columbus and their families. A guild newsletter is sent to members several times a year. All materials produced to promote information and devotion to Father McGivney are automatically distributed to members of the guild

and, once a month, a mass is offered at St. Mary's Church in New Haven.

Guild membership is now more than 178,000. The Roman process of investigation into Father McGivney's life and holiness is nearing completion, and the investigation into the reported miracle is progressing. Don't be fooled. The growth of the Guild is but one step along the way. There are over 1.8 million members of the Knights of Columbus. Why are so many so hesitant to join the Guild? We have over 35,000 members alone in Wisconsin but as of 4/1/2022 there are only 1,239 Guild member in our State. Council PKD and Culture of Life Contributions

It's that time of year again where PKD and CoL collection will come due. I'd like to review how a council can verify what they owe for each, and where to send payment.

As you know, PKD or Penny a Knight a Day supports Catholic Education across the dioceses of Wisconsin. Your contribution stays in your diocese, and a check is provided by the State Council each year to your bishop to be used in supporting your local Catholic schools.

PKD is calculated by multiplying \$3.65 (a penny each day of the year) based in the number of members un each council as of July 1st for each member of your council minus Inactive members and Exemption (formerly disabled) members. Last year this article incorrectly indicated to remove honorary life and exemption members; consider this a retraction. The amount due for your council can be found on the State Council Website. To get there, type WIKOFC.com into a web browser and it will forward you to UKnight for the St Council, or use link <u>https://uknight.org/StateCouncilSite/index.asp?CN=US&ST=WI</u>. Scroll down the main page to Penny-A-Knight-A-Day where you'll see the fearless Knight in armor. Click on "Read More" which will open a window, then click on the red button on labeled "Council P.K.D. Contributions As Of xx/xx/xxxx" date. This will open a PDF of a spreadsheet where you can look up your council and see what you owe. As checks are deposited you will see the updates and verify your contribution has been received. For Culture of Life (CoL), amounts due are calculated similar to PKD except the rate is \$3.50 per. To look up what your council owes, again go to the State Council webpage, but this time click on the gold button "State Forms" under the picture of the Brother Knight praying the Rosary. Scroll about half way down the page to Community, then sub title Culture of Life, then click on Culture of Life Council Fund Donations FY 2021-2022 (xx/xx/xxx) date. {*The link to this page can change so the best way to access this is to follow the above instructions*} A PDF of a spreadsheet will open allowing you to look up your council's Donations and Amount above or below goal. The amount is a combination of donations from the CoL mailer that went out in November and your council's contributions. Both the PKD and CoL donations are listed on member dues each year but are not required to be paid by members or councils, yet highly encouraged. CoL contributions help fund grants to Pro Life agencies and services across the state.

Checks should be written to Wisconsin State Council Knights of Columbus or WI State Council Knights for short. Payments should be sent to the State Council office: Knights of Columbus, 4297 W Beltline Hwy, Madison WI 53711.

Welcome to the new officers for the 2022-23 fraternal year, especially Grand Knights and Financial Secretaries. Please check your Prospect lists in Officers Online at least once a week. If you have men showing there, **CONTACT** them. **INVITE** them to your Council meetings and activities. While you are together, invite them to attend an in-person or online **DEGREE** ceremony. **After** <u>completing</u> the degree, **PROCESS** them into your council. This is as simple as entering the degree date (or council approval date for a prior member or transfer in) in the field and clicking the TRANSFER button. If the member does not wish to join your council, please REJECT him and select the appropriate reason. Then please contact me so I may take the appropriate action based on the reasoning. Please review the <u>RESOURCES</u> available to you so you may understand how better to perform your duties:

ONLINE MEMBERSHIP RESOURCES:

Please watch the short videos on the Supreme website <u>Membership Training</u>. Click on Membership in the left menu and you will see the available videos. Here are direct links to each.

REMINDERS:

When joining online, the requirement is that each new member must sign up himself.

Online membership is a way for men interested in joining the Knights of Columbus to do so online, it is <u>not</u> to be used as a data entry system to enter new members from form 100s, prospect cards or parish lists. Use the Candidate tab for that. Online membership requires a member to join with full knowledge, consent, and active participation in the process. As a reminder, if an individual does not truthfully answer all application declarations, his membership in the Knights of Columbus is void.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Every man who joins online needs to access <u>kofc.org/joinus</u> from a compatible device, <u>personally</u> complete the online application testifying to all the attestations, and submit the online application <u>himself</u>.
- When possible, the member should use his own compatible device.
- The member must use their own valid email address when completing the online application.
- There is a new (as of 02-22-22) process in joining online. Instead of having to enter a verification code (a source of error), after the member completes and submits the first page of the online join process, which include his email address, he is sent an email to verify the email address. That email will contain a clickable link (available for only 24-hours) to complete the join process. Should he fail to act within the 24-hour window, he will see an error message and must restart the join process.

NOT ALLOWABLE:

- Completing the online application for a member even if they have asked you to do it for them.
- Collecting information from a proposed member on a form 100 or prospect card and using the information to sign the member up for online membership.
- Creating an email account for a member so they can complete the online membership process.

NEW MEMBER PROCESS:

Follow the standard procedures for a new e-member as with <u>all new members</u>:

- Completed form 100, or assigned e-member status in Prospect tab of Officers Online (OO).
- Admission committee vetting.
- Council action (voting) see <u>Guidelines for Online Voting Motions</u> if holding virtual meetings
- Degree Member must take the degree **prior** to being transferred into a council.

- Process the new 3rd degree member into your council via Form 100 submission or,
 Online form 100 using the Candidate tab data entry and transfer, or e-member transfer using the Prospect tab.
- **<u>REMEMBER</u>**: If you use either the Prospect tab or the Candidate tab to process your new members, do NOT submit a mailed paper or scanned pdf of the form 100. It just confuses the issue and might result in duplicate entries. Use only one of the available methods.
- Update degree status by entering degree dates for 2nd & 3rd degrees in Member Management. This is not an automatic process

6) Plan to lead the parish, with father, for that Corpus Christi Eucharistic Procession or at another time that fits your schedules. Set up to do your Soccer Challenge and/or PPK before the September-October fall rush of events begins. 7) Don't forget to arrange for your Officer Installation and to be at your District Meeting in July.

It was truly great seeing so many people at the state convention. People who are

Culture of Life Update

Dear Brother Knights,

I don't normally beg for prayers, but we could use your prayers now, more than ever, for the end to abortion. Since the leak from the Supreme Court, giving us the hope that Roe may be overturned, there has been a change. It is as if that feeling of hope for the end to legal abortion was the match that lit a fire, both in the pro-life world and in the pro-choice world. And that fire is getting hotter. We are feeling the anger and seeing desperate attempts to intimidate the pro-life community and pro-life organizations.

But this fire of hope is fueling our work with the Knights of Columbus. We are working longer days, harder than ever. I thought we were burning the candle at both ends before the end of April. But lately, it's like drinking from a fire hose. Knights across the state are busier than ever, making sure our voices that speak for the babies are heard.

The Knights of Columbus have a strong presence around the state. In Madison, the Knights help with sidewalk counseling with Vigil for Life, which has been a strong year-round pro-life presence for years and they continue to be. In Sheboygan, there is a great core team of people with 40 Days for Life. We're working to expand those efforts to a year-round campaign. Chemical abortions are up to **39% of the abortion totals** in Wisconsin and the Sheboygan Planned Parenthood is dedicated to chemical abortions exclusively, so it makes sense to ramp up our outreach at this location.

In Milwaukee, Knights continue to come to the abortion centers to pray at three of the four abortion centers whenever they are open. There is also a core team of Knights in Milwaukee who consistently sidewalk counsel at both abortion centers and their results have been nothing short of miraculous. In 2021, there were 317 babies saved at Affiliated Medical Services in Milwaukee. As this is written, we have recorded 199 babies saved at that location and we haven't yet reached the end of May. At this pace, we're hoping to exceed 500 babies saved by the end of 2022, Lord willing!

On the very same day that the SCOTUS leak happened, the Wisconsin Department of Health Services announced that abortion numbers went DOWN in 2020 by 81 babies. That's a 1.2% decrease in abortions when compared to 2019 (6,511 v 6,430). Albeit a small decrease, I bet if you asked those 81 babies how huge they think this is, they would tell you they are happy to be alive. We are too! And Lord knows we tried to save all 6,430.

Our work in the pro-life movement will continue. We would love it to be in a post-Roe world. But whatever the decision, we will continue to support the causes of life. Knights of Columbus councils all over the state are covering the sidewalks at many of Planned Parenthood's 22 other referral centers. All of them would welcome additional help. If God is calling you to do more, please contact Dan.M@ProLifeWI.org to get involved!

Thank you again for your prayers. So much work has gone into the effort before I arrived on the scene, and there is still much to do. It's never easy—these are times the likes of which we haven't seen before. But God has placed us here, right now, exactly where we need to be. It makes me so proud to see all the work we've done together over the years and I look forward to standing with you in the work we have yet to do.
