DELEGATES TO THE 139th SUPREME CONVENTION

Denver, Colorado AUGUST 2-5, 2021

Wisconsin is allowed ten delegates to the Supreme Convention. The State Deputy and the Immediate Past State Deputy automatically serve as the first two delegates. The remaining eight delegates are selected by the vote of those delegates attending the State Convention. Delegates to the Supreme Convention must be 3rd Degree Knights, and at least half of our Delegates must be Insurance Members.

Supreme Council reimburses delegates per diem at \$400 per day for 3 days and mileage at \$.30 per mile one way.

In 2020, the Wisconsin State Council offered the opportunity for Candidates for State Office and those seeking election to be Delegates to the Supreme Convention to submit a Resume and Nomination Statement to be posted on the State Website. This information was well received by the membership as it allowed the delegates to get to know who they were voting for prior to the State Convention.

Since the Wisconsin State Council State Convention in 2021 is currently planned to be a Hybrid Convention, we are again offering the opportunity for those members wishing to be Candidates for either State Office or a Delegate to the Supreme Convention to submit a Resume, Picture, and Nomination Statement to be posted on the State Website.

The Delegates to the State Convention will meet during the Saturday afternoon session to nominate and elect deserving members who may represent them at the Supreme Convention. Per the State Council Bylaws, only seated Delegates can make nominations and have the privilege of a vote; although non-delegates can be nominated. Previous delegates to the Supreme Convention should not seek a nomination in order that other members be given a similar opportunity to serve as a Supreme Delegate.

It is very desirable that Delegates to the Supreme Convention be Knights who have been extraordinary in promoting Charity, Unity, Fraternity and Patriotism in the Knights of Columbus. The Delegates to this State Convention should be made aware of this Knight's accomplishments by the nomination speech given on his behalf.

Those seeking to be nominated as a Delegate to the Supreme Convention are encouraged to submit one or more of the following:

- One Page Resume
- Picture
- One Page Nomination Speech or Statement
- 3 Minute Video Nomination

It is requested that information be submitted prior to April 1 so that Councils can review the information and provide voting instructions to their delegates. Materials can be emailed to State Secretary John Huttenhoff at <u>jhuttenhoff@wikofc.com</u>.

Public Relations

Sharing the 3 main goals of publicity

Good public relations at the council level requires that councils fully understand the need and value of publicity.

- 1. Your council's story deserves recognition for their volunteer efforts. When your council receives recognition, members are more likely to continue to perform and remain active.
- 2. It helps to educate and inform men of your parish or community who are not Knights, increasing their interest in becoming a Knight.
- 3. Publicizing successful programs and good works is your most effective tool for council growth and reflects positively on the Order.

Six simple methods to success

- 1. Use the parish bulletin. A brief mention of the council's work for Habitat for Humanity, a parish clean-up, or visits to nursing homes can help educate the parish about the work that Knights do. Invite men in your parish to participate in future events giving the date, time and location to meet.
- 2. Feature your charitable activities, with photos, on the front page of your council newsletter and put copies in the literature rack in your church.
- 3. Ask local newspapers to publish a photo of Knights performing some charitable or community activity. Check your local newspapers to find out which print such photos, and then check the masthead to find the contact information for the faith, community or neighborhood section editors.
- Remember that articles must be newsworthy, have broad appeal and be concise with complete information. Always answer the five "w's" — who, what, when, where and why (and don't forget the "how").
- 5. Keep it short— use no more than 2 to 3 sentences for a photo caption and a few hundred words for an article. Only include relevant information people care little about the details of your council, who the grand knight is, when and where you meet, but they are interested in the good works you do.
- 6. Share your story with your diocesan newspaper or magazine, your state council newsletter, Columbia and Knightline. If any of these want a more detailed story, they will contact you.

Creating your own newsletter

The Wisconsin State Council has a monthly newsletter, put together by a dedicated team of Knights. We have Guidelines on How to Write an Article so that everyone knows what we are looking for. As a digital newsletter, it's easy to share: We share it via Flocknote, Facebook and on our State website.

Using social media

The main goal of establishing a social media presence on social media is spreading awareness about who we are as an Order, what inspires us to act, and how we put our faith into action. We hope these elements inspire men to join us. But they need content to engage with, something that relates to them. Good engagement on posts can drive your channel's followership. For instance, one post we had that firmly stated Jesus is the Son of God garnered more than 200 followers alone. It's important to understand your audience, once you understand them, go provide them with good, positive content because, at the end of the day, if we're not relevant to the audience we want (Catholic men) or giving them what they seek, then we might as well not have accounts.

- Article size: 300 words ideal (half page) to 500-600 words max (full page)
- Articles submitted as an attachment in Word format not in the body of an email

o PDF submissions are for ads or promotions - not articles.

• Pictures need to be sent separately as an attachment and the original pictures. Please do not

format them in any way, we will do it—DO NOT embedded in a Word document.

- Articles need to be brief, highly relevant, and actionable
- At a minimum, Who, What, When and Where needs to be in the first paragraph,
- Articles need to be brief, to-the-point and of interest to the entire State Council
 - o What is the event/activity about?
 - o Whom did it benefit?
 - o What was the result?
 - o Who are the key players/Knights?
- Similar story submissions will be consolidated/batched into one article by the Editors
- Authors must submit on time per the Editor production calendar- Deadline 1st of each month

o Late submittals will be placed farther down the newsletter or not published.

- Proof your article carefully for spelling and grammar before sending (use spellcheck)
- Document filename should reflect the office/title, i.e. Council 499 Food Drive
- "Wisconsin Knights in Action" section is new GKs submit brief 1 or 2 paragraphs only

PKD and Culture of Life

Council PKD and Culture of Life Contributions

Its that time of year again where PKD and CoL collection will come due. I'd like to review how a council can verify what they owe for each, and where to send payment.

As you know, PKD or Penny a Knight a Day supports Catholic Education across the dioceses of Wisconsin. Your contribution stays in your diocese, and a check is provided by the State Council each year to your bishop to be used in supporting your local Catholic schools.

PKD is calculated by multiplying \$3.65 for each member of your council minus honorary and disabled members. The amount due for your council can be found on the State Council Website. To get there, type WIKOFC.com into a web browser and it will forward you to UKnight for the St Council. Scroll down the main page to <u>Penny-A-Knight-A-Day</u> where you'll see the fearless knight in armor. Click on "Read More" which will open a window, then click on the red button on labeled "<u>Council P.K.D. Contributions</u> <u>As Of xx/xx/xxxx"</u> date. This will open a PDF of a spreadsheet where you can look up your council and see what you owe. As checks are deposited you will see the updates and verify your contribution has been received.

For Culture of Life (CoL), amounts due are calculated similar to PKD except the rate is \$3.50 per. To look up what your council owes, again go to the State Council webpage, but this time click on the gold button "State Forms" under the picture of Blessed Michael McGivney. Scroll about half way down the page to

<u>Community</u>, then sub title Culture of Life, then click on <u>Culture of Life Council Fund Donations FY</u> <u>2019-2020 (xx/xx/xxxx)</u> date. Again, a PDF of a spreadsheet will open allowing you to look up your council's Donations and Amount Above (or below) Goal. This amount is a combination of donations from the CoL mailer that went out in November and your council's contributions. Both the PKD and CoL donations are listed on member dues each year but are not required to be paid by members or councils, yet highly encouraged. CoL contributions help fund grants to Pro Life agencies and services across the state.

Checks should be written to Wisconsin State Council Knights of Columbus or WI State Council Knights for short. Payments should be sent to the State Council office: Knights of Columbus, 4297 W Beltline Hwy, Madison WI 53711.



MARCHing Into GROWTH

Membership Growth in Wisconsin is definitely on the upswing! Undoubtedly, the "Per Capita Forgiveness" INCENTIVE is the primary reason for the Growth we have seen.



From July through December, Wisconsin had 230 new members

join our ranks, or just over 38 new members per month. In the first two months of 2021, **we have added 109 new members,** or 54+ per month. That is a **70% increase**, which means our trajectory is definitely trending upward.

The results from the **"Per Capita Forgiveness" INCENTIVES** are pretty impressive but we still have FIFTEEN more days to improve upon them. That being said, <u>as of FEBRUARY 28th</u>:

- > SIXTY Councils are "On the Board" with at least ONE New Member
- TWENTY-FOUR Councils have MET Their Target Number and will NOT have to pay "Per Capita" this spring
- TWELVE Councils have EXCEEDED Their Target Number and will also NOT have to pay "Per Capita" this spring. That means 36 councils have already saves THOUSANDS!

✓ The SIXTY Councils represent just under 20% of our total number of councils in the state in the game.

Let's close out the "Per Capita" Incentive with a BANG!! Here are more than 140 Councils that are ONE New Member away from saving themselves hundreds of Dollars while GROWING Their Council. Do it NOW!

and start to work on them now! In the process, ask yourselves: are we at least 75% to our membership goal for the year (better 100% or more)? Have we completed our Child Safety Training Requirements? Do we have all of our forms in so far (185, 365, Audit, Fraternal Survey, 10784 forms sent to Supreme, State Forms address for Faith in Action and Leave No Neighbor Behind programs when completed)? Have you worked with your Field Agent/General Agent to get your 2 Fraternal Benefits Nights arranged/completed?

If you can answer yes to these questions, congratulations; you're well on your way toward your Star Council and Outstanding Council goals. If not, there's work to be done and it's time to get moving. Work with your officers, committee chairs, pastor and his team, DD, your RMCs and Diocesan Program Coordinator, etc. – all can join in to help achieve your goals and reach success for this Fraternal Year.

Remember also that your History Book should've been completed and in to your DD Feb. 1; your State Service Program Award nominations were due to State Officer or to me by March 1. State judging for these is due March 20. If not yet in, do so at once or contact me right away for more information.

In spite of the issues we've been facing, realize that many programs can still be done utilizing drive by, no contact, curbside, virtual and other forms of operation, as well as hybrid methods as well. Holy Hours, Spiritual Reflection and Rosary programs, Into the Breach, Food for Families and other pantry/meal programs, Family Fully Alive, Coats for Kids, knowledge and Free Throw Contests, Soccer Challenge, Helping Hands, Novena for Life, Pregnancy Center Support, fundraisers for many programs, parish programs and fundraisers, are only some of the possibilities. From fish fries to blood drives, many programs can still be done with restrictions and cautions.

A new program, the "Blessed Michael McGivney Prayer Hour" has just been introduced by Supreme as a Faith in Action program in and substitute for the Icon Program for the 2020-21 Fraternal Year. Be sure to get your State Convention registrations in soon – preferably online or contact State Office if necessary. We'd like to see you in attendance at the Convention whether in person or virtually.

Finally, I'd be remiss if I did not mention that the Worthy State Deputy and I have spearheaded an attempt to survey all of the parishes and pastors in the state regarding the KC presence in their parish,

Faith in Action and State programs they presently have or would like to have, prospects for new Councils and Roundtables, etc. While this is still a work in progress, one of the conclusions that stood out to me from the majority of parish responses so far was this: "the #1 thing we want from the Knights is to be visible in the parish, to participate in and support the programs the parish already has (and to help get people back to Mass), not to start new programs or impose KC programs on top of what we already have." I think that speaks loudly and clearly to us in terms of what we are doing, need to do. It also accents the idea that the programs listed on the previously mentioned SP&s and Outstanding Council forms need not be only those listed on the forms as examples or strictly FiA programs. They can be parish or local programs. The key thing is that they actually involve Knights, parishioners, families, hopefully serve as membership opportunities as well whenever possible and are more than just giving out a check.

I wish you much success in your March program efforts. Keep the faith – better days are ahead!

FORM 4584

All Councils should have filed the form 4584 by January 31st. I am sad to report that only 66 Councils in the state of Wisconsin filed for the calendar year 2020. It asks for member involvement, hours donated and monetary support given during the last calendar year. This form is very important to determine the size of the grant that we receive from Supreme. **EVERY COUNCIL** needs to file, even if they have not done anything for Special Olympics. I would be willing to bet that if you asked your membership, that at least a few members have done something to support Special Olympics, whether it was through a Council activity or on their own.

Effective immediately Special Olympics programs should be reported on the online Form 10784. This replaces the Form 4584 that has been used for years. As I understand Councils should report on this form as soon as possible after a donation or event for Special Olympics. Councils are not to wait till the end of year to report.

TEAM WISCONSIN DRIVE

Tootsie roll orders have slowly been trickling in. I realize that only about 100 councils ran a drive last year but I have not seen that many orders yet. Please check your stock and make plans for your drive. All Tootsie Roll orders need to be in by March 15. Councils must send their requests to their respective District Deputies. There is free shipping for us if an order is 33 cases or more. The state will pick up shipping costs for 18-32 cases. No orders can be processed if less than that amount which is why we combine districts when necessary. Orders must be in writing, do not send a phone message as there must be a written record. If you do not have a district deputy, send your council order to me. Since we have opened the window for your drive we hope that summer may be a better time for your drive. As an example my council ran it the last weekend in August and set a new collection record in spite of the COVID-19 Pandemic. Have your members wear masks and gloves and most people will not be concerned about having contact.

Monies from the drive must be submitted by September 1st of this year. Due to the COVID situation we were down roughly \$100,000 from our normal intake. I hope that your council will have great success in their drive.
