Beatification Father Michael McGivney

So, who is this Venerable Servant of God, this son of a poor Irish immigrants, who lived and died more than a century ago? We do know if it not for him, we Knights of Columbus would not be here today, but what else do we know?

By all accounts he was a simple parish priest, deeply in loved by his congregation for his generous spirit and gentle demeanor. Yet his mildness was masked by an unrelenting determination to address the difficulties and frustrations of catholic families of his day.

To be "Catholic" in New Haven, CT, in 1877 was difficult at best. The year that Father McGivney arrived to assume his post as curate at St.

Mary's Church, anti-Catholicism was a strong force in society. In face of these difficulties, Father McGivney was particularly devoted to the young families, it was this "up and coming" generation that he addressed so many of his words of inspiration and encouragement. It was a time when many young Catholic men were tempted to escape their poverty by abandoning the faith in favor of social standing by joining one of the many condemned secret societies. Few turned to drink. And not a few died young, leaving behind families who were suddenly destitute. The young Father McGivney made up his mind to do something about it.

Conceiving the idea of a society of Catholic laymen that would unite its members in a Brotherhood to:

- 1. Strengthen each other in the faith;
- 2. Provide for the welfare of a members family in the event of his serious illness or death;
- 3. Restore a sense of pride in the nation's Catholic heritage;
- 4. Serve the church and the community;
- 5. Support the Bishops and Priests.

With that dream in mind, in the fall of 1881, he called a group of young professionals and working men to a meeting in the basement of St. Mary's Church where he shared is vision and our Order began.

Through the Knights of Columbus, Fr. McGivney lives on. Interest in the life and holiness of our founder has increased steadily since the order celebrated its centennial in 1982. The momentum of devotion to Fr. McGivney and our serious historical investigation into his life and virtue have given birth to what has long been a desire for many of our members: the promotion of his cause for canonization. December 17, 1997, marked the moment when the church herself, having considered the merits of the case, formally inaugurated the cause for canonization of the Venerable Michael McGivney, in the archdiocese of Hartford, CT. Under the guidance of Archbishop Daniel Cronin and with the enthusiastic endorsement of our then Supreme Chaplain, Bishop Thomas Daily, a process of historical research and theological evaluation was begun in earnest. This painstaking phase in the canonization process was concluded and carried to Rome by Dominican Father Gabriel O'Donnell, postulator for Father McGivney's cause. The sacred congregation concluded its consideration of Father McGivney's cause with a favorable judgment.

In March 2008, Fr. McGivney was declared a Venerable Servant of God by Pope Benedict XVI, who during his visit to St. Patrick's Cathedral cited the "remarkable accomplishment of that exemplary American priest, the Venerable Michael McGivney, whose vision and zeal led to the establishment of the Knights of Columbus'." Now twelve years later, May 27, 2020, Pope Francis approved the promulgation of a decree recognizing a miracle attributed to the intercession of our founder declared "Blessed," to the step just prior to sainthood. An additional miracle attributed to Father McGivney's intercession will be required for his canonization as saint.

There were three miracles submitted to the Vatican. One was in 2004 concerning a religious brother with cancer who was healed after he has touched with a second-class relic. That was not accepted. The second was a fisherman in the Philippines, who was shot by two men, hit 13 times, rushed to hospital, he survived after praying to Fr. McGivney. That too was also not accepted.

The third miracle was an unborn child who was healed in the womb, when the parent's prayed to Father McGivney. The dad is a General Agent. Child is now 5 years old. And named Michael. With the joyous news that, on May 26, 2020, Pope Francis approved this miracle through Father McGivney's intercession, the next step in the process will be a beatification Mass, to be held October 31,2020, in the Cathedral of St. Joseph in Hartford, Conn. At that time, the founder of the Knights of Columbus will be declared "Blessed" and his feast day will be set. Father McGivney will be the first U.S.-born priest to be beatified who spent his entire priestly ministry in a parish. This is a great boost to the priesthood and to the Catholic Church in America.

The establishment of the Father McGivney guild was certainly a milestone marking the path to our founder's canonization. It operates out of the Supreme Council office in New Haven. The guild serves as a clearinghouse for information regarding Father McGivney, promotes devotion to his memory, develops and distributes materials about his life and virtue, receives reports of favors received through Father

McGivney's intercession, and receives news of possible miracles. Membership in the guild is open to anyone interested in Father McGivney and his cause, including members of the Knights of Columbus and their families. A guild newsletter is sent to members several times a year. All materials produced to promote information and devotion to Father McGivney are automatically distributed to members of the guild and, once a month, a mass is offered at St. Mary's Church in New Haven.

So, what can we do as a council in preparation of October 31st Beatification? As you know, Father McGivney will be beatified on Oct. 31, 2020, at Hartford's Cathedral of St. Joseph. Due to Connecticut's current COVID restrictions on indoor gatherings, very few from outside of Connecticut will be able to attend and although this situation is regrettable, the good news is that the Beatification Mass will be broadcast live on EWTN and other Catholic networks.

- Spread the news about the beatification to your council members, parishes and communities.
- Hold a special mass in honor of Father McGivney
- Conduct a special "Blessed Michael McGivney" membership drive for the Guild. Membership is free, the Guild members receive a quarterly newsletter and have their intentions remembers at a weekly Mass in New Haven! Go to: <u>https://www.fathermcgivney.org/en/join-the-guild.html</u> to join
- Promote the next two YouTube/Facebook screenings of the new Father McGivney video, on Sept. 26 and Oct. 25, both at 8 pm Eastern. Use the link above for more information.
- Pray the Prayer for the Canonization of Father McGivney. It is very important that all Knights pray this prayer and report any favors received to the Guild. We need one more miracle for our founder to reach canonization and sainthood, so you will play an even more important role in that process.

Prayer for the Canonization of Father McGivney

God, our Father, protector of the poor and defender of the widow and orphan, you called your priest, Father Michael J. McGivney, to be an apostle of Christian family life and to lead the young to the generous service of their neighbor. Through the example of his life and virtue may we follow your Son, Jesus Christ, more closely, fulfilling his commandment of charity and building up his Body which is the Church.

Let the inspiration of your servant prompt us to greater confidence in your love so that we may continue his work of caring for the needy and the outcast. We humbly ask that you glorify your venerable servant Father Michael J. McGivney on earth according to the design of your holy will. Through his intercession, grant the favor I now present (here make your request). Through Christ our Lord. Amen.



Per Capita Resolution Update from State Advocate Paul Lang



Brother Knights. We concluded a resolution for suspending our October Cycle Per Capita for the state of WI by the pre-established deadline of Sept 10. I sent the parameters and directions for the vote to each council' GK and FS unless, otherwise, vacant. Surrounding this vote, we required a majority of 2/3rds council responses in favor of suspending the per capita in order to suspend the October Cycle.



Subsequently, as we see by the number of votes returned in the graph above (79.87% of all councils), with 15 voting "No" and 227 Voting in favor of suspending the State Per Capita payment Cycle, and achieving our 2/3rds required majority vote, the State Officers moved to suspend the October Cycle Per Capita.

That stated, this suspension of the Oct Cycle is only for the per capita amount in this cycle. All Councils are still obligated to pay any Per Capita in arrears. COL and PKD assessments are voluntary and are not part of the Per Capita. However, if it is also your council's intention to continue those assessments for the worthy causes they represent, please consider making those current ASAP as well.

They added seven ONLINE members during the "Join For Free" promotion in July/August, then added four more during the "Half – Price" on Membership we enjoy today, then held a LIVE Exemplification on Sept 21st to welcome them all into their council. They have their membership for STAR! College kids know a bargain!

Unfortunately, this is the exception... Wisconsin is at only 10.17% of our goal when we should be at 23.6%. We're behind Minnesota and Nebraska right now, but <u>that doesn't need to be the case!</u>

There is a <u>"Half – Price" promotion</u> for members joining ONLINE (expires on October 31st) which commemorates the *Beatification of Fr Michael J. McGivney*. Let's also use the ONLINE Exemplifications that our state hosts to get those new members into their preferred Councils – those dates include **TUESDAYS** (October 6th, 13th, and 20th) as well as **FRIDAY**, October 30th, all at 7pm. Your current 1st & 2nd Degree members can advance online too.

Regional Trainer Jon Olson has recently taught some excellent seminars which describe how to use your own programs as opportunities to invite more men and grow your council. I taught four sessions on "Growing Membership Inside and OUTSIDE the Box" which were attended by some GK's, DD's, and RMC's but very few Council Membership Coordinators. Feedback from these seminars taught us that we need more OUTSIDE the box solutions to getting prospects and inviting them into our councils. We also need to **target Membership Coordinators and GKs to attend then <u>IMPLEMENT</u> what they have learned to GROW their Councils.**

Welcome to <u>E-MOB</u> = "Even More OUTSIDE the Box" ideas to prospect and grow membership. The program includes:

- Demonstrating the approaches we need to make with our **Pastors** to help us GROW (*"Father, how can we help you?" / "Father, who do you know that ought to be a Knight?" / "Will you help us put out a 'Father Wants YOU!' letter to prospects you know?"*)
- Asking our own members *"Who do you know that ought to be a Knight?"* at a LIVE meeting or ZOOM conference, warning them we will be asking the question so they can have a name list and contact information ready for us.
- Using our current programs to get our message of service out, explain our *"Leave No Neighbor Behind"* initiative and how *"we need good men to do good deeds"* with Faith in Action.
- Tapping into parish programs like RCIA, New Parishioner lists, Baptisms, First Communions, Confirmations, Parishioners, Parish Festivals, and men who help in the liturgy (ushers, lectors, sacristans, servers, etc.) to connect with and invite men to check us out and join our ranks.
- Model Open House/Information Meetings for LIVE or ONLINE presentation, so we can still connect and grow in a COVID environment.

Programs



Brothers,

By the end of this month, we'll be 1/3 of the way through our 2019-20 Fraternal Year. Are you at least 1/3 of the way to achieving your goals for this year – your membership goals; your program goals for Faith in Action, Leave No Neighbor Behind, State and your local parish, Council, community-based programs? Are you well along on the road to Star Council and Wisconsin Outstanding Council status? Do you have your 185, 365 Audit and Roundtable reports in and your Child Safety requirements completed?

If so, great. If not, why not? It's high time to get off square one and start moving again. We are Knights, men who lead – so let's lead! Get back to meeting again – in person, virtual or both; at your

parish of hall or somewhere else. Find parish, community and Council needs and do something about it – as much as you possibly can given the considerations necessary with the COVID crisis.

As of this writing, we have over 1/3 (129) of our 315 Councils who don't have their Form 365 in! 93 have one, 2 or more of their last Audits that are missing, not counting suspended Councils. 56 are missing their Form 185. In fact, last year, only about 75 of our 315 Councils ever turned in a SP7 (Columbian Award) form, even though the requirements were dramatically reduced.

The Wisconsin Knights of Columbus have again partnered with Special Olympics Wisconsin to help cover the costs of sending the Team Wisconsin athletes to the 2022 USA games. The games will be held in Orlando, Florida from June 5th to June 12th, 2022.

We have been a proud partner with SOWI Team Wisconsin since 2006 and have supported the athletes since. Our goal is to raise \$125,000.00 for travel expenses. This goal can be met very easily. If we consider our states membership, it amounts to less then \$3.50 per member over a 4 year period. That is .85 a member per year. Let's make this happen.

"LEAVE NO NEIGHBOR BEHIND" SACRED HEART COUNCIL 4628 ROTHSCHILD/SCHOFIELD/WESTON, WISCONSIN



Council 4628 Past Grand Knight Ed Flanders is a regular volunteer at the food pantry sponsored by his parish, St. Agnes in Weston. He had made several attempts to buy disinfectant wipes to distribute to food pantry clients but, because stores in the area have been limiting the amount that customers could buy, was prevented from stocking the food pantry.

Ed did a little investigating by checking the label of a canister of wipes that he had at home and discovered that they were distributed by Rockline Industries of Sheboygan, WI. He wrote the company, explaining that he was with the St. Agnes food pantry, and asked for

forty to distribute to their clients. The company called Debra Cherek-Seim, parish office manager, and said they would donate the items, but someone would have to pick them up - a 300 mile round trip. Ed asked Debra how many the company would donate – not really worth the trip if they only gave 40 canisters to the food pantry. Debra said that the company would fill up a car, pick-up truck or even a panel truck if you brought one.

Ed called another Past Grand Knight from Council 4628, Greg Cemke, who has a pick-up truck, and asked him if he was interested in making a run to Sheboygan to pick-up a load of disinfectant wipes for the local food pantries and churches. Greg agreed and at 7 A.M. on Wednesday, September 2nd they left for Sheboygan. They got to the Rockline warehouse by 9:30 A.M. and were loaded and on their way back by 10 A.M. After a stop for lunch and gas, they arrived back at St. Agnes parish by 1:30 P.M. and unloaded the 796 canisters of disinfectant wipes that were donated by Rockline Industries.

796 canisters of wipes are far more than the food pantry and St. Agnes parish could use. Disinfectant wipes were then distributed to the three other parishes that Council 4628 serves - St. Therese in Schofield, St. Mark in Rothschild and St. Florian in Hatley - for parish use and for distribution to the needy. Canisters of disinfectant wipes were also given to the Women's Community Shelter in Wausau, St. Anthony Spirituality Center in Marathon and Mt. Olive Lutheran Church in Weston.

Sacred Heart Council 4628 would like to thank Rockline Industries and its staff for their generous donation and cooperation in this effort, especially Betty Warrens and Aaron Marver. Also, the council is very appreciative of brothers Ed and Greg for their efforts in the "Leave No Neighbor Behind" campaign, and covered the cost of their trip.
