"Time flies!" February is the 8th month of our Fraternal Year; February 14 is Ash Wednesday; the State Convention is less than three months away; everything is coming up so quickly. At our State Convention, we will be considering Resolutions, passing a State Council Budget, Electing State Council Officers, Electing Delegates to the Supreme Convention, and sharing best practices on Programs, Fraternal Benefits, Evangelization and Faith Formation (Cor), and Membership.

As I look back on the last five and a half years as a State Officer, it is amazing to see how fast the time has gone, how many changes the State Council has seen, and how much work remains to be done. Just 4 years ago, we were all experiencing the Covid restrictions in our schools, churches, workplaces, and communities. We experienced a Lent where we were not able to attend mass in person. For me, that brought a real understanding of how central the Eucharist was to my life. Not being able to attend mass and receive the Eucharist was painful and left me feeling empty. While I worked from home, I was always able to go to the office when I needed to, I could go to the store for groceries, but not able to attend mass. This was just one of many attacks on our religious freedom. Many did not come back to church following Covid. We need to continue to pray for them. If you

know someone that has not yet returned to mass, Lent would be a great time to invite them to attend mass with you.

I have experienced several frustrations when working to help Councils. I would like to touch on just a couple of these this month that are particularly timely. The first of these frustrations is the councils that do not want to plan membership recruitment activities. The first part of any plan is to set goals and then put steps in place to accomplish those goals. If you go into a membership drive with the intent of going through the motions and hope you get lucky, you may get a few names or perhaps a new member. However, if you start with a goal to recruit five members and then put a plan into place to make that happen, you will be more likely to succeed. Having a goal and a plan can make all the difference.

A second frustration is the difficulty that we find with recruiting leaders at the state, diocesan, district, and council levels. Hopefully, we all joined the Knights of Columbus to make a difference. Why then are brothers so reluctant to step up and take on a leadership role? Perhaps a better question is: Why do so many brothers decline these leadership positions before they take the time to pray about it and discern the opportunity? We are all called by our Baptism to serve each other. Each of us has unique talents, and each in being called in different ways. Are we taking the

time to pray on it and determine how we are being called, and to answer that call?

As we enter
Lent, I pray that Wisconsin
Councils will embrace Cor and the
need for evangelization. Our
Bishops are counting on our
councils to make this happen. I pray
that our Brother Knights will invite
others to attend mass with them and
to join in putting Faith Into Action.
It is time to stop complaining about
people that have strayed, and take
action by inviting them to join you
at mass.

None of us is guaranteed another day on this earth. *Tempus Fugit. Momento Mori*. Our time to make a difference is Now! We cannot make a difference by waiting for someone else to step up. Each of us needs to step up and make a difference. This Lent, I urge each of you to take time to pray, put faith first in your life,

Put your Faith in Action through acts of charity, invite others to join you in service, listen to the calling to serve others, and step up to a leadership role in the Knights of Columbus. Make this Lent a time of true inner conversion of heart as we seek to follow Christ's will more faithfully.

DEAR BROTHER KNIGHTS:

Suffering has power. As the Church marks the beginning of Lent, we as Knights of Columbus can empathize with the Catholic Church in her sufferings. Knights of old were heroic in their deeds and sacrifices. As we take inspiration from the deeds of old, it can be easy to forget about the sufferings that the worthy men of the past accepted.

There is no Christian life without the willing acceptance of suffering. Every Catholic is taught about suffering. But how do we learn it? It's common to find even faithful Catholics avoiding suffering. We live as though these sufferings are signs of God's punishment.

On the contrary, the fact that you and I still suffer is a sign of hope for our salvation. Going through life seemingly untouched by troubles is a far greater sign of impending punishment. Woe to the man who lives a life of human comfort only to

drop down into hell in the blink of an eye.

As I wrote this article, I felt a need to reflect on the following question: "What are the keys to success when leading volunteers?" I happened upon a LinkedIn article that discussed the 10 Tips to Leading Volunteers that I thought is helpful for leaders in our organization—whether it be on a State level or a local Council level!

- ► Build a Relationship
- ► Listen for What Matters to
- ► Connect Them to the Mission
- ► Clearly Define Roles & **Expectations**
- ► Enroll and Get True Commitment
- ► Create a Shared Vision
- ► Delegate and Empower
- ► Maintain Contact & Provide Support
- ► Adjust & Redesign
- ► Appreciate & Reward

In assessing these 10 keys—it seems that many of these relate directly to all of our roles within the Knights.

We have a 'clear' mission—of helping those in need. We are here to serve as the 'Strong Right Arm' of the Church—and our Bishops, Priests and Deacons all need our support in building a stronger Catholic community and church. That is our

As Past Supreme Knight Carl Anderson spoke about often—it is our mission to offer membership in the Knights to every eligible Catholic male! We cannot do this if we **do not invite.** So, this is a great opportunity for us to take advantage of the coming months in this fraternal year and invite eligible men to join the Order, such as the Lenten fish fries! **This is the expectation** of us all, to offer membership to others.

As a leader of your council, I would define this as the role of every Knight and an expectation that we offer the same opportunity that was cast upon

Attracting new members sometimes requires us to build a relationship, a connection, to what we do as Knights. Much like our leaders, we need to build a relationship to our members as they are the ones that we count on to continue to do the great works we do, to continue to grow our charitable and volunteer impact each year.

It's important to understand what is important to our members. Our volunteer assessments can help guide new members to areas where they are passionate about and may want to be involved with yearly, maybe even as a **leader!** This is how we can encourage our members to step forward into leadership opportunities that could lead to the development new, unique programs for the future. Hopefully, you have witnessed us listening to your needs with our communications concerning incentives and that you feel that we making sure the are attainable for every council. This is **our** way of showing our appreciation for the efforts your council takes to help our State Council succeed.

All of our councils play an important role in our State's success. For the past two years, we have achieved the Circle of Honor recognition from Supreme. Yet, this is not a reflection of the State Deputy or State Membership Director's efforts. Rather, it is the efforts of all of our Councils helping us achieve this recognition!

To date, roughly half of our councils have yet to bring in a new member, but we have five months of time to get active and help our State once again achieve a third consecutive year of as a recognition as an outstanding State Council.

That said, it's only a result of our councils, and I welcome any suggestions that you have to help us cultivate future leaders and motivate our councils to succeed! Your success is important because our State cannot succeed without you! We are here to serve you! This is why I typically end my communications with a simple "Thank You" for all that you do to help our State succeed! Vivat Jesus!

I want to share a journey I went on this month in January. As I was making a weekly trip to True Value, doing minor maintenance at the office on the front door closer, I spotted an elderly gentleman in his eighties whose truck was broken down on a street corner. His hood was up and he was speaking into his phone. His flashers were not on and he was getting honked at, so I could see he was very stressed out by the situation. I went to see if he needed any assistance and offered him two options: (1) I could push him around the corner so he would not be at the stop light or (2) I could hook a chain up to my truck and pull him into the parking lot of a nearby Walgreen's. He replied that Triple A was going to help, and I let him know that he would be honked to death by then. He eventually accepted my offer. While we were hooking up the chain admid the throes of angry and inpatient honkers, another person offered us a tow rope to aid in our task. As I was unhooking the chain in the Walgreens parking, he said, "Let me introduce myself: My name is Tim."

I told him that would be easy to remember as I shared the same name. I began to share stories with him about growing up on a farm and had to start almost half of the equipment by a pull-start. The man thanked me again, and I offered to take him home. He declinded, but that prompted me to remind him that his heater was broken and that AAA would not be there for at least another two hours. So, he agreed to let me take him to his fishing hole to where he was meeting up with Walter, and Walter would help him from there.

When we arrived at the location, which was a Mobile gas station, Tim turned to me and asked, "What do I owe you," and I said, "Nothing! I am blessed to help you." Tim replied, "Nobody does that anymore, Tim" to which I responded, "Sir, that is a false narrative. I am glad to help and hope you have good luck with your truck. Just a word of advice, though, if it were me, I would just replace the battery. They go bad, especially, when it is below zero."

My reason for sharing this story is that, today false narratives abound. As Catholics we help people every day. As Knights of Mary and Missionaries of Fr. McGivney we change narratives every single day. Not so we can brag or look good, but so people can see Jesus's love and mercy. Our narrative? Become a knight and provide the charity others don't think



exist anymore. We can change the narrative. If perhaps you needed a new year's resolution, I have one for you. Be the change in the narrative in peoples' lives.

Your State Officer Team recently approved this great new incentive for the 3rd quarter of the fraternal year. This membership incentive runs from January 1st-March 31st.

- ► If a Council achieves their needed membership goal (50% of Supreme Quota) between February 1st and February 29th--then they will receive 20% off of their April 1st State Per Capita payment.
- ▶ If a Council achieves their needed membership goal between March 1st and March 31st--then they will receive 10% off of their April 1st State Per Capita payment.
- ► IF A COUNCIL ACHIEVES THEIR GOAL MULTIPLE TIMES (FOR EXAMPLE IF YOUR GOAL IS 3 AND YOU BRING IN 3 NEW MEMBERS IN JANUARY AND 3 NEW MEMBERS IN FEBRUARY--THEN YOU WILL ACHIEVE BOTH THE JANUARY REDUCTION OF 30% AND THE FEBRUARY **REDUCTION OF 20%).**

We are excited to offer this as it is achievable for every council to reach their stated goal below and also is based off the 'size' of your council membership. State Incentive is in addition to the Supreme Incentive for 6 new members to get a pop-up banner.



STOP CALLING IT A "TOOTSIE ROLL DRIVE"

The upcoming months mark the time for the annual campaign organized by our councils to support people with intellectual disabilities. The campaign is aimed at raising awareness and funds for individuals with intellectual disabilities to ensure they have access to the resources they need. The council members will be working hard to spread the word and encourage people to donate to the cause. It's an excellent opportunity to show our support for the community and help create a more inclusive and caring society.

Fundraising for individuals with intellectual disabilities

The Knights of Columbus members contribute significantly to helping individuals with intellectual disabilities. When sharing information about these efforts, it is essential to follow specific guidelines. Council bulletins, committee reports, posters and flyers, press releases, and everyday language should be precise and thoughtful while referring to individuals with disabilities.

The following are some DOs and DON'Ts of language:

- Please keep in mind the following guidelines while communicating about people with intellectual disabilities:
- ► Avoid using derogatory terms such as "the retarded."
- ➤ Do not label the person by their disability, such as "the wheelchair-bound."

- ► Use person-first language, such as "people with intellectual disabilities."
- ► Treat adults with intellectual disabilities as adults and refer to them accordingly. Avoid using child-like names or references.
- ► Avoid negative connotations such as "victim of," "afflicted with," "suffering from," or "unfortunate" while referring to individuals with intellectual disabilities.
- ► Use appropriate language that does not imply disease or sickness. Intellectual disabilities are not contagious, and individuals with such disabilities are not "sick."

 I hope this helps!

Campaign for People With Intellectual Disabilities

State and local councils conduct a popular and successful fundraiser for people with intellectual disabilities by collecting donations outside stores and on street corners. Donors receive a piece of candy, usually a Tootsie Roll, as a token of appreciation. However, the nickname "Tootsie Roll Drive" is misleading because the Knights of Columbus, who organize the campaign, do not have any official ties to Tootsie Rolls or their manufacturer. Many councils offer other items as tokens of appreciation during the same fundraising drive. Therefore, when referring to this project, it is essential to focus on the good that the donations do for

people with intellectual disabilities and not advertise a candy bar. As a result, the project must be promoted as the "Campaign for People With Intellectual Disabilities," not the "Tootsie Roll Drive."

Father Chinonso Okoroichi, who is the parochial vicar of Holy Angels Parish, along with other members of the Holy Angels Council in Colma, California, recently organized an annual fund drive for people with disabilities. During the drive, parishioners were encouraged to donate as they exited Mass. In total, the council was able to raise \$1,200, which was donated to the San Francisco Pomeroy Recreation and Rehabilitation Center.

FUND DRIVE FOR PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES

The members of Father Timothy P. Molony Council 2681 in Scottsbluff, Nebraska and their families collected more than \$3,500 during their yearly fund drive for people with disabilities. This year's collection brings the total amount raised over the past four years to about \$45,000. The funds are donated to Buckboard Therapeutic Riding Academy and Camp Scott, which is a summer program for children and young adults with disabilities.

to concentrate on the Summer and Fall months and turn in the donations in November.

For the Father McGivney Military Chaplain Scholarship Program, the Fourth degree will hold fundraisers and other events during the Winter and Spring months to make the annual donations in April which is the birth month of Father Emil Kapaun. Congratulations to the 145 (48%) councils that

occurred. These councils have done programs but are either unable or unwilling to submit form #10784. The other option is that these councils have not done any programs and need help.

I have heard it said that there is a perception out there that nothing is done with the data so there is no need to submit 10784. Let me dispel this myth. The State program Director of each state receives a monthly report from Supreme of all the submitted 10784 forms for the month. I have developed a report that enables State Leaders and District Deputies to quickly access each council's progress. They can

determine which councils are on track to earn the



Columbian award. The challenge is

that there are councils that are program active but not reporting their programs. Their lack of reporting makes it difficult for State and Diocese leadership to determine the councils that need help. Their apathy is a disservice to their brother councils.

I have also heard questions like why doesn't the state do more to help councils? If you or someone in your council has asked this question regarding programs, I ask you a follow up question. Has your council submitted 10784's for all the programs you have completed? The program

team is willing and able to help councils in need. However, we can't identify them when healthy councils fail to complete the required paperwork. Your Faith in Action programs help your church and community. Reporting each completed program via Form #10784 enables State and Diocese leadership teams to identify and help councils in need.

As Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly said during the 2023 Supreme Convention the goal of our order is to be "First in Faith and Charity." One of the most important ways we do this is through our Faith in Action programs.

Remember in order to become a STAR Council, one of the requirements is you need to have all four positions complete the safe environment training and background checks where needed.

SAFE ENVIRONMENT - THE PROCESS WAS CHANGED END OF LAST SUMMER

It is important that you continue to review your council's status regarding who has completed the Safe Environment training.

Who needs to complete the training? Grand Knight, **Program Director, Family Director and Community Director.** The Family Director and Community **Director** will also complete the **background check**. This is a second email from Praesidium Academy.

The following is the instructions to reach out to Supreme and Praesidium: The training is all handled by Supreme via Praesidium. There is **no** link to send and the old website is not operating. The forms **185** and **365** are what drives the links to be emailed to the **GK**, **PD**, **FD**, and CD.

Praesidium sends the email directly to each one of these members to complete the training. Email addresses come from forms 185 and 365.


The only ones who get a follow up email are the **FD** and the **CD**. They receive an additional email to complete the background check.

- ► First, you must make sure your forms 185 & 365 are in and up to date, if updating make sure to change to the current date on the form.
- ► Check the forms to make sure correct information and emails are on it.
- ► If good, then check your emails and spam folders, if no email from Praesidium then you must contact Supreme at requesting a new email. They will then resend an email for you to complete the training. If first time users on the Praesidium, then they will have to create a log in.
- ► You should receive the follow up from Supreme and then another email will be sent from Praesidium to complete the training. You have 30 days from the date of the email to complete the training.

MAKE SURE THEY KEEP A COPY OF THE **COMPLETION OF THE TRAINING CERTIFICATE**

Right now, the website for Safe Environment is not open for those who are not required to take the training (GK, PD, FD, AND CD are required to take it). Supreme is working on this so we can get more members certified in Safe Environment.



- ► The **CANDIDATE** tab is what you use when you recruit a member locally or are handling a member transfer request or a reinstatement of a prior member.


Even though the Procession is five months away, we still need to plan


Many Councils are presently working on their indoor Helping Hands projects at their parishes, parishioners' and members' homes, community sites, etc. Others are concentrating on bowl-a-thons, Cornhole (Bags) tournaments, raffles, pancake breakfasts and spaghetti dinners, upcoming fish frys, benefit concerts and shows, etc. as fundraisers for Global Wheelchairs projects, Habitat for Humanity project donations or Coats for Kids funding for spring jackets or next fall/winter drives. It's also a great time to be organizing your work brigade for a Habitat project in your area.

As for Youth programs, I was very disappointed in the response this year to the Catholic Citizenship Essay Contest. The State winners will be announced this month, but only 5 Councils in the entire state submitted entries, nearly all from 8th grade only – a very poor showing. We'll have to review the program this spring/summer, but we certainly can do a better job there.

On the other hand, the Free Throw (and Knowledge) Contest continues to have good participation, though there's always room to do better. Remember that Council contests should be finishing up this month, as well as Free Throw District Contests where needed. Green travel cards should be issued to Council and/or District winners for their Diocesan Contests. Your Diocesan Program Coordinators will be setting up and advising you of the details for those contests to be held in March. The State Finals will be on Saturday, April 13 at Assumption High School in Wisconsin Rapids. As usual, it will be registration and practice 10:00-11:00 AM, competition begins 11:15 AM for the Free Throw Contest. (DDs, DPCs – remember to tell Diocesan winners that they need to bring their own practice balls to the State Contest.) Math and Spelling registration is 10:15-11:15 AM with competition set to begin at 11:30 AM. (NOTE: The 2023-24 Council Knowledge Contest tests are now available on the State website. If you have problems with it, let me know. The Diocesan Tests I will send directly to the DPCs.)

Another Youth program that Councils in the State have done little with is the Soccer Challenge. Though easier to run than PPK, very few Councils have chosen to operate this program so that we haven't been

able to do Diocesan or State programs in Wisconsin essentially since 2019. The local contests can even be run



The companion (newer) Hockey Skills Contest is operated much the same way as the Soccer Challenge. All the information needed can be obtained from the Supreme website and Supplies Online. If you decide to do this one, please let me know when and how it turned out.

The Culture of Life Essay Contest is still ongoing. Entries are due to Councils by March 15. Winners are due to DPCs by March 31.

Finally, let me urge all Councils to get their 2023 History Books in by February 15 to your DDs and your Service Program Award entries (your best Faith, Family, Community and Life programs) into State Program Director Ernie Reinhart or State Office by March 1.
