AS WE END the Fraternal Year, I want to thank WSW Michael Tennies, WSA Don Schoenherr, and WST Roland Breunig for all of their contributions over the past year.

- Worthy State Treasurer Roland Breunig did an outstanding job cleaning up years of financial records for us, as well as ensuring that our State Budget going forward is based on solid facts rather than gut feel. Roland you will be missed by all of us on the team.
- Worthy State Advocate Don Schoenherr was responsible for following up with Councils on Safe Environment Compliance and got us to 42% Compliance in the past Fraternal Year.
- Worthy State Warden Michael Tennies worked to build Team Milwaukee, including a full team of District Deputies as well as District Wardens in almost every District.
- I also want to congratulate WSW Ernie Reinhart, WSA Dr Jim Froh, and WST Ross Larson for stepping up to take on these positions in the new Fraternal Year.

As we begin a new Fraternal Year, I am proud to share with you the impact that the Knights of Columbus have had in our communities over the past Fraternal:

- Charitable Impact In Calendar 2022 Knights of Columbus in Wisconsin donated over 4.9 million dollars and 765 thousand hours.
- Aid and Support After Pregnancy ASAP Program – Wisconsin is number 3 in the order with over 353 thousand dollars donated in the past Fraternal Year, with an additional 3 thousand dollars donated at the State Convention, and 37 thousand dollars donated by Supreme.
- YouCat Bible Sacramental Gift Program Just short of 1400 bibles purchased the first year of the program.
- 1000 new members recruited in Wisconsin the past Fraternal Year.
- We added new Councils in Elk Mound and Milwaukee.

The impact that we have when we work together towards a goal is truly amazing. Thank you to all of our Councils and Leaders for making this happen.

This past weekend we held our Summer Meeting with the District Deputies in the State. We were blessed to have RGD James Caffrey from Colorado and Fraternal Trainer Jon Olson join us for a weekend

of presentations and discussions on a wide range of

topics. We discussed the importance of moving our Councils and their Leadership from Maintenance mode into Apostolic Mission. As part of this change, we will be rolling out the Cor initiative in Wisconsin this Fraternal Year under the leadership of our State Director of Evangelization



and Faith Formation (EFF) Andy Orgovan and State Chaplain Fr Brian Dulli. Information on the rollout of the Cor initiative will be shared at District Meetings. We also reviewed the resources available on Officers Online, as well as resources that are available to Councils to help them succeed. District Deputies left the meeting Motivated and with the Tools and Resources needed to help all their Councils to Succeed.

As you know, planning is a key to success. Our plan this year is simple.

- Bring in at least 2 Members per District per Month
- Hold at least 1 Exemplification of Charity, Unity, and Fraternity in each District each Month
- Roll out the Cor initiative in Wisconsin
- At Least 1 Star Council in each District
- Continue to Grow our Charitable Impact in both dollars and hours
- Focus on Programs that truly make an impact on our Families, Parishes, and Communities.

The State Council has a plan, and we shared that plan with the District Deputies to be shared again with Councils at the District Meetings. I am asking that all Councils also develop a plan for the Fraternal Year that includes Programs, Fraternal Benefits, and Membership Growth. Councils will be asked to share their plans at their District Meetings.

I expect that the new Fraternal Year will bring plenty of challenges, but also many opportunities to grow our Councils and our Council Leadership. I am looking forward to working with our team of State Officers, State Directors and Coordinators, Diocesan Directors and Coordinators, and District Deputies on our Apostolic Mission as we implement the Vision and Mission that Fr McGivney left when he founded the Knights of Columbus 141 years ago.

As WE END this Fraternal Year, Wisconsin has been in a bit of a 'slow down.' As compared to May and June 2022 wherein we kicked it into gear in the last quarter of the year we had our slowest quarter in Membership Growth of the Fraternal Year - which isn't a good sign as we enter into the upcoming year. While I have some rational as to why this occurred, it isn't a good trend as we enter into the upcoming year with a much higher goal to achieve for Memberhip Growth.

I like looking at 'trends' to try and identify our problem areas and way's to 'help' which is what the leaders of the State Council are to do - HELP councils and be a leader in trying times.

Everyone can identify problems - but leaders help find solutions and help act-not sit back.

<u>2022:</u> 103 inactive councils (not bringing in a new member)/<u>2023:</u> 98 inactive. councils.

2022: 65 councils hit 100% of their Membership Growth Goals/2023: 58 councils hit 100% of Membership 2022: 988 new members brought into our State / 2023: 1001 new members brought into the State.

2022: 17 Districts were at 100% of their Membership Goal/**2023:** 12 Districts were at 100% of their Membership Goal.

2022: 1 New Council Established/2023: 2 New Councils Established.
2022: Every District Active/2023: 1
District Inactive (DID NOT RECUIT A NEW MEMBER ALL YEAR)

On January 6th, we had brought in 509 new members and were ranked 28th in the Order our of 75 Jurisdictions. Last year we ended the year ranked 29th in the Order - so, we were on pace to exceed last year in both intake and rank order wide.

While we exceeded last year's intake as reference above, we finished the year 41st out of 75 Jurisdictions. On May

22nd, we had 914 new members and were ranked 34th in the order. In little less then a month and a half we got surpassed by 7 Jurisdictions as our foot was let off the gas and had only brought in 87 new members over the last 6 week period of time. In our State over the past 2 years - we had had **51** Councils that have not recuited a 'NEW' Member into the Order.

Green Bay: 10 Councils
La Crosse: 13 Councils
Madison: 8 Councils
Milwaukee: 9 Councils
Superior: 11 Councils

Total: 51

Now as an attorney with an opening argument might say - 'these are the 'FACTS', they can not be disputed. Why I present these facts to you is that it seems this past year for every step forward we may have taken, we have taken 1 step back. If as a team, if everyone isn't 'rowing' in the same direction, then simply put we will not make up any ground - we will be moving in place. So what does this mean for this coming year?

We have tasked each Council with identifying every Exemplification, Program Event and Membership Recruitment opportunity (Church Drive) for your upcoming year. By giving the State this information we will compile a 'CALENDAR' of activities in every Diocese and will have 'SUPPORT' assist with these various functions.

We don't have a litany of 'LEADERS' that are able to help councils on a whim - so we need to properly plan our calendars to support you best. This is our ASK of you. Your ASK to 'us', those individuals who are LEADERS in this volunteer organization, is to hold us accountable for being there to assist. ACCOUNTABILITY goes both ways. As we try to hold Councls accountable of doing their activities and reaching their

goals, you too MUST hold those individuals who stepped forward to lead accountable to help you along the way.

TOGETHER we succed. DIVIDED we fail.

We need to make CHANGES to improve the PROCESS we have for brining in new members into the order - and this calendar and 'ACCCOUNTABILITY' to helping us is one solution that we have for doing so.

Further, there will be a few other 'solutions' that you will see in the first half of this Fraternal Year that is a 'change' from what we have done prior in both pre-planning and post-event execution to try and improve this process so that at mid-point this next year we can evaluate what worked, what needs to be modified, and what maybe needs to be scrapped as it wasn't effective.

For us to succeed in reaching our goals this year it will take EVERY COUNCIL ACTIVE, it will take EVERY DISTRICT ACTIVE, it will take those who stepped forward to LEAD to do so and together we will succeed. I want to thank everyone of you who have stepped forward to lead either this year or continue to lead as you have in the past. As referenced in all of my e-mails, THANK YOU for your service to the Knights—and let us know how WE can be of service to you!Each Fraternal Year is a 'NEW' chapter, a new beginning for all of us. Let's make this Chapter another successful one—better than the last in all areas of which we can improve!

The Time to Plan is Now

BROTHERS, BELIEVE IT Or not it's time to prepare for next year. Councils should begin the Program Planning Process. Additionally, they need to think about how to keep the program team motivated. Lastly, they need to prioritize reporting of completed programs. Below are excerpts from our Faith in Action guide. Please know that that the State Program team is available to answer question and assist with program opportunities.

Future program newsletters will primarily celebrate successful programs. We will share innovative programs that support Fr. McGivney's vision. Innovative does not necessarily mean brand new programs. Innovative can mean traditional programs with a new twist. The goal is to increase participation of families, new brother knights, inactive knights, parishes, and communities.

PROGRAM PLANNING

Parish Pastor/Council Chaplain: It is vitally important to discuss your tentative program plans with your pastor and his staff. Developing and aligning your goals with the pastor is an important and fundamental aspect of parish and community relations.

Officer's Planning Meeting: Council officers, the membership director, all program directors, committee chairmen, and your council chaplain, if available, should attend your planning meetings. Use these meetings to set the program calendar, establish recruiting goals, update the budget, and prepare motions for the upcoming council meetings. Use the Fraternal Planner to keep ahead of all required reports and program deadlines.

PLANNING MEETING: Review the programs that were conducted in the past year and examine the reasons for success or failure of each project. Copies of the Fraternal Programs Report Forms (#10784) submitted by council members

in the past, and collected by the grand knight, will be helpful for your review. Develop a summary of each program and be prepared to discuss the analysis during the program portion of the Officers' Planning Meeting.

Program Portion of the Officer's Planning Meeting: During the programming portion of the Officers' Planning Meeting, your council officers should:

- Review the programs that were conducted in the past year
- Analyze each project
- Review and approve press releases for council activities
- Decide which programs should be repeated in the current fraternal year and which new programs should be included
- Assign directors and chairmen responsible for each program
- Assign tentative dates for each program and when each program will conclude. Establish a meeting schedule for the program committee
- Consider the parish calendar and review your plans with the pastor and his staff
- Set a budget for each program
- Prepare a list of proposed programs to present to your council for approval
- Direct the public relations chair to communicate upcoming programs to the parish and community in a timely fashion. Use the sample announcements available for many of the programs

After the Officer's Planning Meeting: If the pastor or chaplain was not in attendance, the grand knight should arrange to brief the pastor shortly thereafter and obtain approval for the planned programs. Arrangements should also be made for the required facilities.

KEEPING PROGRAM PERSONNEL MOTIVATED

The program director and committee chair are responsible for keeping volunteers motivated. Recognition for a job well done can go a long way to keeping morale high. Here are some suggestions:

- Publish the council's works in the parish and community media forums. Refer to the Public Relations and Publicity Guide (#2235) for assistance.
- Be sure that each Knight gets full credit and recognition for his work. An occasional personal note may mean a great deal to the recipient.
- Consider presenting a Certificate of Appreciation (#1462) to the directors, chairmen and other individuals who were instrumental in the success, of the program.
- Listen to the suggestions of your council members and acknowledge good advice. Tell your rother Knights that you appreciate their interest and will consider their ideas.
- Be prepared to listen when a member has a question or problem.
- Accept responsibility for your mistakes. This shows your team that you are human and fallible

SUBMIT FRATERNAL PROGRAMS REPORTS

It is a best practice to keep good records of all programmatic activity. Do this by submitting the Fraternal Program Report Form (#10784). This form can only be submitted online.

The Department of Fraternal Operations collates all of the data received and provides monthly and quarterly reports to the state program teams. This is a great mechanism for councils to help track their progress toward achieving the Columbian Award (#SP-7).






