I thank the State Officers, DDs, Program Directors, Grand Knights and all Council Officers, State Trainer Bob, the Ceremonial Teams, the Charitable Foundation Members, General Agent Mark and all the Agents, all the Knights, Chapter Members, State Executive Secretary Gerry Gieni and especially all the Bishops, Council Chaplains and Priests in Saskatchewan for your support. My apologies if I missed anyone.

I also thank all of you for making Pat and me feel welcome at all the events to which you have invited us. We have seen many great projects which were conducted in many parts of Saskatchewan in the last 6 months. Many councils have implemented the new Faith in Action Program Model in their Parish. Programs are a key link in the order to drive retention and recruitment. # December 2018 Reflection ACCOMPANY

The Family as Domestic Church and as Missionary Disciples

Dear Brother Knights and Families, "Lets go for a walk."

How often have you said that to someone? For some of us, it might be a frequent activity. It is such a simple invitation to go for a walk, and the equally simple gesture of walking together, can say so much. You might have a destination in mind. You might even have a goal such as getting fresh air, getting your circulation up or even burning a few calories. You might want to "throw something out at someone" and test an idea you have. Whatever the context, quite often we just go for a walk with someone to confirm or deepen a relationship.

Jesus loved, I mean Luuuuuved, to walk with others. I wonder how often that happened with Him and His disciples? I can't imagine what was shared! Walking with Jesus must have really formed the thinking and outlook on the world for the apostles.

Jesus wants to walk with you. He was born as a human baby in a manger as help-less as can be. He grew up, suffered for us, died for us, resurrected for us and is present to us day after day in such a simple manner when He walks with us. Perhaps it is with a friend or family member. Perhaps it is alone. Yet after all of Christian history, Jesus wants to walk with you and listen to what is filling your head and your heart, distracting you or exciting for you. He wants to help you understand your daily circumstances and explain things for you.

I have honored people at times by inviting them for a walk and once we are on our way, I tell them that I wanted to go for a walk with Jesus. They usually give me a weird look, (which I am definitely ready for) and they soon get that I am serious. They are somewhat flattered ...... and it probably affects the atmosphere of our walk. That is the point after all.

So, this Christmas............ dwell for a moment on the fact that Jesus loved you so much, so very, very much, that He became human. 1) Leave your home/house and go for a walk with Jesus, that is, your spouse, your friend, your sibling, your relative or even someone with whom you normally would not walk. See where the conversation goes, perceiving them as Jesus the whole time you talk about whatever it is you discuss. Let the experience help you appreciated the significance of presence, the significance of Jesus wanting to be present with you. As He did with His disciples, He wants to walk with you this Christmas.

2) Then I invite you to pray the following prayer together with the person or the people with whom you are walking (composed by Archbishop William E. Lori of Baltimore, Supreme Chaplain).

O Lord Jesus, you lived in the home of Mary and Joseph in Nazareth. There you grew in age, wisdom and grace as you prepared to fulfill your mission as our Redeemer. We entrust our family to you.

O Blessed Mary, you are the Mother of our Savior. At Nazareth you cared for Jesus and nurtured him in the peace and joy of your home. We entrust our family to you.

O Saint Joseph, you provided a secure and loving home for Jesus and Mary, and gave us a model of fatherhood while showing us the dignity of work. We entrust our family to you.

Holy Family, we consecrate ourselves and our family to you. May we be completely united in a love that is lasting, faithful and open to the gift of new life. Help us to grow in virtue, to forgive one another from our hearts, and to live in peace all our days. Keep us strong in faith, persevering in prayer, diligent in our work, and generous toward those in need.

May our home, O Holy Family, truly become a domestic church where we reflect your example in our daily life. Amen. Jesus, Mary and Joseph, pray for us!

During your walk, discuss the prayer with them. Discuss what a family is and what it means. Discuss how everyone has a family and compare and contrast it with other families and with the Holy Family. Give thanks for the family that you have, including everything you like about it and everything you wish is was not. Do this during your walk so that upon your return, you can pause a 100 meters or so away from your home. Pray the prayer once more as you look objectively at your home. Let it sink in. Look at the home, the building where you live that is the domestic church. Dwell on those who live or visit there and think about their relationships. It is indeed a reflection to some degree of the Holy Family. Ask the Holy Spirit for grace and the right perspective as you are about to enter the home, encounter someone, start on a task, or just relax after you walk.

May you celebrate the nativity of the Lord, the Incarnation, Christmas, with a renewed appreciation of the Holy Family and how your family is a reflection of the Holy Family. You have a role to play in that family. How are you for others the person of Jesus, or Mary or Joseph?

"God is with us, understand this all you nations, and be humbled, for God is with us". Merry Christmas to you and your family. Keep Christ is Christmas!

Go for a walk with Pope Saint Paul VI

Humanae vitae (<u>Latin</u>: Of Human Life) is an <u>encyclical</u> written by <u>Pope Paul VI</u> and dated 25 July 1968. The text was issued at a Vatican press conference on 29 July. <sup>[1]</sup>Subtitled *On the Regulation of Birth*, it re-affirmed the orthodox teaching of the <u>Catholic Church</u> regarding <u>married love</u>, responsible parenthood, and the rejection of artificial <u>contraception</u>. In formulating his teaching he explained why he did not accept the conclusions of the <u>Pontifical Commission on Birth Control</u> established by his predecessor, <u>Pope John XXIII</u>, a commission he himself had expanded. <sup>[2]</sup>

Mainly because of its prohibition of artificial contraception (some licit therapeutic procedures with the sole intent to cure bodily diseases are excepted)<sup>[3]</sup>, the encyclical was politically controversial. It affirmed traditional Church moral teaching on the sanctity of life and the procreative and unitive nature of conjugal relations.

It was the last of Paul's seven encyclicals.[4]

For General Agent Neil Bouvier, good work is done through personal connections. The Ontario Knight sought an opportunity to get involved, and get his agents active, in serving the community.

Coats for Kids — which launched in 2009, and has since distributed 500,000 coats to children in 49 states and all 10 Canadian provinces — was his answer.

In Ontario, the average winter coat does not suffice. The Supreme Council Coats for Kids program makes available several types of coats, including heavy duty ones that are suitable for the Canadian winter.

Bouvier sought out school superintendents, to determine the needs of local children. He then began working with local field agents and council members in 2015, distributing 84 coats to students in four schools.

What started that day as a moderate service project has evolved into a province-wide movement.

"Without the councils' buy-in there's no way we'd be where we are today," he said. "It's taking on a life of its own."

Bouvier's agency is bringing their enthusiasm for the initiative to local areas as well, including the nearby town of Hamilton. He built a website for the Hamilton Coats for Kids effort, and joined fellow Ontario general agents in spreading the initiative across the whole province. Today, since Bouvier got involved with Coats for Kids, councils across Ontario have become more attuned to the needs of underprivileged communities and children. In 2016, Ontario Knights collected and distributed 2,676 coats. Last year they exceeded their goal of 3,000 with 5,256 collected and distributed.

This year, they're aiming to collect more than 7,000 coats.



# Online Membership

What is online membership?

Members can sign up online on the following website: <a href="www.kofc.org/joinus">www.kofc.org/joinus</a>
Online members become members of the Saskatchewan State Council and receive the following:

- information every two weeks to educate them about the Knights of Columbus
- an online membership card
- all the Insurance and other financial benefits
- Columbia magazine.

Online members can attend meetings as online member visitors in any council, but cannot vote or hold any council position.

Online membership is a first step to become part of a council. When online members are ready to take their ADMISSION DEGREE, the Admissions Committee would meet with them to determine where their interests lie and make the necessary arrangements for the online member to become part of the council.

Members online pay their dues to Supreme. Supreme is responsible to collect their yearly dues as long as they remain online members.

To date, Sask. had 18 members who signed up online and 4 have converted to a council. Four more have indicated that they would like to join a local council. Saskatchewan State Council communicates with the online members by sending them the Knightline and other information about the council activities in their particular area. Online members can participate and assist in local council projects. SUBJECT: A Game Changer for Prospecting for Members

Brothers,

I've just come back from the Mid-Year Meeting of State Deputies in Houston, Texas. We discussed a lot of great ideas and best practices that have the potential to make a big impact here in our jurisdiction.

One that I'm really excited about is a new prospecting system that we can use for all kinds of things: church drives, men's conferences, pancake breakfasts, spaghetti dinners, fish fries – really any event where we have potential members.

We'll talk more about it at the mid-year organizational meeting, but it's a really simple process. Supreme will build a <u>custom</u> Prospect Landing Page for your council that you can use on a **phone**, a tablet or a computer. You can ask potential members if they're interested in learning more about the Knights, and you can enter their information into the form in a matter of seconds. They'll immediately get a personalized email signed by you the grand knight, and encouraging them to join the Knights and reference your council by name and number.

The form will also auto-generate an email to you, which will give you all of the information given for each person that signs up, and it will enroll them in an email marketing campaign that will help tell them more about the Knights and what we do over time (Don't worry, they can unsubscribe at any time).

It's a great system! This can be a real game changer in the way we prospect. I would encourage every council to get out in front of this and request your own page immediately. The attached document explains it in more detail. All you need to do is go to <a href="info.kofc.org/pagerequest">info.kofc.org/pagerequest</a>.

If you have any questions, be sure to reach out to any of our State Board members. They will be happy to explain this new and exciting recruiting technique to you.



RULES	EXPLANATION
<ol> <li>Sweeping/brushing is allowed <u>only</u> from the hog line to the back of the house at the playing end.</li> </ol>	This provides fairness to those with physical limitations, unable to sweep/brush. It also increases the challenge, not having the extra advantage of sweeping/brushing to affect either line or weight in the initial travel of the stone.
Each team is comprised of <u>two</u> players.	This rule follows from rule 1 (above); with no sweeping/brushing between hog lines, a four-member team would often have two people inactive. This way, everyone is always occupied, either delivering or skipping. Teams are easier to form and coordinate.
<ol> <li>One member of each team stays at each end of the rink, and <u>must not</u> cross center ice.</li> </ol>	This reduces movement up and down the ice, and increases the pace of the game. It also means responsibilities are equally shared by the two team members, and provides variety for each player.
4. The two delivering players alternately deliver <u>6 stones</u> each per end, while their teammate skips that end. Then roles are reversed, and the partners deliver the stones back.	This implies that each player is always occupied, doing something interesting. 18 stones are delivered per person each game, compared to 16 (8 ends) or 20 (10 ends) in regular curling.
5. All games are <u>six</u> ends. In case of a tie, an extra end is played, with each player delivering 3 stones (skips and deliverers exchange roles at the midpoint of an extra end).	Three ends of delivery times 6 stones per end means each person delivers 18 stones per game, about the same as regular curling. Games progress quickly and interest remains high, both for the players and spectators. The incidence and degree of lop-sided games is greatly reduced, and hardly ever does a team surrender before the end of the game.
6. No stone may be removed from play prior to delivery of the fourth stone of each end. If that should happen, the delivered stone is removed from play and all other stones are returned to their original positions.	With fewer stones used, and fewer ends, the stick game tends to be more defensive than the regular game. This rule makes the game more offensive, thus more interesting for competitors and fans. In effect, this rule extends the free guard zone to include the area from the hogline to the backline, as the FGZ was originally proposed.
7. The delivery may begin with (a) either foot in either hack, or (b) from anywhere inside the near hog line with the stone touching the centre line. All stones must be released before reaching the hog line.	The Canadian Curling Association delivery rule (8.(1)) is overly restrictive regarding the stick delivery, and fails to address the two -handed delivery.
Other rules and etiquette of regular curling apply.	The good parts of the regular game are retained!
