Thank You to WSW Ernie Reinhart, WSA Dr Jim Froh, Diocesan Director Rick Raulin, Special Olympics Chair John Benisch and the Knights from Councils 746, 973, 1478, 2487, 3099, 3450, 4392, 4586, 10522, and 10893 for serving a Pancake Breakfast to over 700 Special Olympians, Parents and Coaches at the Wisconsin Special Olympics Fall Games in Wisconsin Dells on September 10. It is truly amazing to see what can happen when 10 Councils work in Unity on a project. A special Th ank you to Council 746 for taking the lead in procuring the food, and Council 4586 for bringing their Pancake wheel to the event.

IPSD Corey Coonen led the charge on Coats for Kids this year. Corey worked with Supreme to submit a proposal for a Supreme match to our purchase, coordinating with Councils to purchase just short of \$75K of Coats, with Supreme providing matching coats allowing Councils to double their buying power. All told, over 6800 coats will be distributed by Wisconsin Councils to kids in need this fall. Thank You IPSD Corey for all your efforts to organize this order. Again, it is truly amazing to see what we can accomplish when we work in Unity on a project.


District Deputies participated in DD Huddles in each Diocese in Sept. At these meetings, District Deputies shared success stories from the Councils in their Districts,

shared some challenges, and made plans to assist Councils as we work to grow Programs, Fraternal Benefits, and Membership in Wisconsin. A major topic at these meetings was the launch of the Cor initiative in Wisconsin over the next few months. District Deputies also picked up Charity Raffle Tickets and State Directories to deliver to their Councils when they meet with them. Please thank your District Deputy when you see them for giving up a Saturday to attend this meeting to be able to better support your Council.

The State Officers continue to make progress in filling open District Deputy and Diocesan Coordinator positions. Knights filling these roles have responsibility for mentoring Council Leadership as we continue to grow the Knights of Columbus in Wisconsin.

As I visit with Council Leaders. there seem to be a lot of questions and concerns about the Cor initiative. In particular, the question of Why are we doing this, and why now? The short answer, we are all called to evangelize, but many of us do not know how. It is through evangelization that we can help to get our friends and neighbors back

evangelize. Below are a few quotes that should help to shed some light on the need for this initiative.


"Faith Leads to Charity, and the witness of Charity leads to Faith." (Supreme Chaplain Archbishop Lori)

#### **DEAR BROTHER KNIGHTS,**

October is the month dedicated to the Most Holy Rosary. Our Lady of the Rosary is celebrated as a feast on Saturday, October 7. That happens to also be First Saturday. We can consider two beautiful devotions to Mary, Our Mother: the Rosary and the Five First Saturdays.

Every Knight needs to be devoted to the Rosary, which is Mary's gift to the Church. Knights are expected to carry the Rosary on their person. Don't be caught without it! But how is your devotion to this prayer? Challenge yourself to pray the Rosary every day. Whether you pray the Rosary in Church before Mass, with the family at home, by yourself, or when you drive the car, the Rosary will help you to grow closer to Jesus Christ. St. Alphonsus Liguori used to say, "if I have not prayed the Rosary each day, I fear for my salvation." If you are exceptionally busy, even praying part of the Rosary is still of great value. Even a single decade of the Rosary will merit an increase of grace.

How many of our councils are praying the Rosary before each meeting? How many of our brother Knights actually go early to pray the Rosary? Not enough. By the way, invite your chaplains to pray the Rosary with the men. For those who are looking to start Cor, you could build your Cor meeting on the Rosary. As long as your priest is there and some other teaching is included, that would count as a Cor meeting.

We cannot do the work of Knights for our Church and our Councils without the assistance of the Mother of God. Pray the Rosary to grow closer to your family and be a better father. Pray the Rosary for Vocations! Pray the Rosary to end abortion!



#### **State Incentives 1st Quarter Incentive**

Congratulations to Council 973 (Kenosha) who brought in 12 new members in the 1st quarter to reach over 100% of their council goal; to Council 3562 (Pewaukee) who brought in 10 new members in the 1st quarter to reach 100% of their council goal; and Council 13480 (Oregon) who brought in 5 new members in the 1st quarter to reach 100% of their goal; and lastly Council 17889 (Madison) who brought in 5 new members as well. These 4 councils will receive 75%

off of their October 1st State Per Capita Invoice.

#### **State Incentives** 2nd Quarter Incentive

For the 2nd Quarter incentive, the State Council is offering a unique 'Diocese' incentive.

The goals set by Diocese are based off of the year-end goals for each Diocese.

If a Diocese achieves their monthly intake goal, then their Bishop will receive \$1,000 for each month that

the goal is reached. These checks will be delivered to the Bishop personally at the Diocesan meetings in December—so that all the councils attending can share in this presentation.

Milwaukee ArchDiocese Goal: 50 new members each month

Green Bay, Madison and LaCrosse Diocese Goal: 35 new members each month

Superior Diocese: 20 new members each month

If a Diocese achieves the goal in only 1 of the months, then their Bishop will receive \$1,000 total. If a Diocese can achieve the goal in October as well as in November, then their Bishop will receive \$2,000

If each of your Diocese can achieve this goal, then this means that in the months of October and November our State Council will have brought in more than 350 new members during this time period—getting us back on track after a slower start this 1st quarter than we had expected.



Congratulations to the following Councils who achieved 50% or greater (but less than 100%) of their Membership Goal in the 1st Quarter

These 8 councils will receive 25% off of their October 1st State Per Capita Invoice.

We fully hope that each of your councils will engage in this opportunity and host 1-2 exemplifications during October and Novemebr in honor of your diocesan bishop. Please help us reach this goal so we can hand out checks in the sum of \$10.000 to our bishops this December!

Historically, the Fall months of October, November and December have been some of our better months in our State for membership growth. Many councils plan to be conducting Church Drives and Exemplifications in some cases, for the first time in this Fraternal Year.

If you are in need of help for a Drive, please reach out to me or your Diocesan Membership Coordinator and we will do our best to find assistance.

If you are planning to conduct a 'DELTA CHURCH DRIVE' please keep in mind that each of your Councils can order these materials directly from Supreme online. Please plan accordingly for this so that you ensure having your materials in ample time. Please ensure that you are 'PROMOTING' these Drives in your Parish Bulletins in advance of these events, along with having your membership attend these Masses wearing Knights gear so that Parishioners can see all those members present.

Finally—one great resource to continue to take advantage of at these Membership Drives is the 'E-MEMBERSHIP' tool. It's easy to use, and gets members signed up right away to the State Council! Further, you can easily transfer these men into your council afterwards via the 'PROSPECT' tab online after they complete their exemplification.

## Greetings to all Brother Knights and families!

Fourth Degree of the Wisconsin Knights of Columbus is having 2 exemplifications this October. The first will be held in Appleton on October 14th contact Master James TenPas or your local Faithful Navigator or your local Grand Knight. The second will be held in Medford, WI on October 21st. Again, reach out to Master Duane Zaborowski or your local Faithful Navigator or vour local Grand Knights. Supreme has requested that the Eastern and Western Wisconsin District bring in over 350 new Sir Knight between today and June 30, 2024. Please help us attain that number by signing up to become a 4th degree candidate for either the fall exemplifications or the ones that are scheduled in May 2024. The Master's of Eastern and Western Wisconsin invite all 3rd degree members to join the Patriotic Degree!



**The Honor Guard** is a big part of the 4th degree but there are many ways to participate as a 4th member degree without becoming part of the Honor Guard. Less than 10% of 4th degree Sir Knights are in the Honor Guard. The Sir Knights can become visible in many ways. Hold a fundraiser with signs showing that the event sponsored by the Local Assembly. Participate in the local parades and wear your KC shirts or attire. Many Assemblies have their own branded shirts, hats or jackets. Host a breakfast or other event for a group like the Special Olympics and wear your 4th degree attire, take pictures and try to get them published to gain recognition for your Assembly. Some Assemblies work food booths at county or local fairs, others do programs with area veteran groups. All of these and many more great activities allow you to be an active 4th degree member without the uniform. And when you participate in these activities, get photographs and send them to Master James TenPas (Dioceses of Green Bay and Milwaukee) or Master Duane Zaborowski (Dioceses Madison, La Crosse and Superior) so that we can share them with state and Supreme.

Our new Supreme Master is Michael McCuster and he is working to build membership in the 4th degree. He has many new about recruiting new members into the 4th degree. His first question is this - why are only 14% of the 3rd degree knights taking the final step and becoming 4th degree members? This is the Patriotic Degree of the Knights. He wants everyone to understand that the 3rd and 4th degree members are to work towards common goals and not against each other. If done properly, both the Council and Assembly will get recognized. And we will build a stronger Knights of Columbus as a result.

Finally, remember that to be in the Honor Guard you must have the official uniform. The official uniform per the by-laws of Supreme are the official blazer which is Navy Blue with a 4th Degree Emblem Crest and official buttons, Official 4th Degree Gray Trousers, Official 4th degree Necktie and the official 4th degree Beret with a 4th degree metal badge. No facsimiles are allowed. You can purchase the shirts, gloves and baldrics from the English Company or another supplier. You should never wear the social baldric with the new uniform.



#### TAX INFO - What's New

The IRS now requires electronic filing for all tax-exempt organizations, regardless of which form they use. The online filing system, also known as "E-Services", requires all new users to register or sign in with LOGIN.GOV or ID.me, the current IRS credential service providers. All must have their 2022 taxes in using the electronic filing.

There are two ways to access the Form 990-N Electronic Filing system: (1) Sign in with your active IRS username; or (2) Sign in/create an account with <u>LOGIN.GOV</u> or ID.me. Form 990-N filers who have an existing IRS username and register for a new Login.gov or ID.me account must use the email address associated with their IRS account. Refer to User Guide for the IRS Form 990-N Electronic Filing System. Instructions are available on the IRS website, links to which are in the Where to File section, below.

#### **FINANCIAL SECRETARIES &**

Grand Knights, to date I have assigned 78 members to councils throughout the State, and yet only 29 or 37% have actually been officially assigned to council **rosters** as of Sept. 25th. 2023 by either the Financial Secretary or the Grand Knight.

That leaves 49 e-members or 63% waiting for either a council to contact them, or for a council exemplification to be scheduled and completed.

If you are holding off exemplifying these men <u>until it's convenient for</u> your council's calendar, that's not fair to the new member.

We should be scheduling the exemplifications when it's convenient for the potential new member. I personally have held exemplifications on an evening, a Saturday or Sunday by myself, and later had them attend a formal group installation ceremony.

Let's give these men the chance for an opportunity of a lifetime. Don't delay, Invite Today!

When I assign an e-member to your council, I also copy your District Deputy, Diocesan Director, State Deputy, State Membership Director, as well as our Supreme Regional Growth Director.

We are all wondering what the delay is in bringing in these new 1st Degree Knights?

If you are having difficulty in making contact, or any other issue, please email me regarding the emember and I will gladly assist you with reaching a remedy

Also, again as a side note to **Financial Secretaries**, when an emember gets assigned to your council's roster remember he is only listed as 1st. Degree member. It is up to you to update his 3rd Degree member status.



Otherwise, when you do your billing for council dues, and issue their membership cards they won't be happy to see their card showing them only as 1st. Degree Knight.

As we together address the above current fraternal year's assigned members, please keep me abreast of any issues you may be experiencing. I check the weekly Supreme's rosters every Tuesday to see who has been officially transferred.

## **Officers Online Access**

Members in a role permitted access to Officers Online will be emailed an invitation code once the Supreme Council receives the appropriate form from the state council, local council, or assembly indicating the election or appointment, and records this information. If you do not receive an invitation code within a reasonable time, click "Account Assistant" on the sign in page and follow the instructions.

If you previously held a role with access to Officers Online, you do not need a new invitation code. Your access will automatically be reactivated once the appropriate form is submitted.

If you do not remember your log on credentials, click "Account Assistant" or "Password Reset" on the sign in page and follow the instructions. If additional assistance is required contact our Customer Service Department at 800-380-9995, option 2 and provide your membership number and role.


## THE BLESSED MICHAEL J. MCGIVNEY GUILD

The Wisconsin State Council Knights of Columbus has released the final figures of their recent Tootsie Roll drive to "Helping People with Intellectual Disabilities." The 2023 program raised an excess of \$600,000. Local councils have distributed in their immediate area over \$405,000 of these funds to local groups and organizations that assist the intellectually disabled. The State Committee has an additional \$135,000 available to distribute through their grant application process.

Organizations that assist people with intellectual disabilities are encouraged to submit applications for these funds to the Wisconsin State Knights of Columbus. Grant applications can be directed to: Wisconsin State Council Knights of Columbus % Bennie Green, State Director, 1100 Valley View Drive, Richland Center, WI 53581. Fifteen (15) copies of the application are necessary and must be submitted by December 15, 2023. Applications must be written on your organization's letterhead and must contain the following information: who do you serve, how many people you serve that will be impacted by the grant, how much money you are seeking, and what the money will purchase or provide.

All groups who apply will be notified in mid-January with the decision of the Wisconsin Knights of Columbus "Helping People with Intellectual Disabilities" committee.

major focus programs for Community this year are Coats for Kids and Habitat for Humanity, I'm going to lead off this month with the Catholic Citizenship Essay Contest. We should have at least 1 school per district (better 1 per Council) participating, as well as homeschoolers, Religious Ed classes, etc. It's relatively simple to do, requires minimal Council manpower and can generate local, State and even International honors for the winners. With significant growth, we could begin to introduce Diocesan (Regional) competition as

The Contest is open to all 8th-12th grade students. The 2023 theme is "How Can the Church Evangelize in the Digital Age?".

Essays are to be written in October and November; due to Councils by December 15, judged by Councils up to December 31 and due to the State Community/Youth Programs Director (me) by January 15. See the State website and Supreme website for more information and to download or order materials!

Turning to other Youth Programs, the Diocesan (Regional) Punt, Pass, Kick Contests are being held in October (between Oct. 1 and 22). The State Finals will be held on Saturday, October 28 at De Pere High School (1700 Chicago St.) in De Pere (alternate date if bad weather requires a change, November 4). Registration and practice 10-11 AM, competition starts at 11:15 AM. Refreshments will be available, and an awards ceremony will be held when competition is completed.

To date, I have heard of only 3 Councils in the state doing fall Soccer, not enough for a State Contest. So, I'm asking all Councils holding fall Soccer Contests to report their winners' scores to their DPCs by October 31. We can then decide on Regional and State award recipients based on their scores. If we get enough spring Soccer participants, we can then hold inperson Diocesan and/or State Contests in June and the fall winners will be invited to compete then.

Councils should begin this fall planning for their Knowledge and Free Throw Contests which can be held anytime (November-March). Also, in regard to the Christmas Poster Contest, check the information that James Vosters, our new Family Director, is posting, but be advised that for 203 we are only now running the Supreme "Keep Christ in Christmas" Poster Contest. The previous State "True Meaning of Christmas" Contest has been discontinued! All poster entries will go into the Supreme Contest which covers ages 5 (Kindergarten) to 14. Students will compete only against other students at their grade level. See the State and Supreme websites for more information, to download and order materials, proper entry forms, etc. More details about this next month.

Congratulations to all those Councils who've taken advantage of the Supreme/State Matching Offer to order their Coats for Kids for 2023-24 FY. IPSD Corey Coonen and Steve Geishirt have done a fantastic job spearheading the operation! This should be a fantastic October-November distribution this year from many sites. I and the DPCs hope to give them all the help we can. Stay tuned for more information on these operations (sites/dates) and plan to help out in your area if you possibly can. Also, for next year, we are looking for a Brother to take over the coordination of the Drive across the State and 1 Brother in each Diocese to assist with the coordination in their area. For those Councils not participating in the Matching Program, there's still plenty of time for you to secure coats to give out from Supreme or other sources as well as other items as well (hats, gloves & mittens, scarves, boots, snowpants, etc.). Some Councils work with schools, parish, homeless shelters and community centers, etc. to give out store gift cards or vouchers instead. Let's all strive to have at least 1 Coats for Kids giveaway in each District. For next year, let's go for 1 in each Council or parish cluster! Be sure to fill out Form 10784 on this program and get it in as soon as you complete it. Also, many thanks and praises to PSD Jack Wrbanich for his tireless work in spending hours sending out Council invoices and other important messages. Along with the incredible efforts of Corey and Steve, this huge accomplishment couldn't have been done without their fantastic leadership.

Finally, now's the time to be working with Habitat for Humanity and cooperating organizations in town to plan your winter-spring projects for Habitat and Helping Hands. It's also a great time to hold a Global Wheelchair fundraiser to purchase a few chairs for those in need and to review or establish Disaster Prep plans and supplies for the parish, Council, community, etc. More on these in November.

#### **Knights from 10 Councils Support Special Olympics Fall Games**

On Sept. 10th, thirty Knights and family members representing 10 Wisconsin councils came together to support the Wisconsin Special Olympics Fall Games in Wisconsin Rapids. The effort was led by Council 746 in Baraboo and Council 4586 Madison East. Council 746 coordinated the menu and purchase of the food. Council 4586 provided the primary pancake griddle. The remaining 8 councils provide the labor required to feed 720 people in two hours.

Paying for the ingredients represented a 75% reduction in the cost of hiring a caterer. However, The Baraboo and St Dennis councils decided to pay for the ingredients.

Lastly, if a program presents itself that is more than your council accomplishes by itself don't be afraid to reach out to other Councils for help.


