Membership Growth

Summer has come and gone; the vibrant colors of Fall are beginning to come alive around Wisconsin as well as Council Faith in Action and recruitment opportunities. So, why should we promote our story and grow the order? Simply put, members are the backbone of the Knights of Columbus, we are the leaders in our parishes and communities, and we are called to evangelize. We must grow or we become inconsequential in our parish and communities. Recruiting and retaining more men increases our presence and will ensure we have left the order better than we found it. **MORE** Knights bring **MORE**

hands to raise **MORE** funds (& to evangelize), doing God's good works helping **MORE** people in need!

During our last Diocesan Tour, we provided councils with several ideas to recruit new members, I want to highlight two of them, that if implemented correctly could have a huge impact on your council's ability to recruit. The Power of Ten and you Councils Landing/Prospect page.

Power of Ten

A simple and easy way to engage your council and have some fun. In smaller councils you may make it the Power of 5. Think outside the box but use the concept:

- Ask for a team Captain to head up a Team.
- Caution you know there are good recruiters in each council so don't let them be all on one team in fact your best recruiters should be the team captains. Heck your Council Chaplain may want to be a TEAM Captain or be on a team. The Chaplain as a TEAM Captain would be awesome.
- Divide your councils up in Teams of 10 or whatever maybe 5 in smaller councils. The more teams the better.
- Challenge each TEAM to recruit new members each month.
- Whatever Team brings in the most members each month get rewarded (reward determined by the council). It works, and there are bragging rights that come along with this.
- Brothers if we make recruiting (evangelizing fun) we will grow quickly. We men like competition.
- Power of 10 can be used for many things in a council as perhaps cooking teams, prayer teams, event teams, etc.

Any further questions on this please give me a shout. POWER of 10 works!

Prospect Landing Page

An Online Prospect Form is a digital signup sheet that captures a prospect's contact info for your council AND automatically sends them a personalized, informational email that your council helps create. The prospect will continue to receive personalized emails educating them on the Knights of Columbus, while your council continues to recruit them into your council. **Every council should utilize this tool**. • Fits perfectly into the current and future recruiting strategy • No need to use the Form 100 while recruiting • Access via phone, tablet, or computer • Invite prospects to Admissions (First) Degrees • Invite prospects and their families to service projects and faith & social events To request an Online Prospect form for a council or request updates visit http://info.kofc.org/pagerequest

First Hispanic Council in the Green Bay Diocese!

Congratulations to our first Hispanic Council in the Green Bay Diocese. Council #17348, St. Francis Xavier Council (patron saint of the Green Bay Diocese), installed their Council Officers on Sunday, September 29th at St. Philips the Apostle Parish. Worthy District Deputy Matthew Diederich and State Hispanic Development Coordinator Rufino Arce installed Grand Knight Francisco Flores and Council officers, including Chaplain Fr. Bill Hoffman. State Deputy Jack Wrbanich and State Advocate Corey Coonen presented Council officer jewels to the newly elected officers. Marquette Assembly 1197 Fourth Degree Honor Guard along with the East District Master Larry Ziarnik were also in attendance.



Support for Iraq Churches

During our State convention SD Jack announced that Supreme would begin a new initiative to provide support to our brothers and sisters in Iraq. During the Supreme Convention, Supreme Knight Carl A. Anderson announced a new initiative designed to strengthen our support and solidarity with our Christian brethren in Iraq.

The goal is to pare the top councils who have very generously supported the Christian Refugee fund with one of 60 parishes in Iraq. Supreme is hoping and I asked these councils to accept this invitation to partner directly with a parish and have the opportunity to communicate directly with them, build a relationship, and see exactly where their support is going and the impact they are having.

Through the Adopt-a-Parish initiative, councils commit to raising \$2,500 a year for two years for a sister parish in Iraq. During that period, they will have the opportunity to communicate with the pastor of that parish, learn more about the Christian community in Iraq, and receive specialized support from the Supreme Council's Fraternal Mission and Charities Departments.



Interest and support for this initiative have been strong, and we will soon have every Chaldean Catholic Church in Iraq

partnered with a Knights of Columbus Council in the United States. Wisconsin Councils have been on the ground floor with this initiative.

kept him from doing what he was considering. He decided to go home, and care of his wife as best as he could. Little acts can make a world of difference.

Just think what 38,000 Knights in Wisconsin can do for the 10,000 Special Olympics athletes in Wisconsin. Help us to reach our goal of \$125,000.00 to cover expenses for Team Wisconsin 2022. The USA games are to be held in Orlando, Fl. in June 2022. Please go to your councils and have a donation made to this drive. And do not forget to help your local Special Olympics groups.

Please put in Wisconsin Knights of Columbus and your council number. Any monies raised thru the pledges you take, will be credited to our Team Wisconsin drive as a donation from your council. 
In support of the goal of having 100% districts submitting ONE FOM each month, here are the percentages by diocese.


