Our Lady Help of Persecuted Christians

Brother Knights:

At this year's Supreme Convention a new pilgrim icon titled "Our Lady Help of Persecuted Christians" was unveiled.

This icon will travel to all jurisdictions in the Order and will be made available to all subordinate councils. The circulation of this icon will mark

the Order's 18th Marian Prayer Program. The Oklahoma State Council has received two of these icons. We are in the process of collecting the accompanying printed materials and preparing a circulation plan.

From the State Deputy

The icons and the circulation plan will be presented to our District Deputies at the upcoming Mid-Year meeting to be held Dec. 1 & 2 in Stillwater. Before outlining our program plans let's take a moment to review the involvement of the Knights of Columbus in supporting persecuted Christians.

In 2014 Islamic State Militants began an occupation of Syria and northern Iraq. They targeted Christians and other minority religions, killing thousands of the faithful and driving hundreds of thousands from their homelands as refugees. In response to this atrocity the

Supreme Council established the Christian Refugee Relief Fund to provide humanitarian relief to those whose lives had been devastated. Over the past four years the Order has committed in excess of \$20 million in aid. During this time the Order has also conducted campaigns to promote prayer for and awareness of the plight of those suffering persecution in the Middle East.

The icon, commissioned by the Supreme Council, was created by Italian artist Fabrizio Diomedi. It depicts the Blessed Mother with the Child Jesus over her heart. The images surrounding the Blessed Mother are a representative gathering of recent Christian martyrs including six priest members of the Knights of Columbus who were killed by the Mexican government in the early 1900's.

The September 2018 issue of the Columbian magazine contains an excellent article detailing the response of the Knights of Columbus to the atrocities committed by ISIS over the past four years as well as a timeline of the Order sponsored related events.

As we prepare our plan for the circulation of the Our Lady Help of Persecuted Christians icons we should all re-read the Columbian article so we are reminded of the harsh reality of the persecution of innocent people in our world today. The purpose of this Marian Prayer Program is to educate our members and our fellow parishioners of this reality and to promote prayer and physical support for the restoration of Christian communities in the Middle East, the cradle of Christianity in the

council to request an icon and related printed materials for at least one week. As Steve is working on the overall plan, each council should reach out to their pastor to discuss events that can be scheduled in conjunction with presence of the icon at their parish. An easel will be provided with each icon allowing display in a location at your parish accessible by all parishioners.

The printed materials accompanying each icon include prayer cards with the icon image on one side and on the other side a Prayer for Persecuted Christians written by our Supreme Chaplain, Archbishop William E. Lori. Also provided are a supply of prayer booklets containing a Mass prayer service and a Rosary prayer service. Advance copies of these printed materials will be made available to council leaders to review with their pastors prior to receiving the icon.

The icon packages that will be circulated include the icon, a custom carrying case to protect the icon during transport, an easel for display of the icon and a container of printed materials including a log book for event entries by each receiving council, a supply of Prayer Cards to give to event participants and a supply of Prayer Booklets for Mass Prayer Services and Rosary Prayer Services.

When receiving an icon package each council should conduct and inventory of received items and immediately notify their respective District Deputy or program chairman Steve Rose of any missing items or short supply of printed materials.

Let's make a concerted effort to include our pastors and parishioners in this Marian Prayer Program.




How we defeat the Evil One; Save souls

Brother Knights:

As we enter the month of November, the month of All Saints and All Souls, it is a great time to think about the eternal destiny of our individual souls.

Sometimes, in this modern age, we don't like to think about it, but there is a very real battle for our souls and

Of late, I have been following the beatification and canonization process of Venerable Francis Xavier Nguyen Van Thuan. In 1975, he was the archbishop of Saigon as it fell to the North Vietnamese. He was imprisoned by the communists for 13 years. After the Vatican negotiated his release, he was brought to the Holy See and named a cardinal and Saint John Paul the Great named him as President of the Pontifical Council for Justice and Peace.

While he was in prison, he was able to have a great relationship with his guards and kept converting them to the faith, by his kind

treatment of them. They helped him slip messages out to the Catholics of the country, encouraging them to keep the faith. These messages, were later complied and became a book entitled, "The Road to Hope."

Writing about the battle for our our souls, one of the messages of Cardinal Nguyen was this: "Your 'weapons' in this struggle are meditation, self denial, the sacraments, the rosary and reconciliation. Your allies are the Blessed Virgin Mary, St. Joseph, the angels (especially your guardian angel), your patron saint and your spiritual director. Unless you gradually drop your weapons and betray your allies, your victory is assured..." The emphasis on the Guardian Angel is mine, but the point is the same.

Without a good relationship with our Guardian Angel, we are simply lost in the Spiritual life. Likewise, if we do not have a good abiding relationship with our patron saint, we cannot possibly hope to gain the Kingdom. The Angels, the saints, the Blessed Mother, St. Jospeh, have already achieved the goal of eternal life. How can we possibly

hope to achieve it on our own?

The use of the "weapons" that Ven Francis Xavier speaks of are important. We might add wearing crucifixes, using holy water and frequent confession.

Additionally, we might use the frequent reading of Sacred Scripture and the reading of the Catechism of the Catholic Church. If we do not continue to form our conscience, then we do not continue to grow. These are all important. That is one of the reason the Church gives these to us. We could discuss the issue of self-denial for a long time; something most Christians do not practice hardly at all, especially outside of Lent.

So, on this journey toward the Kingdom, keep your weapons handy, and keep your allies close by as well. Confer with them frequently and the devil simply does not have the opportunity to do combat with you.

Striving for the Kingdom and pushing toward the fullness of Life on high with the angels and the saints is virtually guaranteed to those who persevere.




Fr. Oswalt leads a blessing of flowers at the Shrine of Our Lady of Guadalupe at St. Gregory's in September.

Hobby Lobby purchases St. Gregory's University

SHAWNEE — Hobby Lobby has agreed to pay \$8 million to buy the campus of bankrupt St. Gregory's University.

The private Catholic university closed in December after being denied a \$12.5 million loan from the U.S. Department of Agriculture.

Hobby Lobby is an Oklahoma-City based company that sells arts and crafts items, picture frames, fabrics and holiday merchandise at more than 800 stores throughout the United States.

The popular retailer has not disclosed what it intends to do with the 73-acre campus.

A Hobby Lobby Stores Inc. executive on Sept. 27 signed the purchase agreement for the campus and associated assets. A U.S. bankruptcy judge must approve the agreement before the sale can become final. A hearing is set for Nov. 28 in Oklahoma City.

The agreement became public in late October when a bankruptcy trustee requested approval of the sale.

Hobby Lobby was the only one of three potential purchasers to submit an offer after the campus was listed for sale April 17, the trustee reported.

Anyone still interested in the campus can submit a higher cash bid on or before Nov. 28. The bid must be at least \$8,490,000.

Proceeds from the sale will be used to pay off claims and mortgages against the campus, the trustee reported.

Owed \$4.78 million are the Citizen Potawatomi Community Development Corp., the Citizen Potawatomi Nation and the Catholic Order of Foresters, the trustee reported.

New Greenhouse at the CFL



Since our last issue, the Knights from Council 11237 (Edmond, St. Monica) helped with the construction of a new greenhouse at the Center of Family Love. The CoFL residents will be using this greenhouse for their winter crops.

Team Champions and parishes will be given marketing and support materials to assist in this challenge.
