#### MY STRENGTH AND MY SONG

After they had safely crossed the Red Sea, Moses and the Israelites sang a song of praise to God: "I will sing to the Lord, for he is gloriously triumphant; horse and chariot he has cast into the sea. The Lord is my strength and my song, and he has been my savior" (Ex 15:1-2).

### K OF C OPERATION ST. MARY JOPLIN BACK-TO-SCHOOL!

All Arkansas Knights,

We have been blessed with a great opportunity in the lives of those whose lives have been turned upside down by a tornado. St Mary in Joplin had their church and school destroyed by the tornado that went through Joplin earlier this year. Something like one in four of the Knights in the St Mary council lost their homes. We raised \$3,000 dollars to help them but now they need our muscle!

St Mary School will be opening the first week of September. There is a warehouse that is being converted into classroom to be used as the school. The work on the conversion will be completed just in time for the start of the school year. In the meantime, what could be salvaged from the school that was destroyed and all the donations they have received are being stored in another warehouse. On Saturday, September 3rd they need to get everything from storage to the new school and the classrooms set up to be ready for the children to start school that Tuesday. That's we're we come in!

I won't guarantee I got every fact right but pretty close. The one fact that is indisputable is that they need our help to get this done.

Right out of the shoot let me tell you that Saturday, September 3rd is the Saturday of the Labor Day weekend. It is also the day of the University of Arkansas' first home game. I don't mention that because I want to give you an out but rather because I don't want to be counting on people who later realize these things and so back out and leave us short of help. We are opening this up to our council first. If we have enough help, we will leave it to our council. If we need more help, we will open it up to the district.

We are also going to feed all the workers and any of the local knights and their families who wanted to stop by that day. We will bring doughnuts, coffee and juice for breakfast and will cook for lunch. We hope to give the families a chance to take a moment to just sit and visit with their friends. A luxury they really haven't had since the tornado struck.

#### So here are the details:

We will meet on Saturday, September 3rd between 7:00 and 7:15 AM at St Stephens to pack supplies and head up to Joplin.

Our return time will depend on how quickly the work goes. If you need to be back by a certain time you can drive separately and return as you need.

#### We Need:

- You <u>and your wife</u> if she wants to help the teachers set up their classrooms.
- Truck and closed trailers for hauling between the storage and the school.
- Two wheel dollies or other equipment to help in moving furniture (desks, shelves, etc.)
- Cleaning supplies to clean up the classrooms.
- Coolers to keep pop and water cold so workers stay hydrated.
- Lawn chairs for people to sit and relax we they need to or when they are eating.
- Anything I am forgetting that you know we will need.

### CAMPAIGN FOR PEOPLE WITH INTELLECTUAL DISABILITIES JOHN BODENSTEINER

October 7<sup>th</sup> through 23rd is the time for all councils to conduct their campaigns, especially if they will be soliciting funds from the public and giving tootsie rolls for donations. Also, since there is typically a three-week period needed to deliver tootsie rolls or aprons from the vendors, the orders for either item should be placed now. In order to save shipping costs and to meet the minimum order requirements for tootsie rolls, it is suggested that councils combine their orders or for one order to be placed by a council for the whole district.

The forms needed to submit tootsie roll or apron orders have been emailed to all district deputies, grand knights, financial secretaries, and program directors that have email addresses in the 2011-2012 State Council Directory.

The goal of the campaign this year is to have all 56 active councils participate and to raise \$90,000, an increase of 50% over 2010. In last month's newsletter, I published the financial history of the state's campaigns. This month I want to suggest alternatives to the tootsie roll option, if that type of campaign is not feasible.

### Campaign Fundraising Suggestions:

- Send letters and make personal visits to local businesses to solicit their financial support;
- 2. Solicit donations before/after weekend masses after having announcements in the church bulletins;
- 3. Golf tournaments;
- 4. Breakfasts or dinners:
- 5. Activities related to October Fest or other fall community events;
- 6. BBQ picnics;
- 7. Rummage sales;

- 8. Bingo/card games;
- 9. Music concerts;
- 10. Passing the hat at council/assembly meetings; and,
- 11. Sending letters to council members asking for donations this is a way of getting all knights involved, especially those not participating in other CPID activities.

Councils may do several of the fundraising options listed. At the very minimum, every council can ask its members to get involved in this signature Knights of Columbus charity by giving a personal donation.

### **OUR LADY OF GUADALUPE FRAMED IMAGE TOUR**

Cardinal James Francis Stafford, Major Apostolic Penitentiary Emeritus, and archbishop of Denver emeritus, was the principal celebrant at Votive Mass of Our Lady of Guadalupe on Wednesday, August 3rd, at the Supreme Convention in Denver, Colorado. Knights of Columbus state deputies stood before the altar at the end of the Mass holding their jurisdiction's framed image of Our Lady of Guadalupe, as Msgr. Eduardo Chavez explained the new Marian Prayer Program in which the images would be hosted by local councils worldwide during prayer services. The Guadalupe images were blessed by Pope Benedict XVI and touched to the tilma of Juan Diego which bears the miraculous image of Our Lady of Guadalupe. In addition, the frames of the images were sealed with soil from Tepeyac hill in Mexico, where Our Lady's appearances took place. The new Knights of Columbus Marian Prayer Program will take place throughout the Order and lead into the second international Guadalupe Festival to be held at the Los Angeles Coliseum the weekend before the 2012 Supreme Convention. Supreme has blessed our state with two Our Lady of Guadalupe images and prayer books. Our jurisdiction has been separated by districts into two, East and West. The East District's (ED) consist of District's 03, 01, 13, 11, 07, 02 and 05. The West District (WD) consists of District's 10, 04, 08, 14, 09, 12 and 06. Our Lady of Guadalupe image will pilgrim through each district for at least one month starting with District 03 in the ED and District 10 in the WD. Each case containing the image of Our Lady of Guadalupe has a LOG BOOK in the side cover of the casing. This log must be filled out each time you have a prayer service/rosary and/or any gathering honoring Our Lady of Guadalupe. Please ensure the log book is kept with each image. We must return both set's at the end of the pilgrimage.

The District Deputy's will be responsible for ensuring the Our Lady of Guadalupe image pilgrims through their district. The DD coordinate with each Grand Knight the dates their council will have the image in their parish. Each Grand Knight will need to coordinate with their parish pastor's to ensure the image is displayed, at least one prayer service with the accompanied prayer books is made at each parish, one Rosary is said by the Knights and it is kept safe. Again, please ensure the log book is filled out for each event. The host council will then contact the next visiting council for date and time of delivery of Our Lady of Guadalupe image, prayer books, and log book. Please follow up with each Grand Knight receiving the Our Lady of Guadalupe image to ensure they are on schedule. Once the last council in your district is concluding their time with Our Lady of Guadalupe image, the DD will be responsible for contacting the next District Deputy to coordinate hand off.

There are prayer cards which may be given to those who attend a prayer service, although limited. One of the follow up questions during my call will be the quantity of prayer cards left. I pray we can receive more from Supreme. We will see.

May Our Lady of Guadalupe keep you safe and watch over our pilgrimage of her image throughout our Arkansas Jurisdiction.

### **40 DAYS FOR LIFE**

40 Days for Life begins on September 28<sup>th</sup> and runs thru November 6<sup>th</sup>, Arkansas' Knights of Columbus have adopted October 10<sup>th</sup> (from 7am to 7pm) and the afternoon of November 2<sup>nd</sup> (12 noon to 7:00pm) to pray at the abortion clinic in Little Rock. We encourage each Council to be involved with this prayer effort. Please share this information with your Council Pro-Life Director, or if your Council is without a Pro-Life Director, we ask that you appoint someone to bring forth volunteers from your Council. We invite Knights, their family members, friends and other parish members to join this wonderful prayer effort for the lives of the unborn.

Please email, or call us with the names, phone numbers and email of those who will pray with us on those days, and the times that they will attend. It is urgent that we fill all times as we need at least 2, or more to be there at all times that are assigned to the Knights. Please encourage that they commit to at least one hour, i.e. 7-8am; 1-2pm, or whatever time is best for them.

Of course, we all know that the Pro-Life effort begins with prayer and it has become evident that sometimes it makes a difference where those prayers are being offered. Many lives have been saved at the entrance to the abortion clinics around the country, because there were sidewalk prayer warriors praying the Rosary, or Divine Chaplet, or general prayers when a pregnant mother arrived for an abortion. There were 2 lives saved in Little Rock, week before last, and there have been a number of others there also.

Other results around the country have seen clinics shut down in several states, And, as a result of thousands of Pro-Life supporters, writing and calling their state and federal government officials on behalf of the "not yet delivered" babies, new Pro-Life laws are being passed around the country. But, not enough, not yet! We need your help.

Please go to the Knights of Columbus website and refer to the "culture of Life" page, for information on what you can do to help. In the meantime, please ask your Council members to step up and be counted in the Pro-Life movement. Ask them to commit to at least one hour

praying at the abortion clinic in Little Rock, on October 10<sup>th</sup> or on Nov 2<sup>nd</sup> (All Souls Day), during these 40 days for Life.
