Chief of Staff's Message

Brothers,

I thought this story about O Holy Night would certainly be worth passing on. I know I always like it, but this gave a different slant to the song. Hope you enjoy the read.

THE STORY BEHIND THE CAROL

In 1847, a French priest commissioned this beloved song for his parish. Lyricist Placide Cappeau finished his poem, and pleased with his work, he asked Adolphe Charles Adams to compose the music. The song was sung for Christmas Eve mass.

Initially, *Cantique de Noel* (the song's French name) was widely loved. Later, leaders learned Cappeau was a socialist and Adams a Jew—and the song was banned from services. But the French people loved it so much, they continued to sing it.

Ten years later, John Sullivan Dwight introduced it in America. An abolitionist, he was moved by the third verse. (*Chains shall he break for the slave is our brother*). Although banned in France, *Cantique de Noel* became popular with Americans.

On Christmas Eve in 1871, in the midst of fierce fighting between France and Germany during the Franco-Prussian War, an unarmed French soldier jumped out of the trenches, walked onto the battlefield, and started singing the song's first line in French. After singing all three verses, a German soldier emerged and started singing a sacred German hymn. Fighting stopped for the next 24 hours in honor of Christmas Day. Temporary peace was initiated by *O Holy Night*.

Fast forward to 1906. Reginald Fessenden figured out that by combining two frequencies, radio could do more than transmit Morse code. It would be possible to speak! For the first time in history, a human voice was heard on the airwaves; Fessenden read the Christmas story from the book of Luke, then picked up his violin and performed *O Holy Night*.

State Program Director's Message

WHAT MADE MEN AT CHRIST THE KING JOIN THE KNIGHTS

Somebody asked me what makes parishioners join the Knights of Columbus at Christ the King? They all came up with different answers.

Doughnuts and coffee are also available in the Community Center after each mass on Sundays. This promotes fellowship and camaraderie.
- 3) The Knights of Columbus' mission of helping the needy and the outcast through the Manna cupboard, Coats for Kids, Tootsie roll drive programs. The Knights collect food donations to the Manna Cupboard. This helps in feeding the homeless and not leaving anybody going to bed hungry. They also prepare sandwiches every Monday to feed the hungry.
- 4) The Council's successful promotion of its programs relating to faith, Family values, helping the community, and enhancing life.
- 5) The Knights of Columbus members are visibly engaged in helping the church and our parish community by raising money to promote its charitable work. Many members of the Knights volunteer in various church ministries: Eucharistic, Liturgical, Hospitality, just to name a few.
- 6) There is a special gathering room known as the Holy Grounds where parishioners can gather after daily mass and have coffee and doughnuts and meet new friends. There is also a place where parishioners can play chess and bingo games.
- 7) The Knights does its role of promoting our religious faith by evangelization, protecting the church from malicious attacks and destruction of its properties from vandals.
- 8) They are grateful to God for all the good graces they have received from Him and They want to give something back to the Community as a sign of their appreciation.
- 9) They want to be a part of the solution and not of the problem. They want to build a better community where God is at the center of their lives, where people have time to say hello to each other, and promote friendship and support to each other.

10) They are proud to belong to a Worldwide Organization comprised of 2,000,000 Members working together to create a better world. It has an insurance program Available only to members primarily intended to protect widows and orphans. Roses for Life



The Ontario Roses for Life program is an effective way to raise money to support pro-life organizations or activities. The Roses for Life program has successfully grown over the past few years with more councils participating in the program than in the recent past. To continue growing the Roses for Life program, the Ontario State Council has redesigned the Rose Lapel. The new Rose has a red and a white Rose. The red rose signifies our opposition to abortion while the white rose is the international symbol opposing euthanasia. We have also provided the option of the Roses for Life Cross with the red and white rose. The cross may be distributed in a similar way as the Rose Lapel or (based on its cost) it may be distributed to the council Knights of Columbus members and their wives. Purchase the Roses for Life for \$45 for every 100 Roses + (\$10 shipping) from the State Office by using Form SO-15. Purchase the Roses for Life Cross Pin (20 or more) for \$2.50 each or (50 or more) for \$2.00 each + (\$10 shipping) from the State Office by using Form SO-15A.

Knight in the Light

Sir Knight Don Cortez, PGK, FS and State Director of College Councils

Don Cortez was born in Oakland California in June of 1946 and raised in the east bay. Don is the oldest of five siblings and was 17 when his father passed away. His youngest brother was 16 months old and so Don decided to pursue his higher education closer to home while assisting his mom with raising his siblings.

His mother was a devout Catholic and their faith in the church helped Don assist his mom while gaining a degree in Biology from Cal State University at Hayward. After graduation Don began coaching and teaching at a local high school, Moreau Catholic.

He continued his education and in 1974 earned his master's degree in Sports Psychology and Sociology at San Francisco State University. Upon completion Don went to the University of Oregon to coach football.

While coaching he was contacted by the National Office of Fellowship of Christian Athletes (FCA) and became a summer camp speaker and counselor for the program.

In 1977 he, his wife and six-month-old daughter moved for him to become the quarterback and running back coach at West Texas AM where they won the Missouri Valley Championship which allowed the opportunity to become the head coach at Panhandle State University in Oklahoma. In his 3rd season as head coach, they played in the national playoffs, so Don was asked to coach at the University at Texas in El Paso.

The proof that success and or failure in college coaching both meant location instability which caused Don and his wife to conclude that after 22 years of coaching and having 4 children born in 3 states they decided to settle back home in Hayward, CA where he became an investment real estate consultant and founded Goaline Real Estate services.

While consulting with a client in 1985 the client asked that he partner to form the AA Professional answering service which began in late 1985 in Hayward California.

After 14 years of business experiences in California, Don and Shar felt the draw of life in a college sports town when a business opportunity to purchase Tel-Com Inc in Reno Nevada. In 1999 they relocated to Reno, Nevada.



In 2009 Tom Peacock and Steve Evermann sponsored Don to become a Knight at Council 4997 in Reno Nevada. In his 10 years at 4997 he eventually became the Grand Knight and a 4th Degree Knight. When the Knights decided to make Don a State Director of College Councils, he felt it was his calling to continue help young men grow in their faith so in 2019 he became FS for the University of Nevada Council, 16207.

This position became a dream come true for Don. He has enjoyed working with young catholic men and women, with FCA and with this position now with young catholic men through the Knights of Columbus.

The Knights of Columbus has allowed Don to develop a better personal understanding of Catholicism and the impact that is has on the world. This has also allowed him to develop a stronger faith relationship with his children and grandchildren, especially through the many family-based activities supported by the knights.

Thanksgiving Food Basket Drive

It started on October 21st with a phone call from Catholic Charities of Northern Nevada. They asked if Ponderosa Council 4928 could make food donations on short notice for their annual Thanksgiving Food Basket program. Later it was learned that they had received a donation of whole turkeys from the Dolan family foundation and modified their initial request to us to just the “fixin’s.”

By October 24th, Ponderosa Council 4928 had allocated \$500 from its general fund and emailed its membership requesting case orders of food donations itemized by alphabetized surnames. All food donations were consolidated immediately following our Monthly Council Meeting on November 1st. We hammed it up (at the request of Catholic Charities) by including 40 cases of 3@16oz. Royale canned hams. All food donations were delivered the following morning to the St. Vincent’s Drop-off Center in Sparks.

Over 1,050 pounds of food fare for holiday baskets delivered as promised within two weeks! Not quite as fast as Santa, but pretty darn good. Chalk one up for FAMILY.

Our Lady of Wisdom is also the home of University of Nevada Council 16207 where on Sunday, October 30th, Grand Knight Timothy J. Watts presented a check in the amount of \$7,000 to Bishop Meuggenborg from proceeds of the 2022 Nevada State Council Seminarian Education Fund Raffle.

In addition, St. John Vianney Council 13842 Trustee SK Thomas M. Gurgui presented a council check in the amount of \$2,400 in support of the Diocese of Reno Seminarians.

Both donations were generous, but the need to support our next generation of parish leaders is great. State Advocate SK John D. Long, Esq. led the presentation.

Outreach to Young Pregnant & Parenting Women in Need

Casa de Vida is a private, nonprofit corporation providing support services for pregnant young women. When Supreme released its Aid and Support After Pregnancy (ASAP) program last September, their pitch was like a fast ball, belt high, center cut and right in our Council’s wheelhouse.

Ponderosa Council 4928 has been supporting Casa de Vida for decades. At our Monthly Council Meetings there is a jar near the Inside Guard’s station designated for Casa de Vida donations. Article 6 of our Council’s Standing Rules states that “funds collected annually for Casa de Vida will be matched by funds from the Council’s general fund (November

2001).” Our Council Life Director pleaded with Council Officers to take advantage of ASAP, ASAP!

On November 2nd, our first presentation of \$500 was made to Whitney Pomi, Executive Director, Casa de Vida. On November 3rd, our completed ASAP rebate application Form 11377 was electronically submitted to Supreme. Some would say, but not us, that if this program were a baseball, its exit velocity off the bat would be over 110mph. That’s quick!

Ponderosa Council 4928 is on track to submit a second rebate application by year’s end. We encourage all councils to take advantage of this important program to help support the most vulnerable amongst us – the unborn and pregnant young women in need. It’s a LIFE program that is a homer every time.

From Cardinal Timothy Dolan’s Keynote Address - 140th Supreme Convention

“Blessed Michael McGivney believed firmly in the American foundational principle that every person of whatever faith had the right to hold his head high in this republic, to exercise his religion freely and confidently. This led the sons of Michael McGivney to fight religious bigotry here in America, to coordinate the arrival of chaplains to serve our soldiers in World War I, to rise to the defense of our neighbors to the south as the Mexican government persecuted the Church, to oppose totalitarianism of the Nazis and fascists, to stand up for the Church oppressed by communism in Central and Eastern Europe, and to strengthen the Church here at home especially, in service to the poor, the oppressed, the racially segregated.”

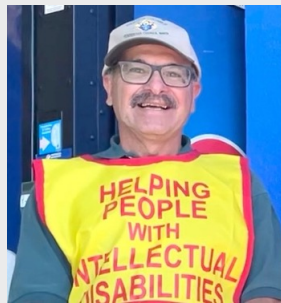
