America's Next Blessed!

On May 26, 2020, Pope Francis approved a decree recognizing a miracle attributed to the intercession of Father McGivney. A muchanticipated step toward sainthood, the pope's approval opens the way for Father McGivney to be beatified and declared Blessed.

Presently, he is a Venerable Servant of God, a title bestowed on March 15, 2008, when his heroic virtue was recognized by Pope Benedict XVI. This important step occurred after years of careful

investigation of Father McGivney's life, spirituality and holiness by the Congregation for the Causes of Saints. The declaration of Venerable confirmed what those who knew him in life, and others who call upon him since his death, have believed about Father McGivney: He lived a life of heroic virtue with an extraordinary love of God and neighbor.

The declaration of "Venerable" confirms what those who knew him in life, and others who call upon him since his death, have believed about Father McGivney: He lived a life of heroic virtue with an extraordinary love of God and neighbor.

The cause has now entered a new and exciting phase, with the beatification ceremony expected to take place in the Archdiocese of Hartford in the winter of 2020. A second confirmed miracle through the intercession of Father McGivney is needed for canonization and sainthood.

All Knights and their families, as well as all those devoted to Father McGivney, are asked to pray for his intercession in their daily needs, especially in cases of serious illness, and to report any favors and healings to the Guild.



Social distancing and COVID19 presents a new set of challenges for recruiting. With Churches reopening across Nevada to higher capacities, many things are changing, but one thing remains the same. Making a genuine connection with someone remains the most compelling way to win the hearts and minds of prospective candidates. Now is the time to challenge yourself, personalizing your approach and

sharing your message with those you encounter in the course of your daily life.

For years now, I challenge myself to inject the Knights of Columbus into conversation. In many cases

I have initiated conversations with a total stranger. My message may be focused on a potential recruit, while others could present the opportunity to simply demonstrate the good works of our order from a public relations standpoint. Here's a few examples of how this technique has worked for me.

Talking with a fine gentleman, a Catholic from Iran, my intent was genuine from the moment we met. Inspired by my words, he is now a Sir Knight and a dear friend. My most recent recruit is a young man I met in a grocery store on a Saturday night. He was working two jobs to make ends meet, and when I asked him about his true passion, he told me he wanted to become a Police Officer. When i shared the creation of the Knights of Columbus' 9/11 Heroes Fund, the reason I became a Knight, it made his decision an easy one to join our order.

Church strategies for recruiting are varied, attending different Mass times and sitting in various locations. When Mass ends I challenge myself to identify a nice family as they are leaving the Church and introduce myself, positioning the Knights of Columbus as a family organization. While recruiting drives after Mass will eventually return, take these suggestions and make them your own.

It's a very simple question, "Have you ever considered joining the Knights of Columbus?" The most common response I receive is they don't know much about us, which demonstrates the mission we face as an order. Take this recruiting challenge to heart, "TALK K of C" and change someone's life, you'll be glad you did.

Knights of Columbus History Fact:

Do you know about the following prayer?

Prayer is the mortar for the structure that holds our respective homes together!

The Five Finger Prayer

Your Thumb: is nearest to you. Begin your prayers by praying for those closest to you. To pray for our loved ones is, as C. S. Lewis once said, a "sweet duty".

The next finger is the pointing finger. Pray for those teach and heal. This includes priests, doctors, teachers, and coaches. They need God's guidance.

Worthy Sir Knight Bruce had had enough of Chicago's miserable weather; so, in June 1970 he transferred to Arizona State University and graduated in January 1972 with a Bachelor of Science degree in Business Administration specializing in insurance. In February 1972 he began his thirty-four-year career with Allstate Insurance Company in the Claims Department. He was the office Claims Manager in Phoenix and Las Vegas and retired in July 2000.

While working in Tucson he met my wife of forty-three-years. Diana was hired by Allstate as a summer intern in clerical. They moved to San Diego and then to Phoenix. Diana currently is employed by GLB Insurance as a commercial insurance agent. They have four sons. Jonathan and his wife, Bejon, own and operate Redline Printing in Las Vegas. They have one grand-daughter, Lilly. Their second son, Andrew joined the United States Army upon his graduation from Bishop Gorman High School. Andrew was trained as an Arabic Linguist and served with Special Forces out of Ft. Lewis, Washington. He sustained injuries twice in Operation Iraq Freedom and was medically retired from the Army. He is the recipient of two Purple Hearts and the Army Bronze Star with a V for Valor. He went to Medical College of Wisconsin using his GI benefits and will graduate as a medical doctor early next year. He has committed himself to the VA to work as a doctor. Matthew is son number three and upon graduated from Bishop Gorman entered the United States Army. He is presently a captain, to become a major next year. He and his wife, also an Army officer have been in Korea, Afghanistan among other places. Finally, son Timothy is a grocery manager for Smith's. Joseph O'Callaghan Assembly was chartered in which he became a charter member and held the office of Faithful Navigator.

During his long and active time with the Knights, he participated in numerous events with Diana and their sons. Membership in the Knights of Columbus for Sir Knight Bruce was a rewarding and enjoyable journey as he ENJOYED the experience! He is very appreciative for the honor and the opportunity to serve the great State of Nevada Knights of Columbus!



How to Select a Knight and Family of the Month



Here's a tried and true method.

Criteria:

- 1. Stepping up and chairing a Council activity within a 30-day window.
- 2. Easily recognizing how one (they) went all out to make an activity a success within a 30-day window.
- 3. If nothing jumps out at you, then think of one (them) that consistently volunteers to help, drawing little attention to themselves over an extended period of time.
- 4. When you still cannot select someone, then resubmit one that you've recognized within the current Fraternal Year or within the past calendar year. Especially true for Family of The Month to submit to Supreme. It's always better to do something, rather than nothing at all.
- 5. Who selects? This is really a Grand Knight, who'll ultimately decide, but it is very WISE to send out an email to your Officers, before your next meeting, asking them for their suggestion. Grand Knights; keep in mind that asking for help is a key function of Leadership. This is usually decided upon at your Officers' meetings and announcements and certificate presentation is performed at the next Council meeting.
- 6. Grand Knights: this is very important:
 - Supreme will only acknowledge one family from your Council per month, you can have as many as you like, but Supreme will register the first one that they receive.
 - Since Knight of the Month does not go to Supreme and recognition remains in the Council, it's very possible to honor more than one Knight.
