## Message from the State Deputy

*“Effectively sharing Christ love with our Brother Knights, their families and the Parishes we serve”*

Dear Brother Knights,

March is a busy month preparing for the State Convention, State Audit and checking where we as a State, District and Council are compared to where we planned on being. I am pleased to announce that our State Round Table Chairman District Deputy Charles Reifsnnyder has reached the goal for the fraternal year and that the State Reactivation Chairman District Deputy Meynard Infantado has two of the three council reactivations needed to reach his goal with a couple in the works. Out of the 75 jurisdictions in the Order that Nevada is currently 9th in the Order in Intake goal percentage at 61.33% and 5th in the Order in Net/Net membership goal achievement at 158% but there is still time for Supreme to record new Brother Knights after February 22 the writing of this letter. Thanks to all the Knights that are working to make sure that all Catholic men that are eligible are given the chance and are invited to join us.

Retention is somewhere we need better focus as we are 21nd in the Order in net membership currently at 57.08% due to our suspension of 93 Brother Knights. The last withdraw request I reviewed was a 95-year-old veteran in a nursing home that we were suspending. He should have been submitted to Supreme as disabled and the council should be reaching out and sending him the council / state newsletters to keep him engaged in the Knights rather than removing him from our rolls. Think about how you would feel if you join the Knights over 40 years ago and now in older age and disable we kick you out. This one will work out well due to some Brothers taking action but we as Knights want to make sure this doesn't ever happen to a Brother. This leads me to believe that the council Retention Chairman and Retention Committee up through the District Deputy and State Retention Chairman (and Supreme for not asking why) need to review all suspension and withdraw request more thoroughly.

The bills for initiation degree fees through 12-31-2017 will be going out to council before this newsletter get to you (barring any unforeseen issues). The State has determined that these need to go out quarterly to be effective in our record keeping.

## Message from the State Deputy (continued)

Remember that the Knights support the widows and orphans of their Brother Knights. As our 2017 bylaws state on page 29 the State Council and subordinate councils should do as follows:

### 29. WIDOWS:

- (a) The State Council shall invite the Past State Deputies and their wives, and the widows of Past State Deputies to all major social affairs, such as Annual State Meeting Banquets, Training, Installation, and Degree banquets and like events.
- (b) All subordinate councils and other units will be encouraged to do likewise.
- (c) All such subordinate councils prepare and maintain a mailing list of their widows as long as they live, and that they are encouraged to mail council or other bulletins to them so that they may see the continuation of their mate's efforts.
- (d) All such subordinate councils or other units shall be encouraged to mail copies of such bulletins and similar mailings to the Supreme Secretary, the State Officers, State Chairmen for Program, Membership, Newsletter, and others as the State Deputy may direct and to the District Deputies of their and neighboring districts and to all Past State Deputies and their widows.

State Convention is coming soon so please send the award applications and pay the per capita both to Supreme and the State if your council has not and send your State Convention Delegate forms to Worthy State Secretary Brother Vic Edwards and any council resolutions to Worthy State Advocate Brother Thierry Barkley before the deadline.

## Warriors to Lourdes

The 2018 Warriors to Lourdes Pilgrimage for non-wounded, wounded, ill or injured military personnel during the 60th Annual International Military Pilgrimage (PMI) will take place May 15-22, 2018. The theme for the 60th PMI is *Pacem in Terris* (Peace on Earth).

The pilgrimage, sponsored by the [Archdiocese for the Military Services, USA](#), and the [Knights of Columbus](#), is the latest event in a long history of both organizations' involvement in Lourdes and service to the military.

Military personnel, their designated caregivers and volunteers will travel to the Marian shrine for a time of rest, prayer and healing. The retreat will consist of a number of spiritual events, including special Masses, Faith and Fellowship Sessions, a Marian Procession, Adoration and Blessing of the Sick, a visit to the baths at the Sanctuary of Our Lady of Lourdes, and an International Opening Ceremony and Candlelight Vigil that draw tens of thousands of troops to the sacred shrine every year.

“We will journey and pray with pilgrims from around the world,” said Archbishop Timothy P. Broglio of the Archdiocese of Military Services. “It will be an occasion to raise our hearts and minds to the Prince of Peace and beg for an increase in understanding and a decrease in strife.”

## Pope Francis Names Most Reverend George Leo Thomas, Bishop of Las Vegas

Vatican City, Feb 28, 2018 / 05:36 am ([CNA/EWTN News](#)).- Bishop George Leo Thomas, who until now has led the Diocese of Helena, will be taking the reins in Las Vegas, bringing with him broad pastoral experience and expertise in psychology, mental health issues, mission work and prison ministry.

In the Feb. 28 announcement from the Vatican, it was noted that Bishop Thomas of will be taking over for Bishop Joseph Anthony Pepe, who has led the Diocese of Las Vegas since 2001, but is now stepping into retirement at age 75.

Thomas, 67, was born May 19, 1950 in Anaconda, Montana as the second of five children. He was raised in Butte where he attended Catholic school, graduating from Christian Brothers High School in 1968.

He received a degree in literature from Carroll College in 1972 before entering St. Thomas Seminary in Washington as a student with the Archdiocese of Seattle. He obtained a Master of Divinity degree there before being ordained to the priesthood May 22, 1976 in Seattle.

After his ordination, Thomas served in several parishes, including Holy Family Parish in Kirkland and St. James Cathedral in Seattle, where he had been ordained. He also served as parish administrator for Sacred Heart Parish in Bellevue and Holy Innocents Mission in Duvall.

In addition to his pastoral positions, Thomas was also the prison chaplain for the King County Jail and the Seattle City Jail for 12 years. He was chairman of the board of directors for Catholic Community services for 10 years, and also served as chaplain for the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart in Seattle.

Thomas then entered graduate school at the University of Washington in 1981, where he received a master's degree in counseling and mental health.

In 1986, he obtained a doctorate in philosophy with an emphasis in Pacific Northwest mission history. His dissertation, titled "Catholics and the Missions of the Pacific Northwest," was given the university's Gordan C. Lee award.

A year later, Thomas was appointed chancellor and vicar general for the Archdiocese of Seattle. He held the positions for 17 years before being named apostolic administrator for the diocese in 1997, following the death of Archbishop Thomas Murphy.

Thomas was appointed auxiliary bishop for Seattle two years later in 1999, and in March 2004 was tapped to head the Diocese of Helena.

He speaks Spanish and is also a member of the Bishops for the American College in Louvain and Native-American Catholics committees for the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops.

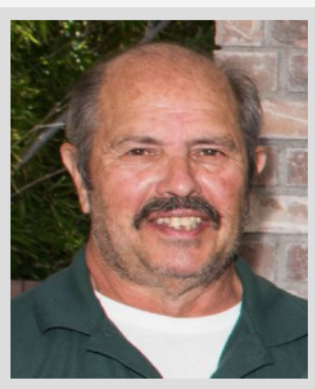
