For anyone not familiar with Mike's Knights biography, here follows the biography I asked of him: Michael served as State Deputy in Rhode Island for two consecutive terms, 2016-17 and 2017-18, and is most proud of the jurisdiction earning the coveted Circle of Honor Award for membership and insurance attainment, and for success of the 125th Anniversary held during the 2018 State Convention. Rhode Island is the Order's longest serving State Council.

"My first exposure to the Knights of Columbus was my Dad's membership in Council 500, Dayton, Ohio. As the oldest of ten, it was considered a treat to accompany him to the KofC Bowling League on Monday nights. "This excursion was an award reserved for best behavior by one or two of us from the prior week. For the longest time I thought the

Knights of Columbus was a bowling league. I've come to know that we are so much more!"

Michael began his own Knights of Columbus journey at Our Lady of Assumption Council #11077 in Fairfield, CT on September 2, 1998, before moving to North Kingstown later the same month and transferring to St. Francis Council #2011. There he served as Grand Knight during the 2000-01 and 2001-02 Columbian years, helping the council earn the Star Council Award.

During the 2001-02 campaign he also served as District Deputy, the first of what would be four consecutive terms. Following his final year as District Deputy, Michael served as Rhode Island State Council Co-Membership Directors during Arthur Sylvester's term as State Deputy. He was awarded the 2008 Knight of the Year.

Michael and his wife Lee Ann have been married for twentyseven years, and attend St. Bernard Parish in North Kingstown, where he serves as usher for the Saturday vigil Mass. Together they served as co-chairs for the Parish's successful Grateful For God's Providence fundraising campaign. "It's been my blessing to have Lee Ann working with me. I would not have been able to be so involved without her much needed love. insight, and guidance. Her support has made any success I have had possible, and I am forever grateful."

#### State Per Capita

As was mentioned at the August State Meeting, The State Board of Directors has elected to waive the State Per Capita for Fraternal Year 2020-2021. If there are any Councils still owe for previous years, you must still make payment for that/those year(s), But this year's suspension provides an opportunity to catch up.

Also, if your Council subscribes to the liability insurance program, there is NO suspension of that obligation. Another note on the insurance. COVID related issues interfered with the issuance of the Insurance bills from the State Council. Thus the bills recently received were the ones normally sent in February/March. Be advised, you will receive a bill this winter for next Calendar year. The one you may have just paid is for this calendar year. (ed. note: I will repeat this admonition come this winter).

Membership News

2019-2020 Rhode Island State Council Membership Incentive Program

This past January we announced an incentive program for all RI Councils in an effort to promote their membership outreach efforts and Council growth. Councils reaching targeted monthly goals thru to the end of the Columbian Year would be eligible for percentage reimbursements from 10 to 25 percent of their RI State Per-capita Assessments.

### From David Mitchell of **The Little Flower Home**:

What a year 2020 has been with a global pandemic impacting all of us. We saw churches and businesses shut down, and record numbers of people out of work. Imagine for a minute, you were facing an unexpected pregnancy, job

loss, and had no place to live. One of our recent guests was pregnant and living in a tent in Providence, before she learned about the Little Flower Home.

Despite all the challenges in 2020, the Little Flower Home has been home to 18 mothers and 20 of their children. A social worker asked one of our pregnant women how she was doing a week after arriving at the Little Flower Home. The guest said, "I feel safe and much better. It's the first time I have slept in a long time." She is now in a safe loving home, able to focus on her pregnancy, and get the support she needs to welcome her child into the world.

You are an essential part of our mission. Each October 1st, as we celebrate the Feast of the Little Flower, and the month of the Holy Rosary, we ask for your help:
