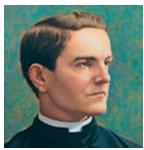
Pro-Life Month

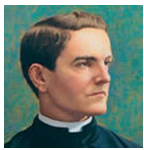

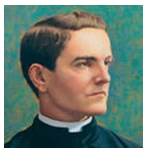

Several councils are still providing food for our neighbors who need it, as well as clothing drives and blood drives. Brother Knights are helping their pastors keep their churches disinfected during this pandemic. One of our Councils offered their hall for vaccinations.

We continue to welcome new brothers into the Order through online membership, and several councils are gaining new members through their community activities. There are Catholic men in the community that see what we are doing and want to help us by becoming brother Knights! 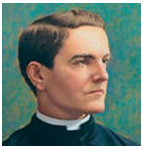
From the District Master

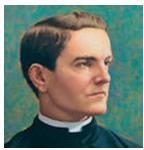

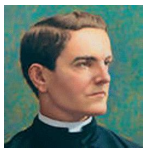
Milestone Celebration

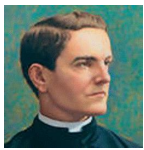

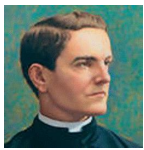

- * Largest truck delivery in the 7 year history - in COVID times
- * Even Santa got in on the action and spent Saturday with us
- * We had already delivered a carload of donations at Thanksgiving
- * East Providence Council 1528 was joined by Knights from 28 other Councils and 2 Assemblies state-wide with donations
- * Mayor Bob DaSilva attended, provided a significant donation, and by going viral on his Facebook page, influenced 6 other East Providence citizens to come by with donations of clothing and toiletries throughout the day
- * Supreme Knights of Columbus sent a documentary film crew to spend the weekend with us covering the event as it is one of the foremost patriotic (Veteran support) events in the U.S. for the

Knights. E. P. Council volunteers were interviewed and filmed as they went about their duties unloading cars, auditing every delivery to ensure that donations were of new clothing and toiletries, packing and organizing the donations, and finally loading the truck and unloading the delivery at the R.I Veteran's Home

- * State Deputy David Quinn, State Officers, State Directors, and Steve Perry were interviewed, mic'd up and filmed throughout the two days as part of the documentary process
- * East Providence Council had to make numerous changes in the structure of the annual event due to COVID safety regulations and the weather and STILL delivered our largest delivery in our 7 year relationship with the Veteran's Home

All who participated deserve the proverbial "pat on the back" for their efforts. And the best part is that this type of Charity is normal for us all.

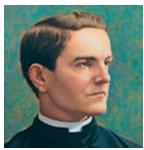

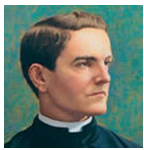

Always remember that the fight to protect life never ends. Whether it is end of life causes, treatment of the living in this world (social justice issues) or treatment of the not yet born.

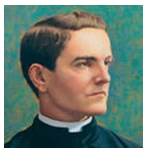

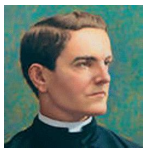
Toy Drives

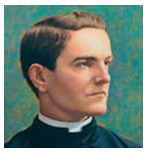
