We must always be vigilant when it comes to Life issues. Never be afraid to engage your local, State and National officials in a dialog of truth. While we

should always be respectful and civil in this dialog, we need not fear the truth regarding the sanctity of life.

We begin this month's Life articles with a response from Cardinal Dolan to a question posed by a politician. The response was carried in Catholic New York & disseminated on the internet, part of the Cardinal's statements follow below.

Recalling a conversation with a politician who asked him, "why are you Catholics so hung up about abortion," the Archbishop of New York explained in a Jan. 13 column at Catholic New York that "actually, we're obsessed with the dignity of the human person and the sacredness of all human life! Yes, the innocent, helpless life of the baby in the womb, but also the life of the death row prisoner, the immigrant, the fragile elderly, the poor and the sick."

"As a matter of fact," Cardinal Dolan says, "this is not a uniquely 'Catholic' issue at all, but one of human rights. We didn't learn that abortion was horrible in religion class, but in biology, and in our courses on the 'inalienable rights' tradition in American history."


"How can we sustain a culture that recoils at violence, exclusion, suicide, racism, injustice, and callousness toward those in need, if we applaud, allow, pay for, and promote the destruction of the most helpless, the baby in the womb?"

Cardinal Dolan also writes that "pro-abortionists reassured us forty-eight years ago" that abortion would be kept safe, legal, and rare. "So much for the reassurances! We have hardly gotten used to it. Abortion remains the hottest issue in our politics, with polls showing that most Americans want restrictions on its unquestioned

use, and do not want their taxes to pay for it."

Ash Wednesday, February 17<sup>th</sup>.
The Campaign runs daily through
March 28<sup>th</sup>. Please join the effort if



In a one word, WOW.

What a great way to get Brother Knights to talk about their role in the Catholic Church, their families and themselves in an open and friendly atmosphere. The videos are EXACTLY the right length and are interesting, inspiring and jam packed with great stories, quotes and call to battle - action items.

The ten Brothers we had on a Zoom meeting from the Fr. Donnelly Council for the past four weeks LOVED it. The videos, video series guide and Apostolic Exhortation by Bishop Thomas Olmstead was all I needed to

become comfortable with the material which helped me moderate the program. I created questions from the guidebook which we used to keep the discussion going. I kept it at no more than an hour so after opening prayer, the video and discussion time we were ready for a closing prayer. The time flew.

I have been a Knight since 2008 and I have always thought there was something missing from the Knights from a spiritual point of view. 


