Meet the new Supreme Knight



Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly

(ed. note – the following material was compiled from various sources, including Supreme emails & Catholic News Agency articles)

First, his background. Patrick E. Kelly joined the Knights of Columbus in 1983 as a university student in Wisconsin. He has a law degree from Marquette University Law School and a master's in theological studies from the John Paul II Institute for Studies on Marriage and the Family at The Catholic University of America. He spent over 20 years in the U.S. Navy, retiring as a Captain from the Judge Advocate General's Corps Reserve. He specialized in international

and operational law and was Commanding Officer of the international law unit at the Naval War College.

He has served as an advisor to the Department of Justice and to Congress, including work as the legislative counsel to the U.S. House of Representatives' Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence. He was a senior advisor to the Ambassador-At-Large for International Religious Freedom at the U.S. State Department. In that role, he was the State Department's principal interlocutor with the Holy See and other countries on issues of religious freedom. He also helped provide policy guidance on religious freedom in Iraq, Iran, and Israel, according to his biography at The Catholic University of America's Center for the Study of Statesmanship, where he has served on the Council of Advisors.

Kelly has over a decade of experience in senior positions with the Knights of Columbus' charity and advocacy work and in managing their multi-billion-dollar insurance and investment businesses, the organization said.

In 2006 Kelly was named vice president for public policy of the Knights of Columbus. He has been an executive director for the Saint John Paul II National Shrine in Washington, D.C., and he served as State Deputy of the District of Columbia from 2012-2013. In 2013 he was elected to the Knights of Columbus Board of Directors and in January 2017 he was elected Deputy Supreme Knight. In that position, he played a leading role in the Knights' international religious freedom efforts, its pro-life ultrasound initiative, and in developing the fraternal order's new public initiation ceremony.

Here are some of SK Kelly's thoughts on his new position:

"I am honored, thankful and blessed. I am honored to be called to serve as Supreme Knight," Kelly said Feb. 5. "I am thankful to my wife and family, and to my brother Knights for affording me this honor and privilege."

"I look forward to continuing Carl's great work and will strive to guide the Knights of Columbus by the principles of charity, unity and fraternity according to the vision of Blessed Michael

McGivney," Kelly said in his acceptance speech.

"These principles are as important today as they were almost 140 years ago at our founding," he said. "They are a proven path to deepen our Catholic faith, and build strong families, strong parishes, and strong communities that work together for the common good and recognize the dignity and worth of every human being. I ask for prayers as I endeavor to advance the great history and traditions of the Knights of Columbus in service to the Lord, his Church, our brother Knights and their families, our parishes and our communities."

And these comments from PSK Carl Anderson:

(Patrick) Kelly is "extraordinarily well-qualified."

"Patrick has dedicated his life in service to the Church, his country, and the Knights of Columbus," said Anderson. "He has served as Deputy Supreme Knight for four years and is a well-rounded public servant with diplomatic and military experience. He is ideally suited to carry on the work of the Knights of Columbus as we enter a new

era, faithful to our principles of charity, unity and fraternity, and in close collaboration with the Holy See and the bishops throughout the world."

"Most recently, Patrick led the Knights' grassroots response to the COVID-19 pandemic titled 'Leave No Neighbor Behind'," Anderson continued. "Through this initiative, brother Knights around the world are serving those isolated and alone in quarantine, supporting food banks and blood centers in need of vital supplies, and providing other essential services. Patrick has the experience and strong faith necessary to lead the Knights into the future."

Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William E. Lori of Baltimore, who has worked with Kelly for over a decade offers this comment:

"Patrick Kelly is a devoted husband, father of three young daughters, and a man of deep faith with many years of experience as a public servant," Lori said. "He possesses the knowledge, experience and commitment necessary to carry the Order forward in service to our brother Knights, their families, our parishes, and our communities."

Did you know?

- Our Founder has been elevated to Blessed Michael J. McGivney
- Cardinal Joseph Tobin of Newark beatified our founder as Blessed Michael J. McGivney on October 31, 2020 at St. Joseph Cathedral in Hartford, CT.
- ➤ It was fitting that this holy honor happened during a pandemic, as it was another pandemic that took Fr. McGivney's life two days before his 38th birthday in 1890.
- The miracle attributed to his beatification was the healing of an unborn child who had been diagnosed with Down Syndrome and Pediatric Hydrops Fetalis, an often-fatal fetal condition. Prayers for Fr. McGivney's intercession at Fatima and in the U.S. were answered with the delivery of Mikey Schlacle, whose parents named him after Fr. McGivney. Mikey, the 13th child of a Knights of Columbus General Agent and his wife was healed of the fatal condition, and though he has Down Syndrome, he is the light of their family. Given the Knights of Columbus mission to assist

children and their families with special needs this seems too good to be true, but it is! Also noteworthy, Fr. McGivney was the oldest of 13 children.

We have a new Supreme Knight

On February 5, the Knights of Columbus Board of Directors unanimously voted Deputy Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly to replace Supreme Knight Carl Anderson upon his retirement effective March 1, 2021.

Supreme Knight Anderson has led the Knights of Columbus to twenty consecutive years of increased membership, charitable giving, and life insurance in force. As the new Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly observed, Carl Anderson operated with a sense of urgency to improve the faith and lives of others.

The new Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly, a former career U.S. Navy Officer and third generation Knight, joined a college council as a student and has worked as Assistant Supreme Knight for the last fifteen years. He pledges to continue the momentum set by Carl Anderson to realize new heights for the Knights of Columbus:



Brothers,

We are continuing to Bring New Members in and I especially want to thank the additional councils who have come on board in the last month to bring our total to 25 Councils who are recruiting!!!

We have brought in 129 new members across the state and we are Ranked 21st in the Order.

Remember, getting members in and part of the council is important, so let's get the members involved and make them active.

We have some membership programs for the councils for the second half of this year:

Coordinating with St Luke's Parish, St. Brendan's Parish and Holy Angels parish, bulletin announcements were placed the weekend of February 6 & 7. The weekend of February 13 & 14 members of the Council attended all of the masses at the three churches to collect the gift cards. Christine Hennessy (of St. Luke's) worked with the students at the middle school to create greeting cards for the veterans to go with the gift cards. 250 gift cards totaling \$3750 were collected. The generosity of all the parishioners was astounding.






Ultrasound Initiative
