From the State Advocate

Brothers, Welcome to a new fraternal year. If you haven't heard yet, The Supreme Council has changed the requirements for the Safe Environment program. It is our responsibility to protect the children that attend our events, as well as protect ourselves from the potential liabilities associated from having children at our events. Praesidium's *Armatus Safe Environment* program

Volume 2, issue 2 accomplishes both these objectives. Supreme now requires the following members to be certified by this program. The following board members must be certified within 30 days of receiving their email from Praesidium. They are: Grand Knight; Program **Director**; Community Director and Family Director. There will be a background check done on both the community and family directors. I was notified that if the 30 days lapse, the Grand Knight will have to reappoint another member to fill that position. Taking this course is not voluntary and must be completed to fulfill your duties. Also, Non-compliance in following this policy will disqualify your council in receiving any awards. The course is in three parts and can be taken at your own pace. But must be completed within the 30

days allotted. The certification is good for 2 years, so if you have taken the course last year, you are all set, however if you have not taken the Armatus course, or have taken it prior to last year you need to be recertified. If you are certified with another organization, i.e. - Boy Scouts, Schools or through the Diocese, you still must complete this course. Non-Compliance can open us to being personally liable.
