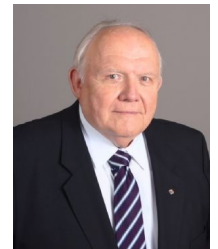

News from Supreme

Awards Criteria Adjustments

The Supreme Council has adjusted the criteria for earning of Supreme's annual recognition Awards. **This is a one-time change for the current year only.** Please note the adjustments below:

- **Columbian Award**
(Programs). Conduct 10 programs; At least 2 in each category of Faith, Family, Community and Life; At least 2 additional in any category; Specific programs are no longer required

- **McGivney Award**
(Membership). 40% reduction in quota
- **Founders Award**
(Insurance). 50% reduction in quota, or host a benefits seminar with field agent by June 30

Star Council Award.

- Achieve the revised Columbian, McGivney, and Founders awards.
- Payment of Supreme assessments and per capita are not required for this year
- All other Star Council requirements (reports, safe environment, etc.) remain in effect

The 990 Tax filing deadline has been extended (along with other Federal deadlines) to July 15th.

As a reminder, here are the filing options:

- Councils reporting gross receipts of \$50,000 or less may comply with their obligation by filing the Form 990-N electronic postcard (also known as the e-Postcard).
- Councils with total assets of less than \$500,000, and reporting gross receipts of more than \$50,000 but less than \$200,000, must file the Form 990-EZ.
- Councils with total assets of \$500,000 or more and reporting gross receipts of \$200,000 or more must file the Form 990.

the Leave No Neighbor Behind Program. Councils have started meal distribution programs, and weekly food and household supply collections. Councils have assisted in the production of the weekly on-line masses at their parishes. The State and a local council provided \$3000.00 in Stop & Shop gift cards when the Diocese reached out to the Knights to assist them in assisting families in need.

We have assisted the Little Sisters of the Poor at Jeanne Jugan Manor when they sought financial assistance to buy foodstuffs and were able to secure 1000 much needed disposable face masks through our Supreme Council. There is a need and we must continue to reach out and make every effort to ensure that it is met.

During this time, the business of the Order must go on, and our 127th Annual Convention was held on April 24th, albeit virtually.

Seventy –six delegates representing 38 councils participated by listening to the convention proceedings and voting on their phones. Under this revised format, supervised by Supreme, all presented resolutions were approved, as was the proposed budget. For those elected to a one year term effective July 1, 2020 see the lead article above.

My congratulations are extended to the newly elected RI State Council slate of officers!

We are still awaiting word on the status of this year's Supreme convention scheduled to take place in Washington, DC.

As a reminder, each council should have their nominating committees working to establish a slate of officers for the elections in June, as well as formulating a process to vote remotely. Councils are asked to seek advice from their

Brothers,

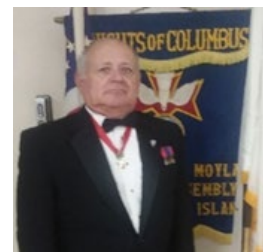

In case some of you did not see my email in regards to the SP7 form, Supreme has stated that if you had a program scheduled but had to cancel because of the restrictions that the state has implemented, you can put those items down in your respective category and get credit for them. Secondly, requirements for Membership and for Insurance have been reduced. Example here is if you had a quota of 10 for membership, they have reduced by 40% that means you would need 6 New Members, for insurance its reduced by 50% so if

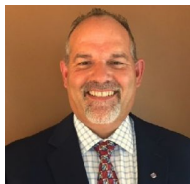
