

#### A CALL TO ACTION - KNIGHTHOOD

Rhode Island has long been referred to as "the most Catholic state" in the U.S. As people of the Catholic Faith, this is an accolade we have all been proud to accept. However Bishop Thomas J. Tobin, Ordinary of the Diocese of Providence recently released some startling statistics related to trends of practicing Catholics in Rhode Island.

In 2000, Rhode Island's Catholic parishes reported 525,000 parishioners. Today that number is

Volume 3, issue 5 321,000, a drop of nearly 40% over 18 years. It gets worse. The decline in Sunday Mass attendance has dropped 57%, from 188,000 to just 80,000 today. The annual number of Catholic weddings has declined from over 2,000 to just under 700 last year. Baby Baptisms and First Communions have each dropped from over 6,000 to less than half, and Confirmations have fallen from 4,800 to 2,900. Additionally the call to Vocations had dropped to record lows, with only 134 priests in active ministry, down from 216 in 2000. The diocese expects to ordain 13 new priests over the next six years, but in that time more than twice as many will attain the retirement age of 70 years old.

Bernard. It was a great class with a wonderful sense of spirituality from those being Confirmed. It was great to see Brother Knight Phil Reilly there as a Sponsor for his grandson. At 10:21 am on Oct 2nd, the RI Blood Center received a STAT (urgent) order from Hartford Hospital for blood products to help the survivors of the WWII B-17 plane crash at Bradley International Airport in Connecticut. The RIBC was able to help and quickly delivered 100 units of Type O red blood cells and units of fresh frozen plasma to help.

Gratefully, at the end of September, St John Paul II ran a blood drive and a number of units donated at the blood drive was sent to help those in need in Hartford. As you know, Tragedies like this cannot always be prevented, but only because of you, can we be ready when they do.
