Admission Degree this month! Our collective membership quota is 280. We enter June having realized 185 new members. We are just 95 new members short of achieving Circle of Honor status for the 4th year in a row. What an honor this would be during our 125th Year Anniversary as a State Council. This means we need just 2 new members per council this month, which is less than the average per most Admission

Degrees. We can easily accomplish this by having your council schedule an Admission Degree prior to June 30. If for whatever reason your council cannot schedule an Admission Degree, you should utilize Online Membership. If each council sends the note and link to 5 or more candidates, we will realize our goal. You can do this! We can do this! #Unity

Too often councils do not initially prioritize membership and find themselves scrambling to reach their membership goals because they have gotten off to a late start. Ideally a council is scheduling a minimum of one Admission Degree per quarter, or 4 times per year. The old
