The Vermont State Trophy will be presented to the council of the First Place Team. This is a rotating trophy. Other individual awards will be presented to the winners of the scratch and handicap events.

The prize fund will be determined by the number of participants.

Directions to Gold Crown Lanes

From 1-91: Get off the Route 5 north exit (#20) onto route 5 and stay on Route 5 north for 2 miles until you come to a second traffic light. Merge in left lane and take sharp left. The alleys are 1/10 mile on the left

From Burlington/Barre: from Route 2 west to Main St (St Johnsbury Academy) follow signs to Route 5 north. Before you get to Rte 5 you will see the lanes on your right.

Tournament Rules

- 2. The Tournament is open to all member's (Also Wives, Daughters.) (Sons must be under 18) in good standing of the Vermont District of the Knights of Columbus.
- 3. All Members participating in the tournament must be in possession of their current travel card, which will be checked at the tournament.
- 4. Handicap for both men and women will be 90% of the difference between the individual's average and 220. No maximum handicap.
- 5. Bowlers will use their highest 2014-2015 winter season average based on a minimum of 21 games.
- Bowlers with no 2014-2015 average will bowl scratch and the <u>handicap will be</u> calculated for each event bowled during the tournament. Handicaps are not carried over to each event. Only entering handicaps will be used for the entire tournament.
- 7. Ties for any position shall equally divide prize money for all positions in which they may be tied.
- 8. All lanes will be drawn and assigned by the Tournament Committee. Starting times will be assigned on a first come first served basis.
- 8. No entries will be accepted without the entry fee.
- 9. All prizes will be awarded based on handicap scores with the exception of the special scratch awards. Scratch scores will take precedent over handicap scores for prize money.

No individual can win more than one prize per event. In the event that an individual is tied for both high series and high single, high series will take precedence.
