Oklahoma is going to have its own version of Tepeyac Hill located at the Blessed Stanley Rother Shrine in OKC. Tepeyac Hill will feature two statues on it, one twelve foot high of Our Lady of Guadalupe and eight-foot-high statue of St Juan Diego on his knees facing Our Lady. Tepeyac Hill will bring many visitors to the Blessed Stanley Shrine to learn about Blessed Stanley.

Archbishop Coakley the idea of the two statues on top of the hill and asked if this is something the Knights of Columbus would embrace and work together to fund this project. Our Lady of Guadalupe is the foundress of the Americas.


# Father Caldwell once again Chaplain

Dear members of the Knights of Columbus, your family members, and people of God,

It is a great honor to be your State Chaplain

for the Knights! I am excited for what the future will bring, and hopeful that each day will be a tremendous opportunity to grow more in love with God through our prayer, thoughts, words, and deeds!

I want to reflect on two things: enthusiasm and service. First, I want to share a short story:

I shared this at the Organizational meeting and Installation of Officers in July. It is an important story to remind all of us that each one of us as a member of the Knights of Columbus here in Oklahoma can be one of the characters above. No one wants to be a Nobody, or an Anybody. We want to be Somebody and Everybody. What does this mean, especially in today's world? It means each of us contribute to the wellness and greatness of what the Knights of Columbus are: Men, and families, who love and serve the Lord first and foremost. In the eyes of the Lord, we are everybody and somebody whom the Lord loves unconditionally. It is the Lord we serve because we love him and see him in everybody.

This model of service is best observed when we avail our hearts to listen to the Holy Spirit as He asks us to serve others every day. The challenge lies in our willingness to serve without cost: fame, fortune, recognition, and even awareness. The world says we deserve our fifteen minutes of fame. The Lord says we must serve with humility and love, the grace and gifts God gives us each day as we serve our fellow brothers and sisters in Christ. This means that all of us must lean on the Holy Spirit and respond with a "yes" when we are asked to assist others in revealing the presence of God while serving others: The Knights of Columbus, our families, friends, and neighbors. # ASAP program helps maternity homes

In early June, Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly announced the ASAP (Aid and Support After Pregnancy) program, a new Orderwide initiative to strengthen K of C assistance for pregnancy resource centers and maternity homes.

Over the past two decades, such organizations have grown substantially in both number and in the services they provide, and Knights of Columbus councils are already strong allies with many of the more than 2,000 pregnancy resource centers in the United States. In addition to placing ultrasound machines in pregnancy resource centers through the Ultrasound Initiative — more than 1,550 since the flagship program launched in 2009 — Knights served more than 1.7 million volunteer hours and gave over \$18 million in funds and supplies to pregnancy centers and maternity homes from 2018 to 2021.

The new ASAP program, scheduled to launch July 1, will build on that support: For every \$500 that a council donates to a qualified pregnancy resource center or maternity home — up to \$2,000 in the 2022-23 fraternal year — the Supreme Council will add \$100, a 20% increase.

The announcement came as citizens and law-makers awaited the U.S. Supreme Court ruling in Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization. If Roe v. Wade, the 1973 Supreme Court

decision that legalized abortion throughout the country, were to be overturned by Dobbs, "pregnancy resource centers will take center stage in the struggle for life," Supreme Knight Kelly said June 10, addressing the Organizational Meeting of State Deputies.

"Repeal of Roe won't be the end of abortion in America," the supreme knight said. "But it might be the beginning of the end. ... In a post-Roe world, we need to be there for mothers and children. They will need our help more than ever—so let's make the ASAP program a top priority."

Here are just a handful of recent examples of how local councils have been working with pregnancy resource centers and maternity homes to serve women and their children before and after birth.

The need for diapers is a constant at Hands of Mercy Everywhere (H.O.M.E.), a residence for pregnant and parenting teens and their children in Belleview, Fla. So are the biannual diaper deliveries from Our Lady of Mount Carmel Council 13300 in nearby Wildwood, which has collected diapers and other baby supplies for H.O.M.E. since 2010.

Donations to the council drive have increased substantially in the last three years, said program

director Mike Grindel, partly because the Knights began collecting in person after Masses at St. Vincent de Paul Parish instead of using a drop box. In 2021-2022, the council brought in about \$23,000 in supplies, as well as \$9,000 in monetary donations.

Helping with the spring delivery April 28, Grand Knight Bill Wirtz said that he appreciates the chance to glimpse the impact of the council's work: to meet some of the mothers who live in the big, homey residence; to see the toddlers who will wear those diapers playing in the yard. At the same time, he is happy to do whatever is needed behind the scenes.

"A lot of our guys are veterans, and military guys always talk about the pointy end of the spear," Wirtz said. "That's where H.O.M.E. is. They're at the front line. Sometimes Knights are out there on the point, and sometimes we're way back in support. But you need the whole thing — so anything we can do, we do."

The young mothers giving birth and raising children in difficult circumstances are the ones who deserve recognition, he added: "The fact that these women have chosen life when they could have gone another direction speaks volumes. So our support of that effort really is where we're at."







### at the BLESSED STANLEY ROTHER SHRINE

# Safe Haven Box noted

A safe haven box is where a mother can place an unwanted newborn baby and no questions asked and no prosecution. The Knights of Columbus is working with Catholic Charities to place the first box in Oklahoma.

We need to raise \$5,000 to fulfill our target of \$6,000. This box will be installed at a hospital where the staff is being trained how to handle a baby that is placed in the box.
