Ceremonials

- ◆ Coordinates installation of council officers with district deputy.
- ◆ Schedules and publicizes frequent First Degrees.
- ◆ Confers with district deputy for Second and Third Degrees.
- ◆ Arranges Mass for departed brothers.
- ◆ Awards certificates, cards and pins during “Honorary Membership” and “Honorary Life Membership” ceremonials.
- ◆ Maintains proper conduct of ceremonials at regular meetings.

Duties

- ◆ Appoints a council chaplain.
- ◆ Appoints a membership director to organize and implement the council’s recruitment, retention and insurance promotion action plans.
- ◆ Appoints Program Director to organize and implement the council’s service programs.
- ◆ Appoints standing committees.
- ◆ Schedules and presides at council officers’ meetings.
- ◆ Regularly monitors the council’s performance toward achieving its membership, insurance and Service Program goals and awards.
- ◆ Appoints admission committee and makes sure it functions properly.
- ◆ Recognizes honorary and honorary life members.
- ◆ Recognizes past grand knights, “Knight of the Year,” community leaders, etc.

Has your Council made a donation to PKD (Penny a Knight a Day), Respect Life or the Special Olympics?

- ◆ Conducts semi-annual council audit with trustees in January and July.
- ◆ Ensures forms, i.e., election of officers, appointments, awards, Fraternal Survey, etc., are completed by appropriate council officials and forwarded to the Supreme Council.
- ◆ Organizes and/or supervises First Degree team. Schedules and announces degree dates.
- ◆ Arranges for council representation at wakes and memorial services for deceased brothers.
- ◆ Arranges for “Resolution of Condolence” for family of deceased.
- ◆ Oversees preparation of annual reports from all officers and standing committees for council files and incoming officers.
- ◆ Obtains and acquaints the booklet, “How to Conduct a Meeting — Parliamentary Procedure.”
- ◆ Starts all Council Meetings on Time.

We're heading down to the wire as we wrap up our 2018-19 Fraternal Year and prepare to begin 2019-20. A lot to be done:

1) Do those final Church Drives or other recruiting efforts to help get the state to the Circle of Honor (1 new member per Council across the state) as well as to earn those McGivney, Founders, Star and Wisconsin Outstanding Council Awards. Be sure to work with your Field Agents/General Agent to get your needed insurance members arranged also.

2) If you have your Child Safety Requirements done for 2018-19, great! If not, start now to work to get those done soon so you're ready to be successful in 2019-20. Double check your status in July-September so you're sure that all your required guys (Grand Knight, Program Director, Family Director and Community Director) are OK for 2019-20.

3) Wrap up your Faith in Action and other parish-based programs for 2018-19. Document them and file all the necessary program-specific or Fraternal Program report forms with Supreme and the State Forms address soon. Be sure that you have those 4 required Faith in Action programs done for this year.

4) Fill out your Columbian Award form and file it well before the June 28 deadline! Even if you are not able to earn the award for this year because you fell short on the number of programs you did, missed some of the required programs, or fell short on the Child Safety requirements, still fill out and submit the form as it will be great practice for doing better in 2019-20. Remember to file it with Supreme, the State Forms address and your DD.

5) Work with your DD and fill out your Wisconsin Outstanding Council application form. File it with the State Forms address and your DD by July 1. You can also send a copy to me if you wish. I badly need this information if I am to be able to determine this year's winners of this highest State honor a Council can earn!

6) Be sure to file your 185, 365, Summer Audit, Roundtable Annual Reports (2630) and Roundtable Coordinator Report (2629) for next year as soon as you possibly can. If your Council missed any of these or the Fraternal Survey, you can still get those in for 2018-19. Remember that the 185 and 365 are crucial to having your Child Safety requirements completed/registered proper-

7) Check to see if your Financial Secretary has sent in your PKD and Culture of Life contributions for 2018-19 yet. If not, they need to be in by June 30! If you're not sure what you sent in so far, check with the State Office or Dan Miller for the CoL Fund.

8) Finally, set yourself up for success in 2019-20. Meet with your pastor and parish leadership team now to determine programs and priorities for 2019-20 as well as assess your 2018-19 Fraternal Year. Do the same with your Officers and Directors; set your program (Faith in Action) and membership efforts for the Fraternal Year now. Order necessary materials. Arrange sites, dates, details for your Punt, Pass, Kick; Soccer; Citizenship and Culture of Life Essay, Christmas Poster Contests now. Get your younger members involved in leadership, with new ideas and programs!

If I can be of any help to you, feel free to contact me at any time. I'd sure be happy to come to your Council/Officers meeting if I can offer assistance/direction.

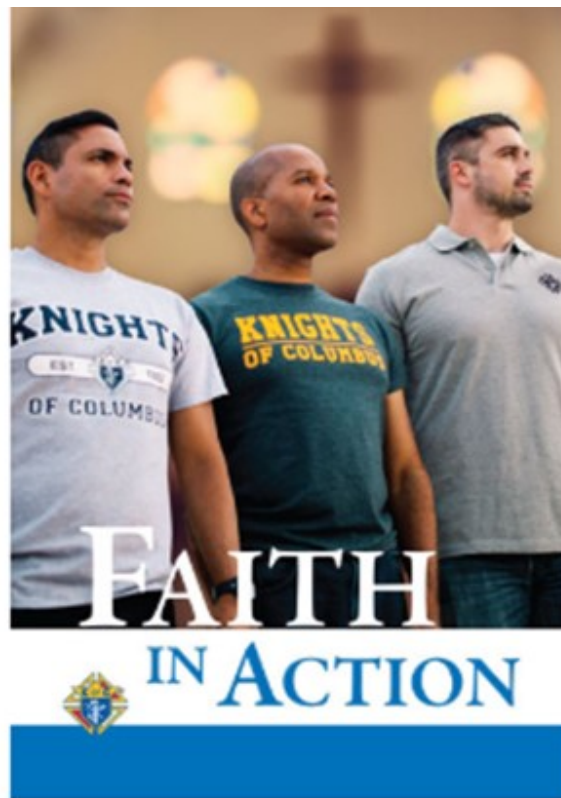

Our district participation **decreased** by 3 from last month to 32 putting us at 51.6% participation.

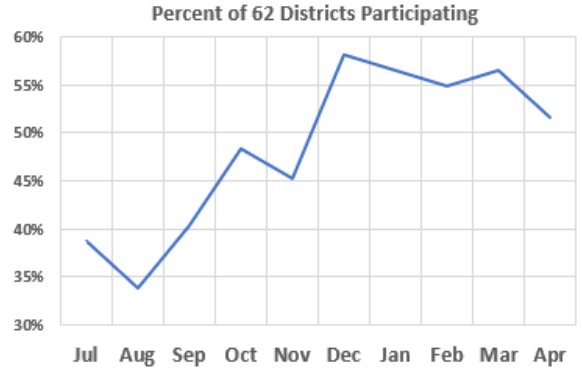
62 Total Districts

Supreme Standing

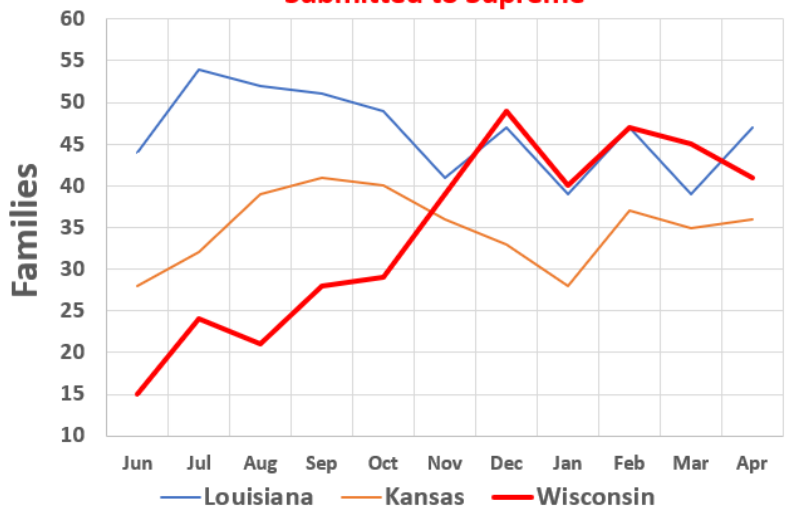

The Roses are presented to Our Lady on her feast day, 12 Dec, at the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe, Monterrey, Mexico. We have the Rose for three weeks, one less than the previous couple years.

Thank you to all of the Councils and Districts who volunteered to host the Silver Rose. We could not use all of the Councils that volunteered, but we did meet our goal of covering the whole State and minimizing the travel distances.

Hosting the Silver Rose does not mean that it is a Council function. The Council represents all of the Councils and parishes in it's surrounding area. If you are in the surrounding area, contact the host Council and make the service a true outreach to bring Mary to the people. On any one given day, the number of services is NOT limited to one. We have warm evenings with long hours of sunshine, hopefully without ice or snow. Some Councils have even had a run (walk) between the

sites. Posters and announcements will be available to help communicate this great opportunity to link with our Lady of Guadalupe, the patroness of the Americas.

What is the Silver Rose Run?

In December 1531 the Blessed Virgin appeared to Juan Diego at Tepeyac Hill. She directed him to visit the Bishop and ask that a temple be built at the foot of the hill. The Bishop did not believe his story. A second time after another visit by Mary, the Bishop needed a sign. After a cure of Juan's uncle, he was directed to gather roses not native to the area at the frozen garden at the top of the hill. Mary arranged them in his tilma (cloak). When Juan returned to the Bishop and opened his cloak the roses fell to the floor, revealing a portrait of Mary on his coarse fabric cloak. The Bishop built the temple. Within ten years, millions were converted to Catholicism. Over the centuries with civil war, persecution and efforts by the government to destroy the cloak, the Blessed Virgin has been instrumental in the history of Mexico. The cloak remains today in Mexico City.



The Knights of Columbus Columbian Squires in Monterrey wanted to honor Mary and invited other Squires from Mexico, United States and Canada to participate. In 1960 a real rose originated in London, Ontario, and after a mixed trip arrived at the International Bridge in Laredo where Squires ran it to the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Monterrey Mexico. Because the rose could not be used again, a bronze rose was made, but the Squires of Circle 660 in Monterrey wanted a Silver Rose. Brother Miguel Montoya made the Silver Rose for the 1961 run and continued to make the Roses for the annual run up to 1997. In the 1990s, the Running of the Silver Rose became a Supreme Knight's program and expanded to three Roses on three different routes from Canada, through the United States to the Bridge in Laredo and to Monterrey for presentation on the feast day 12 December. In 2014 the Knights expanded to six Roses with Wisconsin Knights participating for the first time as part of Route 3. Wisconsin has the Rose for three weeks, covering the entire State with over 1500 miles and over 21 Rose prayer services to honor Mary.

Route 3 of the Rose covers the central area of the United State, through 11 locals as shown below.

Mexico. Since then the Roses
have been made of silver. We
are again into the running of
the Silver Roses with six
Roses, asking Mary to accept
our thanks and to intercede for our petitions. Our Rose
started in Manitoba in March and will be presented to her at
the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe on her feast day, 12
December in Monterrey, Mexico. The Rose will pass
