Three of the four councils that were at 100% when this article was written last month have not made a move, but the 4th, Council 16444 in La Crosse led by Grand Knight Doug Reinhart and District Deputy Bill Jaekel have broken into the lead at 150%.

I could give you the next 9 councils that are at 50% or better but what's the point? Clintonville started the month at ZERO! Man, those church drives! You might say they were our September surprise. Who is going to be our October surprise?

Here we go again! As we started September 13 councils were in double digits. Then, out of nowhere came District 3. State Program Director - From the Desk of the Professor

Brother Knights,

It was great to see so many of you at the recent Diocesan Meetings. I was energized by the enthusiastic response I found to my presentation on this new major initiative from Supreme, "Building the Domestic Church (The Family Fully Alive)" that we are all called to develop in our parishes and Councils! I hope that you are well underway in your planning for and implementation of this initiative and the programs that are a significant portion of it. Again these involve:

- * Father's Day Affirmation of Wedding Vows (June),
- * Consecration of the Holy Family (Feast of the Holy Family),
- * Journey to the Inn (Posada-Advent),
- * Family Fully Alive (brown booklets from Supreme)-monthly family activities,
- * 5th Sunday Rosary (Corporate Communions can be included),
- * Into the Breach (blue booklet from Supreme)-8 week men's Spiritual Formation study program
- * Monthly Hour of Adoration (Diocesan or local)
- * Food for Families
- * Keep Christ in Christmas
- * Family Week programs (August)

Others will be added in the months ahead. Determine your pastor's and/or parish's priorities. Work with them to establish and carry out those programs that fit with and meet present needs. Remember our #1 goal – to be the strong right arm of the pastor and to see the needs and priorities of our pastors and parishes as most important! Our programs then can be run where they fit the best. Green Bay Diocese has set the bar high with 100,000 Family Fully Alive books ordered for their parishes. The rest of us need to match or exceed that effort! Note that my entire presentation on this topic and resources for it is on the State website!

Remember also that the Columbian Award for 2016-17 is being adjusted to require that at least 4 programs will have to be operated, listed/noted as "Domestic Church Initiative" programs in order to earn the award. So, start to plan accordingly.



In October, you should be wrapping up your PPK/Soccer contests and operating the Culture of Life Essay Contest, as well as your Church Drives, Orderwide Charitable Service Week projects, Lifesavers for Life, and 5th Sunday Rosary/Corporate Communions. As we head into November, plans should be progressing for your Christmas Poster Contests, Sentiments for Seminarians Drive, Council Charitable Outreach Day project (Nov. 25), etc. You should be ordering your Free Throw Contest kits, Coats for Kids, Keep Christ in Christmas yard signs and magnets, Substance Abuse Poster or Citizenship Essay kits, etc. Of course, there are also your local, parish and Council programs to plan for as well as year around programs to continue on.

Let me, finally, remind you that the State PPK/Soccer competition will be held on Saturday, October 29 at De Pere High School, 10-11 AM registration and practice, 11:15 competition. All are welcome to come and watch or to help out. Also, I have received a ruling from the WIAA that now allows all 14-year-olds to participate in the Soccer or Free Throw Contests without any possible repercussions for their eligibility as JV or Varsity athletes. The ruling wording is on the State website.

'ID GRANT APPLICATIONS ARE DUE!'

Gentlemen please help groups in your area to apply for the Wisconsin Intellectual Disabilities Grants. Your council cannot be the applicant but you are encouraged to assist groups in applying for the grant.

The Wisconsin State Council Knights of Columbus has released the final figures of their recent Tootsie Roll Drive to "Helping People with Intellectual Disabilities". The 2016 program raised \$714,318. Local councils have distributed in their immediate area \$490,283 of these funds to local groups and organization that assist the intellectually disabled. The State Committee has available an additional \$145,570 to distribute through their grant application process.

Organizations that work with People with Intellectual Disabilities are encouraged to submit applications for these funds to the Wisconsin State Knights of Columbus. Grant applications can be directed to: Wisconsin State Council Knights of Columbus c/o Mark Jelinek, State Director, 120

North Park Street, Richland Center, WI 53581. Fifteen (15) copies of the application are necessary and must be submitted by November 15, 2016. Applications must be written on your organizations letterhead and must contain the following information:

- Who do you serve? How many people you serve will be impacted by the grant.
- How much money you are seeking, and what the funds will purchase or provide.

All groups who apply will be notified in mid-January with the decision of the Wisconsin Knights of Columbus, Helping People with Intellectual Disabilities Committee.

AS THE ELECTION NEARS, THE KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS IS URGING ITS MEMBERS AND OTHER CATHOLIC AMERICANS TO PRAY

10/19/2016

The prayer will be in the form of a novena — nine consecutive days of prayer — and will run from Oct. 30 to the eve of the election on Nov. 7.

The prayer is addressed to the Holy Trinity through the intercession of Mary, the Mother of Jesus, under her title of the Immaculate Conception.

Individuals, families, councils and parishes are all invited to participate.

"The Church teaches that Catholics are called to form their consciences based on Church teaching and vote in accordance with that well-formed conscience," said Supreme Knight Carl Anderson. He added:

"Pope Francis has said in reference to the U.S. election that we should 'study the proposals well, pray and choose with your conscience,' and this novena is designed to help Catholic Americans do that."

The text of the novena reads:

Most Holy Trinity: Our Father in Heaven, who chose Mary as the fairest of your daughters; Holy Spirit, who chose Mary as your Spouse; God the Son, who chose Mary as your Mother, in union with Mary we adore your majesty and acknowledge your supreme, eternal dominion and authority.

Most Holy Trinity, we put the United States of America into the hands of Mary Immaculate in order that she may present the country to you. Through her we wish to thank you for the great resources of this land and for the freedom which has been its heritage.

Through the intercession of Mary, have mercy on the Catholic Church in America. Grant us peace. Have mercy on our president and on all the officers of our government. Grant us a fruitful economy, born of justice and charity. Have mercy on capital and industry and

labor. Protect the family life of the nation. Guard the precious gift of many religious vocations. Through the intercession of our Mother, have mercy on the sick, the tempted, sinners – on all who are in need.

Mary, Immaculate Virgin, our Mother, Patroness of our land, we praise you and honor you and give ourselves to you. Protect us from every harm. Pray for us, that acting always according to your will and the will of your divine Son, we may live and die pleasing to God. Amen.
