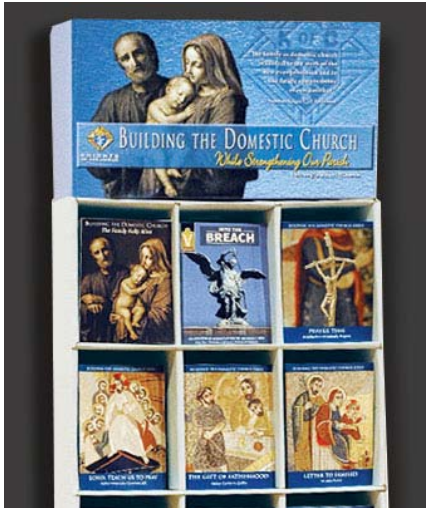

There are reports that nearly 14 million Catholics have left the faith and that sacramental Catholic marriages have dropped by 41 percent since the year 2000. These factors, and the many others which have contributed to the growing spiritual battle within the Church, caused Phoenix Bishop Thomas Olmsted to publish his apostolic exhortation Into the Breach.

To help this letter reach a wider audience, the Supreme Council has partnered with Bishop Olmsted to release an Into the Breach reflection guide.

A new feature of the Catholic Information Service's Veritas Series, this guide can help every council promote a discussion of masculinity and courage among the men of their parish.

Studying Into the Breach provides an opportunity to open wide our council doors and invite more of our fellow parishioners to join the Knights of Columbus in strengthening Catholic men and families.

Studying and discussing Into the Breach (#340) would be ideal during the Lenten and Easter seasons. The booklet can easily be divided and read over the course of several weeks. Talk with your pastor about holding a weeknight or Saturday morning men's discussion group, perhaps following a previously scheduled Mass or Holy Hour. Be sure to make plans for some refreshments and allow time for men of your parish to socialize.

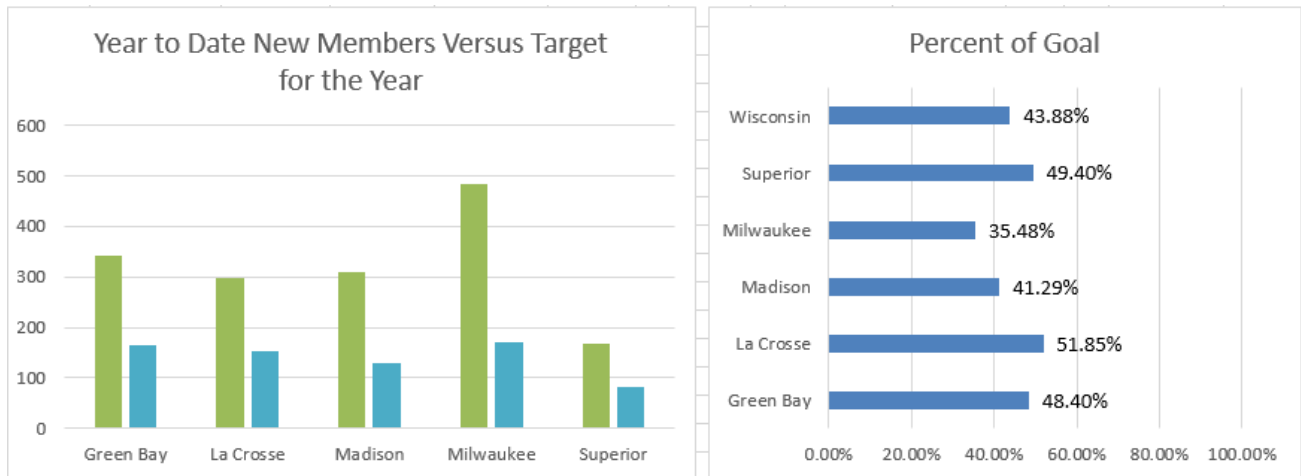

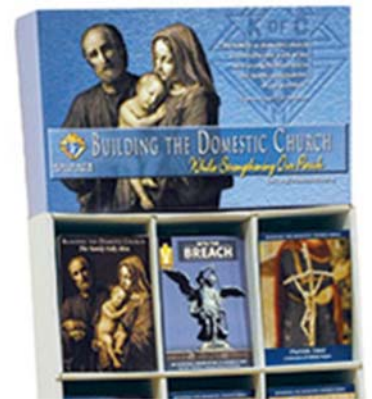
Council Membership Awards Domestic Church Council Incentive

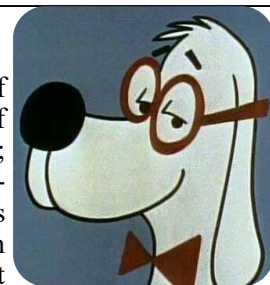

A few days from this writing will be the State Knowledge and Free Throw Contests in Wisconsin Rapids. I hope that all of your local, district, and Diocesan contests have gone well. Many thanks to Randy DeMars, Ron Shymanski, Duane Spinler and their teams of volunteers who did a super job at Assumption High School on March 11 as well as the competitors and their parents!

Here in March, top priority should be organizing and completing those Order-wide Church Drives (March 11-19) with their associated Admission Degrees (March 20-27) and Order-wide Charitable Outreach Projects to be carried out by your Council (March 27-April 2) in honor of Fr. McGivney and "Founders Day," March 29 - the Birthday of our Honored Order! Be sure, also, to have a parish/Council program to observe the annual KC Day for the Unborn (March 25).

Now is also the time to be starting to look at officers for 2017-18, including Directors and other appointed positions. Elections are in May-June.

The other night I participated in a conference call with Supreme regarding Ceremonials. The theme I would like to take from that meeting and give to you is the need for teams. The goal from Supreme is . . .

Admission Degree Teams One in every Council

Formation Degree Teams One in every District

Knighthood Degree Teams We need more Teams

In the Admission Degree we are able to use the DVD from Supreme. The current numbers from Supreme indicate that 25% of our new members are initiated into the Order via the DVD.

I did witness the Admission Degree DVD for the first time on February 21st. Being a proud member of several Degree teams I had boycotted the viewing of the DVD. Being your State Ceremonial Director, I thought that I should stop being so stubborn and view it. To be honest, I was very satisfied with the DVD. In a future newsletter I

will review my suggestions regarding the DVD and the members presenting the Degree.

Currently we have just over 25 active 2nd Degree teams in the State, but over 60 districts. So we are in need of more teams. In my home District (10), we share the 2nd Degree team with District 9. So in some cases these teams can cover more than one District. Teams should not be traveling large distances for conferring Degrees.

The number of potential suspensions appearing on the supreme conservation list continues to grow. The age of the Knights on this list is all ages, however the age group from mid 40s to mid 60s stands out. I’m sure there are many reasons, like I’m too busy, I have lost interest, don’t have the time or I have moved out of the area. These reason can all be answered independently. If a Knight has moved out area suggest he check for a new council near him. District 90 DD Paul Mathias asks Knights that are too busy if they would pray for their council. He reports they always agree to. This is powerful and the right thing to do for all the right reasons.

One contributing factor to Knights losing interest in their council is that they do not feel they are not needed or valued. We must be vigilant in keeping all members engaged in all council functions. I know it is comfortable to use the same members to do the same things that they have always done, however we must seek out those that are not coming to meetings or assisting with projects. If this happens to the younger members they will be at risk of withdrawal. Same goes for the more senior

members. These men have lots of experience in many areas. All members, especially the newer and the senior members need to be challenged.

If there are any councils that do not have a working retention committee on board I strongly suggest you appoint one ASAP.

We all have the same Mother, Mary, Mother of Jesus. Knights of Columbus are Brothers in s Christ. If our blood brother was in danger of withdrawing from our family we would do all we can to save them. Can we do less for our Brother Knights? We all took an oath of Charity, Unity, and Fraternity. If we practice these precepts effectively we will achieve our objective of 100% retention of all Knights in crisis.

Thank you for all you do for your Church and Councils. We all make a difference and collectively we make a world of difference.

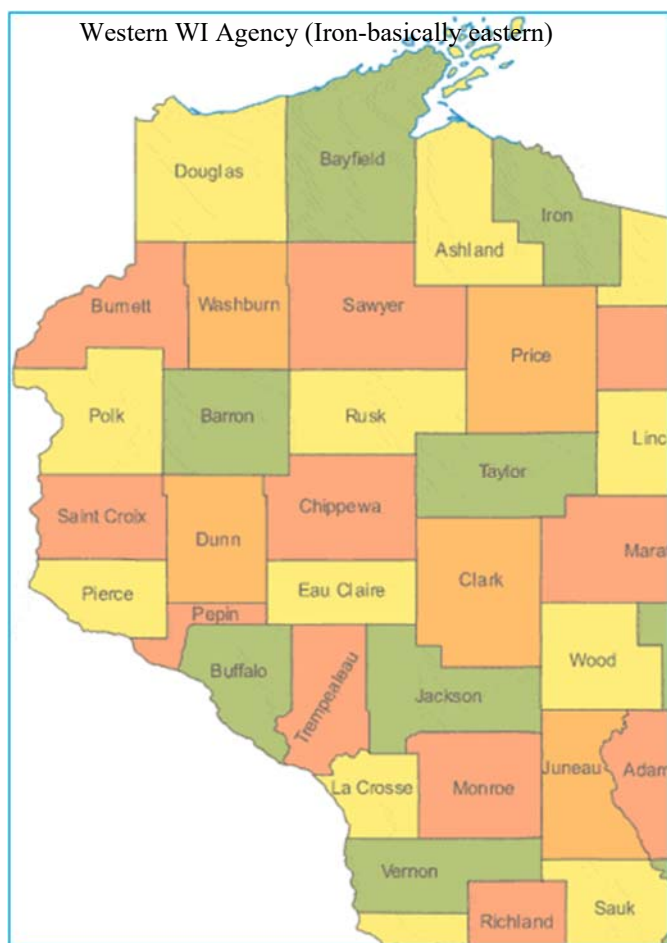

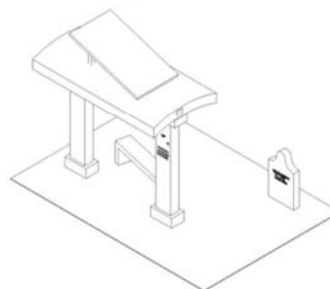

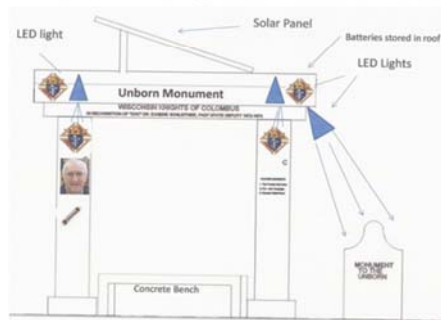

3D rendering of Unborn Monument



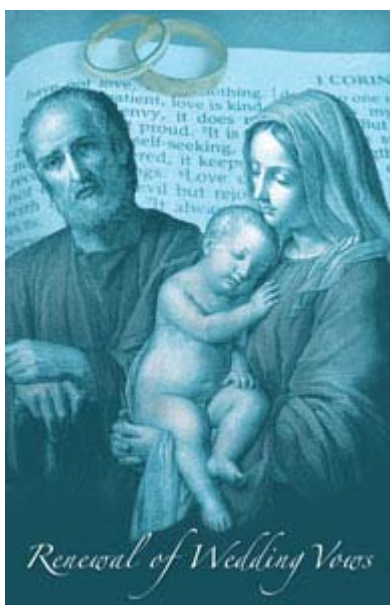
Site for the Unborn Monument in Honor of "Doc" Dr. Eugene Sonnleitner

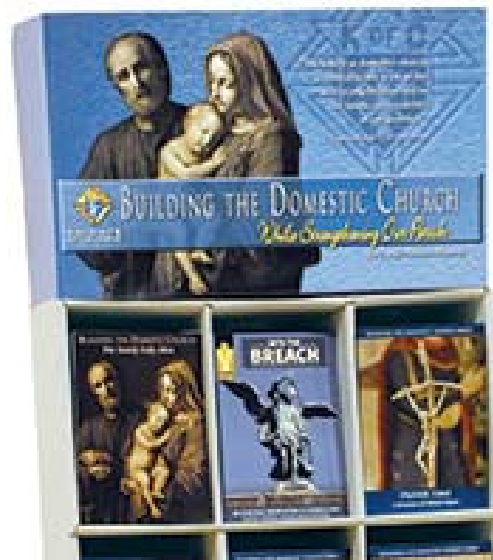
