

State Disaster Relief Program

The State **D**isaster **R**elief **P**rogram team is at the threshold of rolling out the State K of C Disaster Relief Program (DRP) Our anticipated date of delivery for this important initiative is by the end of April (When the gradients change, and storms start to roll over our state). We are currently on target for that date.

We are presently scheduling meetings with two to three councils per week throughout the entire state with an aggressive agenda and high expectations that our team can map our emergency resources from council-to-council before the end of April, (Weather Permitting). Listed below this message is the initial list of next week's council visits.

It is vital that each council DRP volunteer group is on board with training, meta-data programming, reporting/usage and the program requirements at each council before the end of April. It's an all-out blitz for our team of eight, and we are slated to begin this activity on Feb 19.

Paul Shepherd and I will be visiting most of the Madison area councils together - shortly. We are asking that all District Deputies send this message to all of their respective councils as soon as possible. The reason for the council-level meetings is to review our roadmap, logistics guide, disaster on-site accountabilities,

financial guide, program guidelines and council level SOPs in addition to the other essential initiatives mentioned earlier in this message.

Our DRP team will set appointments with Grand Knights to inform them of our intent to visit their respective councils as we calendar the times and dates which should give them plenty of notice before their monthly council meetings.

Additionally, we encourage any of our DDs and state representatives to join our DRP team meetings to learn more about the program and to remain engaged with our results and progress. We are looking for this plan to become a path for significant membership (excellent path for the younger and we definitely welcome the seasoned), and we will be sharing that message with each council as well.

- 3) March 12-18 is Order-wide Outreach Week in honor of Fr. McGivney. Again, every Council should be planning and carrying out a Charitable Outreach Program this month be it a Charity Raffle Ticket push, Food for Families, 40 Cans for lent, a finla Special

Olympics donation drive, starting a new Faith Formation program, having a major Pro-Life rosary or prayer service or rally, etc. We usually do this on or around Founder's Day (March 29) and the Annunciation (KC Prayer for the Unborn - March 25). But, this year with Holy Thursday on March 29 and March 25 being Palm Sunday, the calendar's been adjusted so we hope you'll be able to adapt as well.

I hope that with April right around the corner that your ID Drive plans are well along. Your reservations and paperwork for the State Convention should be in also. Now is the time to ramp up your preparations to finish those final programs needed to earn your Star and Wisconsin Outstanding Council Awards. What You Need to Know about Online Membership

Background

At its meeting in April 2017, the Board of Directors, pursuant to Section 4 of the Charter of the Knights of Columbus, and Sections 9 and 37 of the Constitution and Laws, voted to allow men to be initiated into the Knights of Columbus by completing an online application and ceremonial. These men would then be Associate Members under the jurisdiction of the State Council of the state in which they reside.

At its meeting in June 2017, the Board of Directors, pursuant to Section 4 of the Charter of the Knights of Columbus, and Sections 9 and 37 of the Constitution and Laws, voted to establish an online ceremonial by which candidates for membership are initiated into the Order as Associate Members, without having to take the First Degree. The Board further voted to establish a state division under the jurisdiction of each state council of the Knights of Columbus. These divisions shall be composed of members who are initiated into the Order as Associate Members through the online ceremonial and who reside within each respective state council's jurisdiction.

The online membership initiative required two relatively minor changes to the Laws of the Knights of Columbus, which were accomplished by means of resolutions passed by the Board of Directors at its meeting in July 2017, and submitted to the Supreme Council. On August 3, 2017, the Supreme Council adopted the two resolutions: (1) Resolution 349, amending Section 120, permitting men who have entered the Order through the online initiation to purchase insurance, even though they have not taken the First Degree; and (2) Resolution 350, amending Section 240, authorizing the Supreme Secretary to issue membership cards to men who have entered the Order through the online initiation.

By virtue of the actions set forth above, every state council is now authorized to accept members through the online membership initiative, with no need to amend the state council by-laws. The Supreme Council office will administer the state divisions, including the collection of dues and the issuance of membership cards.

The online membership initiative is currently being piloted in a number of jurisdictions.

Rights and Privileges

Men who join the Order through the online membership initiative do not form a new class or type of member. Therefore, as members of the Knights of Columbus they are entitled to the rights and privileges of membership, which include:

- right to attend local, state, and Supreme Council events
- eligibility to attend local council meetings as nonvoting participants
- right to receive fraternal benefits
- eligibility to purchase Knights of Columbus financial products and services

receipt of *Columbia* magazine and other Supreme Council publications

Attendance at Meetings

Men who join the Order online are permitted to attend local council business meetings, but may not vote unless they become members of that council. The *Guidelines for Conducting a Council Meeting* will be amended after the online membership pilot has concluded. In the interim, all states currently in the online membership pilot can waive the part of the *Guidelines* that reads "in the first section."

Wisconsin K of C State Charity Raffle If your council has given money or held a benefit to raise funds for a person or family in need recently, you should consider filling out a **Charity Request Form** which you can find on the state web site. Interview the person, fill out the form yourself as you ask the questions (don't allow them to fill it out), have the Grand Knight sign it, and send it into the state office. It is common to ask for \$1000 to \$3000.

Thank you again for running the State Charity Raffle! Every year, it is a great success for the raffle winners, the councils which earn money that they can give to charitable causes, and for those who are the State grant recipients each year! If after making application you find that you cannot host the event for any reason you must contact the State Bowling Committee Secretary prior to the spring meeting.

- * Dates should run from early February through April.
- * Note: Bowling shall run continuous weeks except during the EASTER Triduum.
- * Accommodations must be available nearby that match the number of bowlers and guests each weekend.
- * Councils may team up with another council for joint bids
- * The number of volunteers needed to have a successful tournament is substantial.
- * Your clubrooms should be available Friday, Saturday and Sunday each weekend of the tournament.
- * There is no bowling scheduled to begin later than 3:00 p.m.
