Desk of the State Deputy

You've done well, now do Good!

The means to an end. Does the means matter? I am Thankful for extraordinary men. Being in the position of leadership in the Knights of Columbus is an interesting vantage point from which to judge my brother Knights. I see men devoted to Church, Family, Fraternity and Careers. There are other devotions, desires and motivations that drive men's actions but when it comes to the Knights of Columbus we center on Faith, Family and Fraternity in that specific order. Getting priorities wrong creates disorder in all facets of our lives and the lives of those who depend upon us. It becomes really quite simple if we just ask the question, "What would Jesus do?" We want others to be Christ like so we don't have to pick up our cross. Somebody else should, but really how hard is it to do the right thing ourselves. Being a Knight gives us the opportunity to be part of a greater good that we cannot accomplish alone. Acting out as Christ would is always the right thing but rarely the easy thing if our priority is disordered. Perpetuating the Knights of Columbus or any of its incarnations can only be good or right if it is in service to Church. Church is "The Church" the Bride of Christ in the full truth understood by the Roman Catholic Church. Church, Faith and Religion are undifferentiated terms, the same thing in the fullness of truth.

The Knights of Columbus serve the Church. We are not served by the Church or her clergy. We are in service to her and with them. Knights of Columbus Councils do not have parishes. Parishes have Councils to serve the mission of the Church. The service to the Church requires us to build the Domestic Church; our families united in the Church. We build the Domestic Church by being men of God and supporting each other as priest, prophet and king as our baptismal avocation [Catechism (nos. 897-913)]. The perpetuation of the Knights of Columbus is essential in this role and the performance of the spiritual and corporal works of mercy to the end of service to the Church. This requires us to be our brother's keeper to draw men deeper into the Church. If we do not know where our brother is we have failed to be like Christ and failed our brother. Our brother will not be present for us in our time of need if we are not present for him in his time of need. Our mission is too valuable to the Church and for the salvation of our brothers to allow any man to squander his membership or opportunity to be a member. Be the Medic on the battlefield of the culture war and know your brother and his domestic church, your redemption depends on seeing Christ in others and being Christ to others. The Knights of Columbus is the means to that end.

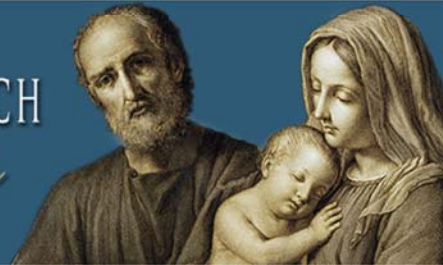

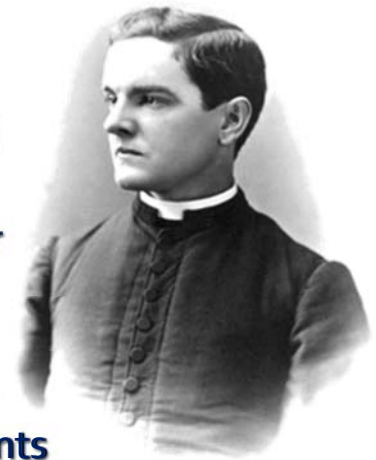

Hope that your October Church Drives and Information Sessions, Admission Degrees, Charitable Outreach Programs(s) and Family Rosary Program/Corporate Communion have gone

well. We're over one-third of the way into our 2017-18 Fraternal Year so your numbers for adding new members and new insurance members should reflect that pace as you work to meet or exceed your quotas and earn the Star/Double Star Council Awards as well as the "Wisconsin State Outstanding Council Award." As we head into the holiday season, continue to work with your FAs, GAs and Diocesan State Officers as well as neighboring Councils to enhance your programs in those areas!

In November-December, you should be wrapping up your Life Savers for Life and Culture of Life Essay Contests with results and reports to be turned in. Sentiments for Seminarians Drive during November collects gift cards and other items by November 30 to your DD so they can be brought to the DD Meeting in Green Lake December 1-3. Plans for your Council Charitable Outreach Day (November 24 - Black Friday) should be well underway - a great time to do Coats for Kids or Food for Families to counteract the commercialism and materialism of that day and weekend!

That, of course, leads into "Keep Christ in Christmas." I trust that you have your orders in for yard signs and magnets, have downloaded your instruction kits for the State "True Meaning of Christmas" Poster Contest (grades 1-4) and/or downloaded the information from the Supreme website, ordered necessary kits from Supreme knightsgear.org or Dept. of Fraternal Mission for the Supreme "Keep Christ in Christmas" Poster Contest (kindergarten, ages 10-14). These should be run in late November, early December with Council winners for the State Contest to your Diocesan Program Coordinator by December 31 (Note: Superior Diocese Councils, with no Diocesan Coordinator, will have to send their posters directly to me!) All "Keep Christ" Posters (Supreme Contest) need to be sent to me by January 15.

Councils are also encouraged in November to order necessary materials from Supreme for the "Building the Domestic Church Initiative" Advent Programs: Journey to the Inn (Posada) [#9898] and the "Consecration to the Holy Family" for Holy Family Sunday (December 30-31) [#30003]. These are great programs, easy to do, with a huge potential impact for your Council and parish.

We also strongly encourage all Councils, knights, parishes to engage in the annual "Spread the Light of Christ" program. Just have everyone you can turn on their Christmas tree, outside display, Nativity scene or light their Advent wreath at 8 PM on Tuesday, December 5, as will Knights across the nation! In addition, spread some special family time together or with neighbors, parishioners, Brother Knights by having a prayer service or rosary, having a meal together, caroling, doing a community service project, etc. What a great way to help usher in the Christmas season!

Remember also to be planning your State Knowledge and Supreme Free Throw Contests for December, January. The Supreme Citizenship Essay Contest can also be done November-January and the Supreme Substance Abuse Poster Contest (December-March). Download information and materials for these from the State and Supreme websites, Free Throw kits from Supreme and the Citizenship Essay, Substance Abuse Poster kits can be ordered from knightsgear.org or Dept. of Fraternal Mission.

As usual, continue your great work with Special Olympics, Charity Raffle, Family of the Month, Ultrasound, RSVP, etc. Remember, though, that our top priority continues to be support for and assistance with parish programs and the needs and desires of your pastor!

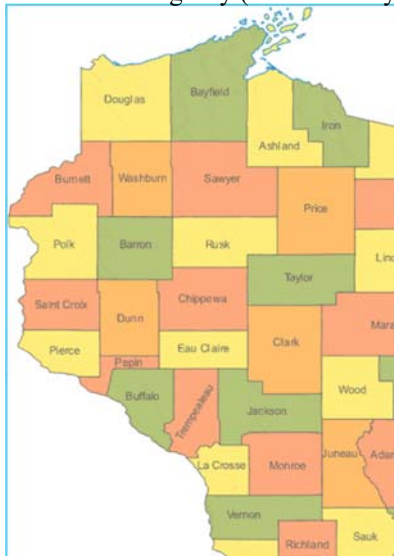

\$2 MILLION WILL HELP RECONSTRUCT AND RESETTLE KARAMDES, A TOWN ON THE NINEVEH PLAIN DESTROYED BY ISIS

In a move that will give many Christians and other religious minorities in Iraq hope for the future, the Knights of Columbus will raise and donate \$2 million to save Karamdes, a predominantly Christian town on the Nineveh Plain which was liberated from ISIS late last year.

The Knights' action will move hundreds of families from minority religious communities in Iraq – especially Christians – back to the homes from which they were evicted by ISIS in summer, 2014.

The Knights' action matches a similar donation by the government of Hungary, which recently donated \$2 million to save another predominantly Christian town, Teleskov. About 1,000 families have now moved back to that town, providing proof that such actions can actually work in returning Christian populations to pre-ISIS levels in the region.

Like the government of Hungary, the Knights will partner in this resettlement and rebuilding effort with the Archdiocese of Erbil, which is currently housing the largest population of Christian refugees in Iraq, including many of the residents of Karamdes.

“The terrorists desecrated churches and graves and looted and destroyed homes,” said Supreme Knight Carl Anderson during his annual report at the Knights of Columbus 135th Supreme Convention. “Now we will ensure that hundreds of Christian families driven from their homes can return to these two locations and help to ensure a pluralistic future for Iraq.”

The Knights are urging K of C councils, parishes or other Church groups, and individuals to help by donating \$2,000 – the approximate cost of resettling one family. Just a thousand such donations would be sufficient to reach the \$2 million goal. The rebuilding work will begin this week and money will begin flowing to the project immediately.

Urging the Knights to get behind this historic new initiative, Anderson paraphrased the words invoked by Winston Churchill in 1940: “Put your confidence in us ... We shall not fail or falter, we shall not weaken or tire. We

will give you the tools and together we will finish the job.” In the same report, Supreme Knight Anderson also announced that the K of C would partner with the U.S

Conference of Catholic Bishops on a “Week of Awareness” for persecuted Christians beginning Nov. 26.

Since 2014, the Knights’ Christian Refugee Relief Fund has donated more than \$13 million for humanitarian assistance primarily in Iraq, Syria and the surrounding region. The Knights’ documentation of ISIS’ atrocities and advocacy on behalf of Christians and other religious minorities in the Middle East were decisive in the 2016 decision of former U.S. Secretary of State John Kerry to declare as genocide the treatment of Christians and other religious minorities in the region. This designation was reaffirmed by Secretary of State Rex Tillerson last week.

One hundred percent of the money raised will be used for this project. Knights of Columbus Charities, Inc. is recognized by the Internal Revenue Service as a charitable organization under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.
