


MERRY CHRISTMAS

He has declared a Jubilee year of Mercy to begin on December 8, 2015, the feast of the Immaculate Conception, and end on November 20, 2016, the feast of Christ the King.



My Dear Brother Knights

I expect as I am just writing this on the 21st of December, by the time it gets to you it will be time to wish you a Merry Christmas!! It is a lot of fun, every year, to wish people a Blessed Advent as we approach Christmas, and then to wish everyone a Merry Christmas from Christmas until the feast of

Second, if you were not able to attend your winter, district meeting, arrange for extended time for your district deputy with your officers.

Third, Worthy Grand Knights, view our Supreme Knight's address to the State Deputies gathered November 20th in San Antonio. View it with your officers and/or with your whole council. You will find the video of Supreme Knight Carl Anderson's address on the front page or your Wisconsin Knights of Columbus website.

OK, so after all that, what action do we take? For starters, our Supreme Council is giving us two excellent tools in the form of the programs: Building the Domestic Church and Solidarity Cross. Just last week I was told that a local council was allowed to offer the crosses after Mass and they disappeared fast!

One last thing. One of the greatest gifts a man can ever receive is the gift of membership in our honorable order. Ours truly is a mission great; one worthy of our time and talent. Unfortunately, too many of our brothers lose sight of that as we lose contact with them. Let us do all we can to share the precious gift of membership with new men. And let us also do all we can to reevangelize those with whom we have lost touch, and re-invite them to our noble mission.

Worthy Grand Knight, task your Council Retention Committee, headed up by your Deputy Grand Knight, to do all they can to make personal contact twice each year with every member of your council; once on their birthday and once on the anniversary of their exemplification into our order.

If personal contact cannot be established send a card. Send it with return requested so you can know if they are no longer at the address that you have on file. Your Financial Secretary has tools at his disposal for finding our "Lost Sheep," and training in the use of those tools has been, and will continue to be, made available to him. Let us together commit to finding our lost sheep and leading them back home into our Brotherhood.

Echoing the words of Worthy State Deputy Ronald Faust, "What our world and our families need right now are saints: Saints like St. Joseph!" This training in holiness we have slated for Lent 2016 promises to go a long way in helping us all become the best St. Josephs we can be!

During this thrilling Packer season, the rallying cry as we enter into this training in holiness - "Chase Perfection, Catch Excellence!" - comes from our own legendary coach Vince Lombardi, who said, "Perfection is not attainable. But if we chase perfection, we can catch excellence." Of course Lombardi, a brother Knight and daily Mass goer, was himself inspired by the very words of Christ: "Be you therefore perfect, as also your heavenly Father is perfect" (Matt. 5:48).

Those entering the training for 54 days will be asked to simply pray one rosary per day, and meditate on the 1-2 minute daily reflections. As I wrote in last month's newsletter, the first 27 days will be drawn from Holy Scripture, quotes from saints, and inspiring passages from the Catechism, all on the qualities of excellent found in the Theological Virtues, Cardinal Virtues, Gifts of the Holy Spirit, and the Fruits of the Holy Spirit. The second 27 days are drawn from excerpts from the Church Militant Field Manual: Special Forces Training for the Life in Christ.

While these reflections will be offered online (Here is the link http://flocknote.com/knightswisc), they will also be offered in book form, with my newly published, 54 Day Basic Training in Holiness. We would like to get these books into the hands of all of our brother knights in Wisconsin. These are offered for only \$3.00 each, when ordered in bundles of 20 books at roman-catholicgear.com. All proceeds from sales of this book go to the Knights of Columbus. Please help promote this training.

In this Year of Mercy, Pope Francis has asked that in every diocese and in churches and shrines designated by the diocesan bishop, there would also be a celebration of the rite of opening of the Holy Door in unity with the Universal Church so all can participate and obtain the indulgences promised in this Jubilee Year.

Loving Father, help us to remember the birth of Jesus, that we may share in the song of the angels the gladness of the shepherds and the worship of the wise men. Close the door of hate and open the door of love all over the world. And, help us to train to be the very best St. Josephs we can be!!

Big congratulations to you and our state on a great month of recruitment. In the month of November we recruited 9% of our yearly goal and we were awarded \$595 in the Winter Tournament Incentives. That money will be set aside for further advertising signs and material for membership recruitment.

As I mentioned in last month's newsletter, we had our third new council early this past month. That makes Madison and Milwaukee Dioceses that have yet to bring in a new member this year. I have asked our District Deputies in these to Dioceses to look for potential sites and make sure we look into every opportunity to make Father McGivney's vision of a Knights of Columbus presence in every parish become a reality.

The race to be the best Diocese in the state is getting close. Only .3% separates Superior and Lacrosse in their percentage on goal to date. Green Bay is a few points behind inching closer to be in the mix. Madison and Milwaukee are lagging behind, but not out of the mix yet. We have 6 months left and we do not give up in this state on our goals. I know we will continue to fight and achieve our goals and rise to the top pile in membership recruitment.

The district races are continuing to be close. In Green Bay we have District 13 fresh off a new council with 95% of its yearly membership goal with District 9 and 12 in a close race for second. In Lacrosse we have District 28 at 86% of its yearly goal with District 30 and District 26 in almost a tie for second. Madison has District 48 close to the 50% minimum mark for the cash at 47% with Districts 43 and 49 close behind. Milwaukee has District 69 in the lead with 35% but still a ways off from the minimum mark for the cash. Superior has District 87 in a big lead with 116% and District 85 and 83 in a close race for second.

This past Mid-Year training meeting that the District Deputies attended focused how to recruit and the steps in a successful recruitment drive. We asked all the DD's to go to a Church in Sheboygan and assist in a Church Drive. I believe all the District Deputies learned a great deal in how easy it is to recruit and why it is so important to have faith in the recruitment process. Please ask your District Deputy on how you also can become a positive attitude recruiter.

I hope that all of us and our families are filled with the true meaning of Christmas and have a chance to show everyone in our communities that with our first principle of Charity as our banner, we can improve our community's faith and build a Domestic Church that can continue to bring new and past Catholics back to our Church.

## **State Program Coordinator - Bill Frayer**

Brother Knights,

This Holiday season has brought to us the words of our Supreme Knight instructing all Councils to make every effort to be the strong right arm of their pastor and their parish, to be more active and visible in the activities and programs of their parish. We need to review and assess our programs to determine whether they duplicate or impede parish efforts in the areas of youth, family, Culture of Life, Faith Formation, Human Concerns/Social Justice, etc. This will certainly be an ongoing process, but now is the time to begin as we enter 2016.

Nevertheless, I do hope that your "Keep Christ in Christmas" efforts (Light Up for Christ, yard signs & magnets, youth Poster Contests, etc.) have gone well. Remember that "True Meaning of Christmas" poster winners are due to you DD by December 31; all Supreme "Keep Christ in Christmas" poster winners are due to me by mid-January.

Your plans for Knowledge & Free Throw Contests should be well underway, with Council programs in December and January, District Free Throw in late January-mid February, Diocesan Contests mid February-mid March. We still plan on holding the State Knowledge & Free Throw Contests on Saturday, March 19 at Assumption High School in Wisconsin Rapids. More on timing for that next month.

Other programs you should be working on include Coats for Kids (if not already done), Food for Families (February-March), Charity Raffle ticket sales, orders for your Tootsie Rolls to name just a few. Be sure, also, to get your Special Olympics form and Fraternal Survey in on time. They are so very important for getting proper information to Supreme on our activities and earning money from Supreme for Special Olympics (\$2000-\$10,000 for our state depending on how many Councils turn in the forms as they should)! So, get yours in soon!

Remember that the goals of every Council should be to earn Star Council and the State Complete Council Award. We had only about 2 dozen out of 295 Councils earn Star in 2014-15 and about 18 win Complete Council. We ought to have 4-5 times that many at least attain those honors for 2015-16! So, do make use of the checklists you received in your District Meeting packets on a monthly basis to track your programs toward those 2 awards! I am asking all DDs to be checking with you and monitoring your Councils' progress monthly, starting in January.

Don't forget to be working on your Family of the Year and Medallion Award nominations – due by February 15! You all have great families and Knights who deserve these honors. Likewise, Supreme Service Award forms need to be in to the State Office by March 1. Nominate the best program you have in each of the 6 areas, fill out the forms (downloaded off the State of Supreme website) and get them in. Again, we annually get only 5-10 nominations per category each year when we should have many dozens of them from our 295 Councils!

History Books are due to your DD by February 1. Be sure to download the proper forms for 2015 off the State website and use only those! Follow the instructions closely. The History Book is a great recruiting tool and also a requirement for the Complete Council Award. If you've not done one recently, at least try to get something together to submit - completed forms, Council newsletters, photos and articles, etc. and it'll not only fulfilled that requirements but perhaps jump start you to do better for 2016.

Finally, I'd like to congratulate those Councils who participated in the annual Sentiments for Seminarians program. We had a huge supply of donations again at the Winter DD Meeting in Sheboygan. The seminarians are so grateful for all the gifts they received, especially for the \$1000+ in gift cards that each Diocese received. Well Done!

This will all be done online, and will be the shorter Kolbe 9 Day Preparation for Consecration. Once St. Maximilian Kolbe learned about St. Louis de Montfort's consecration to Mary, called the "surest, easiest, shortest, and the most perfect means" to becoming a saint, he called it a "secret weapon for the world," a "shortcut to holiness." And so, on day one, we turn to St. Joseph, asking him to walk with us and inspire us in this training.

**January 23** - We consecrate ourselves to the chaste heart of St. Joseph (This will be done online)

**January 24** - Begin a 9 Day Preparation for Consecration. This is St. Maximilian Kolbe's preparation (This will be done online).

**February 2** - The Feast of the Presentation. Consecration to the Immaculate and Sacred Hearts Of Mary and Jesus (This will be done online).

**February 10** - Ash Wednesday. Begin the 54 Day Basic Training in Holiness (Book & online).

**April 3** - Our Basic Training in Holiness concludes on Divine Mercy Sunday in the Year of Mercy.

## PREPARING FOR THE TRAINING

1) Order the 54 Day Basic Training in Holiness books for your membership. These books retail for \$8.00, but are offering to our brother knights for \$3.00. We'd like to see every Knight in our State possess their own copy of this training book. **Considering Fear** The media reports that one of the Paris terrorists entered Europe disguised as a refugee. In California two terrorists had roots in Pakistan: the husband a U.S. citizen, the wife a new immigrant. These three people have succeeded in creating a tsunami of fear across America. Wisconsin's governor along with 25 other governors have declared they will not cooperate with the settlement of Syrian refugees in their states. Three people.

There are over 11 million Syrian refugees in the world; half the population of Syria. A catastrophe of biblical proportions. Mostly families with children. Will we walk past these bleeding, dying "Samaritans" on the roadside? Three people have turned the hearts of an otherwise generous people into hearts frozen in fear. Have you noticed it? Haven't we lost something precious?

How easy it is to forget Jesus' words, "Take courage! It is I. Don't be afraid" (Mt 14:27) Wasn't it fear that put Japanese-Americans into internment camps and denied entry to Jews fleeing Nazi terror during the war? Wasn't it fear that forced African-Americans into segregated schools and housing, Irish immigrants into ghettos, and Native Americans onto reservations far from their homes? Fear contracts the human heart, shortens our vision, restricts our listening, and closes our minds. In other words, it snuffs out the light of Christ in us. Fear is not rational, an emotional reaction to real or imagined threats. So we circle the wagons and quietly serve those in need who are closest to us all the while saying by word or deed that "I have done my Christian duty, and as for those people "over there", well, maybe the Europeans or Arab countries can feed the hungry, clothe the naked, house the homeless, teach the illiterate. Yes, let someone else take care of "those people"; we'll take care of our own.

Many of our governors are saying, "We don't want 'those people' living in our neighborhoods!" Is that the best we can do? Is this what we are, a people tied up into knots by fear. Yes, it is true, the Knights of Columbus have always been generous in supporting relief efforts for refugees around the world, but can't we as Catholic Christians do a little more? For example, can we be a soft voice of reason with family, friends, and colleagues? Can we write and tell our political leaders we are a better people than they want to believe. Can we proclaim from the "house tops" that we will not be led by fear, that we will help the wounded Samaritan on the roadside even if there is danger lurking nearby. Why? Because that's who we are. That's what we are meant to be. "Be not afraid."

In order to ensure both council members and delegates are well informed of the qualifications of each candidate for the State Officer positions and in order to minimize the cost of printing and mailing resumes in a timely manner candidates who are proposed by their respective council may submit a resume to the State Office of the Wisconsin State Council by February 15th, 2016 for dissemination. All resumes will be included in a booklet arranged according to the office in the following order: State Deputy, State Secretary, State Treasurer, State Advocate, and State Warden. Booklets will be mailed to the Former State Chaplains, Past State Deputies, current State and Diocesan Coordinators, District Deputies, and the Grand Knights of each subordinate council. 





## 5 "Truth Bombs" About Marriage from the Catechism

"The matrimonial covenant, by which a man and a woman establish between themselves a partnership of the whole of life, is by its nature ordered toward the good of the spouses and the procreation and education of offspring." (1601)

- "The intimate community of life and love which constitutes the married state has been established by the Creator and endowed by him with its own proper laws.... God himself is the author of marriage.' The vocation to marriage is written in the very nature of man and woman as they came from the hand of the Creator. (1603a)
- "Since God created them man and woman, their mutual love becomes an image of the absolute and unfailing love with which God loves man ... And this love which God blesses is intended to be fruitful and to be realized in the common work of watching over creation." (1604)
- "Holy Scripture affirms that man and woman were created for one another: 'It is not good that the man should be alone.' The woman, 'flesh of his flesh,' his equal, his nearest in all things, is given to him by God as a 'helpmate'; she thus represents God from whom comes our help." (1605)
- The experience [of evil all around and within us] makes itself felt in the relationships between man and woman. Their union has always been threatened by discord, a spirit of domination, infidelity, jealousy, and conflicts that can escalate into hatred and separation. To heal the wounds of sin, man and woman need the help of the grace that God in his infinite mercy never refuses them. (1606, 1608)

The Wisconsin Knights of Columbus recently sent Relevant Radio a check for \$4,625.00.




Msgr. John R McGinley Council 1170 Distributes Christmas Food Baskets


