
I also thanked your State Faith Formation Director, Michael Raboine, as I began the address saying, "For two years now, Mike has been telling everyone within earshot that there is no lay organization of Catholic men in a better position to act on the call for a lay-led re-evangelization than the Knights of Columbus. Those words are echoed in a very important address delivered by Supreme Knight Carl Anderson to all of the State Deputies from around the world gathered in in San Antonio on November 20th."

I then asked them who among them was a Knight, or the wife, sister, daughter or mother of a Knight? I then asked the Knights who they say we are, and I asked the others who they say we are. What about you, my Brothers reading this, who do you say we are? I shared with them that Saint John Paul II, when he was Pope, said we are "The Strong Right Arm of the Church."

By way of explaining what that means, I shared the following excerpts from the address of Supreme Knight Carl Anderson's address to the State Deputies gathered from around the world in San Antonio, Texas, November 20, just 15 days prior. (For the full address visit your State Council website.)



Before we enlist in this Basic Training, we need to seek the amazing supernatural graces afforded us by Consecration. This will all be done online, and will be the shorter Kolbe 9 Day Preparation for Consecration. Once St. Maximilian Kolbe learned about St. Louis de Montfort's consecration to Mary, called the "surest, easiest, shortest, and the most perfect means" to becoming a saint, he called it a "secret weapon for the world," a "shortcut to holiness." And so, on day one, we turn to St. Joseph, asking him to walk with us and inspire us in this training.

Before all else: GO TO CONFESSION

January 23 - We consecrate ourselves to the chaste heart of St. Joseph (This will be done online)

January 24 - Begin a 9 Day Preparation for Consecration. This is St. Maximilian Kolbe's preparation (This will be done online).

February 2 - The Feast of the Presentation. Consecration to the Immaculate and Sacred Hearts Of Mary and Jesus (This will be done online).

February 10 - Ash Wednesday. Begin the 54 Day Basic Training in Holiness (Book & online).

April 3 - Our Basic Training in Holiness concludes on Divine Mercy Sunday in the Year of Mercy.

Supreme Knight Anderson said:

"In his Apostolic exhortation *Evangelium Gaudium (The Joy of the Gospel)*, Pope Frances called for a new missionary spirit among Catholics. "By her very nature the Church is missionary," the Pope wrote. "She abounds in effective charity and a compassion that understands, assists and promotes" (179). This challenge has special resonance for Knights of Columbus, especially throughout North America, where we have benefited in so many ways from the sacrifice of countless missionaries. The great Catholic institutions of our country were built by men and women filled with a great missionary spirit. Although Father Michael McGivney would probably not have described himself as a missionary, throughout his lifetime the United States remained "mission" territory in the eyes of the Vatican. In this regard, we remember the words of Pope Benedict XVI during his 2008 visit to the United State when he named Father McGivney as an example of the missionary spirit that built the Catholic Church in America.

On that occasion, Pope Benedict urged Catholics in America to "move together toward that true spiritual renewal desired by the (Second Vatican) Council, a renewal which can only strengthen the Church in that holiness and unity indispensable for the effective proclamation of the Gospel in today's world."

The Pope continued, "Was not this unity of vision and purpose – rooted in faith and a spirit of constant conversion and self-sacrifice – the secret of the impressive growth of the Church in this country? We need but think of the remarkable accomplishment of that exemplary American priest, the Venerable Michael McGivney, whose vision and zeal led to the establishment of the Knights of Columbus."

This missionary spirit has been a constant dynamic throughout our history. It has always encouraged us to seek new challenges and to adapt to new situations – and to do so always in faithful service responding to the needs of our Church.

THE SECOND VATICAN COUNCEL – Following the Second Vatican Council, it became clear that the vitality of our parishes and of our Catholic families was being tested as never before. Thousands of priests and religious left their ministries and vocations to the priesthood and religious life plummeted. The widespread scourges of no-fault divorce, cohabitation outside of marriage, single-parent families and abortion made Catholic family life appear at times as the new "terra incognita." At the same time, the Second Vatican Council called upon the laity to assume a greater role in meeting these challenges.

The Knights of Columbus responded with dramatic new initiatives to better meet the needs of our families and our parishes. For example, we initiated one of the largest vocations programs in history. Through our Refund Support Vocations Program and scholarships, we have provided more than \$68 million to more than 115,000 men and women pursuing vocations.

We also began a shift away from establishing local councils dependent upon home association facilities. Instead, we promoted the establishment of parish-based councils aligned with Father McGivney's original vision for the Order. The result has been a tremendous success. This shift has opened the door to thousands of new councils."

During this same time the Knights of Columbus sharpened its mission to better support Catholic family life. This was always one of the core missions of the Order envisioned by Father McGivney. It was the reason the Order developed fraternal benefits to support widows and orphans. It led to the establishment of thousands of youth and family activities, to our support of parish-based Catholic schools, and to developing our spiritual and catechetical programs directed to families, such as our Catholic Information Service, our Pilgrim Virgin Icon program and Fathers for Good.

More recently, the Order has implemented a new program that brings together both our support of parishes and our support of families. It is titled Building the Domestic Church: The Family Fully Alive. Already, many thousands of local Knights of Columbus councils and families have begun participating in this program.

LOOKING TO THE FUTURE – In its 2012 document titled *Disciples Called to Witness*, the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops made clear the connection between the parish and the family in the new evangelization.

Regarding parish life, the bishops' document stated, "It is the responsibility of both pastors and laity to ensure that (the doors of the parish) are always open. Evangelization must remain rooted in the parish. It is in the parish that one becomes engaged with the Church community, learns how to become a disciple of Christ, is nurtured by Scripture, is nourished by the sacraments, and ultimately becomes the evangelizer. Successful evangelization and catechetical initiatives must be focused on the parish."

It further noted, "The family, called the domestic Church, is often the first place where one experiences and is formed in the faith." And it concluded by quoting Pope Benedict XVI's 2011 address to the Pontifical Council for the Family that "the new evangelization depends largely on the domestic Church."

Thus we see a providential convergence of three initiatives of the Knights of Columbus: the development of thousands of new parish-based councils; new programs to strengthen family life, all leading to a deeper understanding of the family as domestic church; and our increasing commitment to serve the Church's mission of a new evangelization through the parish. Indeed, each of these three initiatives points to the Knights of Columbus as the organization best situated to enliven and strengthen parish life. We are truly positioned today to move to a new level of service as the strong right arm of our parish churches.

Now the time has come for us to accelerate these initiatives as they affect our work in parishes and our work to strengthen Christian family life.

The family as domestic church is central to both the work of the new evangelization and to the future sustainability of our parishes – as well as the future sustainability of the Order. But the Catholic family cannot perform this important mission on its own. The reason is simple: As Blessed Paul VI observed, the family can only truly be a domestic church when its daily life "mirrors the various aspects of the entire Church." And for this to become a reality, the family must be more fully integrated into the sacramental life of the parish.

Our councils do this by more fully integrating families into the life of the parish through the many programs of our parishbased councils.

We continue the legacy of Father McGivney – a legacy which, as Pope Benedict observed, was to promote spiritual renewal among Catholics by strengthening them in holiness and unity. And as a parish priest, Father McGivney saw that this renewal could be assisted in powerful ways in the parish by the new organization he had established.

THE RENEWAL OF PARISH AND FAMILY LIFE – Today, we are determined to continue this work of renewal and unity. In this way, we will also realize the mission that St. John Paull II identified in *Ecclesia in America*: "The renewal of the Church in America will not be possible without the active presence of the laity. Therefore they are largely responsible for the future of the Church." (44).

Today, the Knights of Columbus is *providentially* positioned to play a key role in the new alliance between the Church and the family called for by Pope Francis.

To meet this need, we will have to do some things differently. Our councils will have to become even more active in our parish communities. We will have to stop duplicating activities that are more appropriately done by and through the parish. We will have to focus more on programs that support Catholic families in their mission as a domestic church. For many councils, doing these things will require making choices between what is good and what is better. Often they may to choose between what our Catholic community may have needed in the past and what it needs today *and in the future*.

A NEW K OF C INITIATIVE – Therefore, I am announcing a new Orderwide initiative to strengthen both our parishes and our families. It is titled *Building the Domestic Church While Strengthening our Parish*."

Following Supreme Knight Anderson's words, I continued with, "In Wisconsin, we have already been taking steps to put real action behind those words. We have been traveling the state exhorting our councils' leaders to share the Family Fully Alive edition of the Building the Domestic Church initiative; not only with their members, but with every parish family of the parishes they serve.

And we wrote to Brother Sir Knight Jerome Listecki, your Archbishop, seeking permission to offer this booklet to every parish family whether served by a council or not. Obviously, the answer is yes! And so every parish will be sent a letter, along with this booklet, inviting them to participate.

We are delighted to be called to this great work of Building the Domestic Church, and we humbly ask your kind indulgence as we work to earn the title bestowed upon us by Saint John Paul II."

I went on to explain a little about the Solidarity Cross program; about how it is a concrete way that we do not need to merely lament the horrendous genocide our brothers and sisters in Christ are at the hands of radical Islam, we can actually do something about it. I said this while holding up one of the 5-inch crosses from the Holy Land, the only one that I had brought with me that day.

Archbishop did not let me leave with that cross, and he insisted that I accept his \$10 donation. He also asked that we work together to connect our District Deputies with the leaders of the archdiocesan deaneries, that they might work together to forward these programs.

My dear Brother Knights, wherever you are in Wisconsin, I invite you to join in this renewal of Christian Family Life, and with it, the renewal of our Order and of our Church.

Happy New Year Brother Knights,

We finished the end of the calendar year strong. We have recruited almost 500 members in the first 6 months, which is 41.5% of our circle of honor goal. You can also see that we are losing members to death and suspension quicker than we are recruiting them. If we had no suspensions and withdrawals in the first 6 months we would have had a 54 member increase in our overall numbers. This is why we are asking all members to keep up the recruitment and to work harder on retention.

Retention is our big failure these first 6 months racking up a huge 207 members to suspension and withdrawal. These suspensions are happening without a genuine effort on saving these members and finding out why they are not being active. I ask that you and your fellow Knights work hard on retaining members and achieve the goal of no new suspensions or withdrawals the rest of the fraternal year.

Superior DD87 133.3% (no others made the goal)


Diocese Bishop check Incentive

I trust that as we enter 2016, your Program plans and efforts are going well. Continue to use your Fraternal Planning Calendars to aid you in this process. Also, be sure at your monthly meetings to utilize the checklists you have received in your District meeting packets to monitor your progress toward Star Council and Complete Council! What do you already have done; what's on tap for this month; what's yet to be done? Your DD will help monitor your progress. Remember, EVERY COUNCIL SHOULD BE A STAR AND COMPLETE COUNCIL! In January, your Fraternal Survey and Special Olympics Participation forms are due to Supreme by January 31. They're very important – be sure you get yours in on time even if you had no information for the Special Olympics form! In February, your Family of the Year and Medallion Award



applications are due to State Office by February 15. Be sure to honor someone from your Council/parish for these prestigious awards which I'm sure they deserve! Remember, also, that your History Books are due to your DD by February 1 and your Service Program Award nominations are due to State Office by March 1. Download the forms for both these programs from the State website. A History Book is required for the Compete Council Award, as best you can do. Every Council has great programs deserving of recognition, so pick the best from each category and get those applications in soon to AA Tony Schreiner at State Office. We have received confirmation that the State Knowledge and Free Throw Contests will be held on Saturday, March 19 at Assumption High School in Wisconsin Rapids. Times figure to be registration and practice for Free Throw 11 AM-Noon with competition starting at Noon. Registration for Math and Spelling will be 11:30 AM-12:30 PM with competition beginning at 12:45 PM. Council, District Free Throw and Diocesan Contests will need to be completed by March 13. Remember that, as you advance, students/athletes to higher levels that they are required to have an ACCURATE, LEGIBLE, COMPLETELY FILLED OUT travel card for registration at the District, Diocesan and State competitions. The left and right sides of the card and the bottom MUST be completely filled out. If you have questions on this, please feel free to contact your Diocesan Program Coordinator, IPSD Tim Genthe or me. Also note that at Diocesan and State levels, a student/athlete can compete in only 1 contest! They could do Math and Spelling or Knowledge and Free Throw and the Council level. But, since the competitions are held simultaneously at the Diocesan and State levels, they have to choose 1 competition only! We cannot accommodate those who wish to compete before, after or at some other time than when they are scheduled due to tie-breaker and awards procedures. As you prepare your February-June programming and look towards your Columbian Award applications, don't forget about our 8 featured Supreme programs, participation in which can not only do so much to advocate our charitable works, but also fulfill significant sections of the Columbian Award, if done on a major level. Those programs are: Coats for Kids, Food for Families, RSVP, Marches for Life, Ultrasound Projects, Special Olympics, Global Wheelchairs and habitat for Humanity. The Marches for Life and Ultrasound Projects are especially appropriate this month of January with the January 22 Roe v. Wade anniversary in the middle. Given the weather at this writing, Coats for Kids is highly appropriate. Food for Families has always been stressed for February-March when pantry supplies are often reduced after the Holiday season but demand is still great. With Lent beginning February 10, it's a great time to organize a "40 cans for Lent Drive" as part of your Food for Families program. Work with your parish or cluster, your St. Vincent de Paul Conference or County Council, and make it happen! Check with the State or Supreme websites to find more information on these programs and how they relate to the Columbian Award. Significant financial rebates can also be earned for Councils with the Food for Families program, up to \$500. Finally, continue to use your programming as a way to attract new members and retain the ones you have! Include your prospects, parents, parishioners and community members in your programs to see the good that we do through united action. Give them a role and they'll want to become one of us. Likewise, get your new members involved in a project or 2 that they enjoy. For your older, less or uninvolved members, use that interest survey and semi-annual phone calls to reconnect with them; find out areas they are interested in so you can get them back into action again.





- "Since God created them man and woman, their mutual love becomes an image of the absolute and unfailing love with which God loves man . . . And this love which God blesses is intended to be fruitful and to be realized in the common work of watching over creation." (1604)
- "Holy Scripture affirms that man and woman were created for one another: 'It is not good that the man should be alone.' The woman, 'flesh of his flesh,' his equal, his nearest in all things, is given to him by God as a 'helpmate'; she thus represents God from whom comes our help." (1605)
- The experience [of evil all around and within us] makes itself felt in the relationships between man and woman. Their union has always been threatened by discord, a spirit of domination, infidelity, jealousy, and conflicts that can escalate into hatred and separation. To heal the wounds of sin, man and woman need the help of the grace that God in his infinite mercy never refuses them. (1606, 1608)

Because love is filled with hope when it is communicated, our family wants to promote the life-giving spirit of our families.

Whoever is moved by love begins to perceive what "life" really is. If we are in relation with him who does not die, who is Life itself and Love itself, then we are in life. Then we "live."






