My Brother Knights,

In other news, a couple of months ago we considered the idea of offering online registration for our State Convention. Your Worthy State Advocate, Jack Wrbanich, working with UKnight, has made that idea a reality. So, how has it been received? As I write this I am aware that, so far, there have been over 200 online registrations! Well done, Brother Jack, for bringing this opportunity to our Knights.

I have three more brief messages for you this month. The first is regarding the many benefits available to us as Knights. There are many fine financial institutions, some even Catholic. But they are just that, financial institutions. Some think of our Knights of Columbus insurance company is just another fine financial institution. They could not be more wrong. We are a Catholic Men's Fraternal Service organization that *includes* an insurance company. It is not a separate entity. It is an integral part of who we are. You will find that the most growth in our order is among those who most appreciate this important distinction. It is the only financial institution that *fully* supports our complete mission. The second is that the other area of greatest growth seems to be coming from parish based councils. There appears to be a correlation between the depth of the council's connection with their home parish and their growth. And could it be that the closer we adhere to the design of our creator, the healthier we will be?

The third and final message for this month is to repeat that, over the years, we have been blessed to welcome to our ranks many brother Knights. Sadly, we have lost track of far too many members, some to the point where we can no longer find them. I implore you; do not let this happen in your council. Help your retention committee to make personal contact with each brother Knight at least twice every year; once on their birthday as we value every life, and once on the anniversary of their becoming a knight, as we still value them as a brother knight.





# WE OVERCAME THE COLD

The month of February was short and cold, but our recruitment was awesome. We brought in 141 new members in this past month. We brought in more people this month than any other month so far this fraternal year. Thank you to the entire team that helped recruit this month. We are truly blessed to have this team in our state to recruit and recruit so well. This team not only recruits, but teaches others on what works and what doesn't so that all our council can benefit in growth.

I am looking forward to all the reports from your March church recruitment drive. Please make sure that you pass along all the information to the state membership team before March 27. We need this information so we can better serve you with membership materials and incentives.

We are at the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter point in our fraternal year and I thought I would give a slight summary of our progress so far. We have 15 councils that have achieved their membership goal. Racine Council # 15659 has reached 400% so far this year. Councils 10260 Flintville and 10714 Green Bay have broken the 300% mark for recruitment. We have instated two new councils so far this fraternal year; Pleasant Prairie and Pine Bluff are great additions to our state. We are working on a few others before the end of June to reach our state goal of at least 5. As the table shows, we are still over 251 members behind of what we started the year with on July 1. However the year is not over yet and I have faith we will try our best to overcome our deficit and, like how we overcame the cold this winter, we will overcome everything together.

#### Brother Knights,

This month makes the 3/4 point in our 2014-15 Fraternal Year. We begin in March to put major emphasis on our drive to substantially increase the number of Star Councils/Districts, Columbian Award winners and Complete Councils in Wisconsin compared to last year. Every Council should have received checklists to use in tracking their progress toward Star and Complete Council. Your DDs will be checking monthly on your progress and forwarding that information to your Diocesan/State Program Coordinators. In addition, we'll be sending you help sheets for filling in your Columbian Award forms; we'll be monitoring your progress monthly as well! If we continue our efforts for successful Church Drives (1 member per Council per month) and maintain our strong programming, we're sure to reach and pass that goal!

I hope that your plans for your ID Drive in April are well underway. Remember that the State Knowledge and Free Throw Contests will be held on March 28 at Wisconsin Rapids Assumption High School. Free Throw registration/practice is 10-11:30 AM; competition starts at 11:30 AM. Math, Spelling registration will be 11:30-12:30 PM with competition starting at 12:30 PM.

In addition to Church Drives, be sure that you have major plans for the Orderwide 1st Degrees, Corporate Communions, Outreach Week, Day of the Unborn and Founder's Day! These all offer you opportunities for great family, Culture of Life, faith charitable and community support activities which can help to increase our ranks, exposure to parish and community for the benefit of all involved.

Finally, for March, we focus on a Supreme Program that generally run in this February-March timeframe, Food for Families! In these difficult economic times, even something as basic as putting food on the table may be difficult for many families. The difference between having a nutritious meal or going hungry can be a thin line. You and your brother Knights/families can be that difference! To conduct a Food for Families program, contact a parish food pantry, community food bank or soup kitchen to determine their needs and if they'll be able to work with you. Then, obtain permission from your pastor or business owners to conduct the drive at your parish or local stores. Publicize the event with posters, flyers or pulpit/bulletin announcements at church. Newspapers, radio/TV can be used also to involve the community. Ask parishioners, shoppers, community members to donate non-perishable food items to church the next weekend(s) or to donate extra food purchases at the store(s) involved. Another option to effectively involve all parishioners is the "40 cans for Lent" program where those who can do so contribute 1 can for each day of Lent. When collecting monetary donations, make sure to have a secure receptacle in your collection area for cash/checks. You may also wish to place some items in the collection boxes at the start so people can see the types of items needed; also put a sign on the collection receptacle so those who missed the announcements will know what it's for. Councils may also wish to prepare and serve meals at a soup kitchen. Families can participate well in this activity! Parishioners and other eligible Catholic men who participate in this program make excellent membership recruitment prospects! Councils are now eligible to receive rebates from the Supreme Council for participating in the program: for every \$500 or 1000 pounds of food contributed to a food bank, food pantry or soup kitchen, the Supreme Council will rebate \$100 back to the Council (up to a maximum of \$500 per fraternal year). Council members must also contribute a minimum of 100 man hours in the preparation/distribution/service of meals to the needy. Report your activity using Form #10057 and also put on your Columbian Award Form #SP7. We've done well with this program in Wisconsin and I'm sure we'll continue to do so in 2015. Good luck on all your March-April program activities!

#### Culture of Life – by Dan Miller

I've never been known for sugar-coating anything.

The State Culture of Life committee and a lot of other volunteers spent the better part of their Saturday to tabulate the results of the Culture of Life Grant Fund donations. It was a lot of work. I had set a goal of \$250,000 at a minimum – or \$6.75 per Knight. We didn't even come close. We collected just under \$61,000 – roughly \$1.64 per Knight. Last year, we collected \$82,000. The year before that, \$93,000. The amount we collected didn't bother me nearly as much as the downward trend. It actually made me depressed. I am not used to failing. It is not in my blood. I am a fighter. Plus, I'm Irish – thanks to my paternal grandmother – who you will read about at the end of this article.

Well over 40 awesome and wonderful pro-life organizations look forward to applying for this grant every year. They do the HARD WORK that we as Knights simply can't do. We give to them so that BOTH of our goals are achieved in cultivating a 'Culture of Life.' This money can directly be tied to saving lives and souls. Just KNOW that.

We mined the list looking for possible candidates who have given in the recent past. I will be sending out another mailing to 276 Knights in the hopes that they would re-engage in this appeal. Short of that – we will hit the phones. My level of commitment to this is ALL IN. I will raise \$250,000 or die trying. I want to see abortion not only illegal – but UNTHINKABLE – but we can't do it without your help.

Where's the fire, Dan?! As many of you know, for the last five years of my life, I've spent over 5,000 hours as a full-time volunteer 'Sidewalk Counselor.' I would stand outside abortion facilities and try to convince young moms and dads to not go through with the abortion. During that time, we were successful 620 times that we know of – all glory to God. Much to my wife's extreme chagrin, I've even offered to trade my life for the baby's on numerous occasions. Really. Dead serious. "Bring your baby here after he or she is born – and I will take a bullet, right then and there – just don't kill your baby." It actually worked every time – and thankfully, no one has taken me up on my end of the 'bargain' – but I would do it, absolutely. I've also seen the wake of devastation that abortion creates in the 12,000 moms who decided to have an abortion during that time. That is a tremendous weight to carry for any man. Thankfully, I've given all of my failings to Christ. I've held four babies who were saved from abortion. One of them is now my God-son – little Baby Joseph. But the fire doesn't end there. Last September I learned something about abortion in my family. Long ago, in 1934, my paternal grandmother and grandfather travelled to Sheboygan to procure an illegal abortion. The target was my father – who was recently exemplified together with me to the 4<sup>th</sup> Degree. She and my grandfather walked out because they feared breaking the law. You see, the law is a teacher. The law saved my entire family from NON-BEING into BEING. I thank God for her courage to do the right thing – otherwise, I wouldn't be writing you today, begging you for a measly \$6.75 to help end abortion. Now you know why literally every fiber of my being cries out to end the atrocity of abortion. I am imploring you. Will you help a brother out?

In 2014 you were able to raise \$656,227.43, with 96% of councils participating in the program. In 2014 councils averaged \$2,384.84 per participating council and \$17.77 per member. Those are great numbers. My goal this year is to move the average per council and per member up slightly.

I also hope each council uses this project to try to do something new with the 2015 campaign, to get your members and the community more involved with each other. Some ideas:

Ask 5 members who never helped in the past to help.

If your council has a local special needs group check to see if they could work shoulder to shoulder with you on a shift. Try to raise your councils average per member.

See if your council can get local businesses to support the project. If you have a business willing to support more than \$250 please contact me as to give the business the proper tax deduction.

Because our children may be called to become spouses and parents, we want to help them to explore the vocation to marriage and family life.
