



Where is the "Same Page" of Unity?

I listened to a little bit of Ben Carson's endorsement speech while driving in my car from Mass.

It struck me when Dr. Carson called for unity. Don't we all want that? But, what does that look like? What is the "same page" we are all asked to be on?

I remember a time in my childhood when our country was mostly unified. When we all revered basic truths and values and principals, and were dedicated to those.


Yet, every year we lurch further and further away from these truths of God's will. We are asked to be okay with killing babies, and so let's be "unified" there. We are asked to use contraception, and so let's be "unified" there. We are asked to redefine marriage, and so let's be "unified" there. We are asked to remove talk of God from the public square, and so let's be "unified" there. We are asked to have the government control the message our children receive, and so let's be "unified" there. And so forth, and so on.

As Jeffrey Kuhner of the Washington times wrote: "Every major institution has been captured by the radical secular left. The media, Hollywood, TV, universities, public schools, theater, the arts, literature — they relentlessly promote the false gods of sexual hedonism and radical individualism ... Tens of millions of unborn babies have been slaughtered; illegitimacy rates have soared; divorce has skyrocketed; pornography is rampant; drug use has exploded; sexually transmitted diseases such as AIDS have killed millions; birth control is a way of life; sex outside of wedlock has become the norm; countless children have been permanently damaged — their innocence lost forever — because of the proliferation of broken homes; and sodomy and homosexuality are celebrated openly. April 1: Join Bishop Powers and your State Chaplain, Father Rick Heilman, at the Cathedral in Superior for your <u>Into the Breach</u>, <u>Awaken Sons of God</u> tour event in the Superior Diocese. I hope to see you there!

April 29: Join your entire State Officer Team for a first-of-its-kind, special Kick-Off Presentation on Friday night of your annual State Convention. If you were not able to attend any of the five "Into the Breach, Awaken Sons of God" events, here is your chance to get a small taste of what you missed. The presenter, your State Chaplain, Father Rick Heilman, is the author of several books, including the popular "54 Day Basic Training in Holiness," and a veritable fixture on Relevant Radio.

April 30: Consecration to the Holy Family – Opening Convention Mass. This comes to us directly from our Supreme Knight, Carl Anderson. Here is his message to all of us:

As we begin to implement the Building the Domestic Church While Strengthening Our Parish initiative announced at the Midyear Membership Meeting in San Antonio, I want to advise you of two new related activities that will be announced in my February Columbia column.

First, the Supreme Chaplain has composed a Consecration to the Holy Family. A new prayer card featuring this consecration is being developed and samples will be sent to you in the coming weeks.

To help launch this initiative, I would ask that this consecration be included in the Opening Mass of your state convention this year. It would be most appropriate if one of the blessed images of the Holy Family could be carried in procession and placed in the sanctuary for your Opening Mass. At an appropriate time, the celebrant could invite all those present to make the act of consecration together.

June 19: Special Father's Day Corporate Communion and Affirmation of Wedding Vows. This also comes to us directly from our Supreme Knight, Carl Anderson. Again, here is his message to all of us:

Second, councils will be asked to host corporate communions on Father's Day (June 19, 2016) — inviting members and their families to attend Sunday Mass together — and request that the celebrant officiate at a Father's Day Affirmation of Wedding Vows. Councils may also consider hosting a special reception after Mass to further celebrate the commitment of married couples in their parish. Support materials for the council and celebrant will be developed in the coming months.

October 7: Holy Hour with Benediction and Consecration. This was already in the works in Wisconsin when this message came to us from Supreme Knight Carl Anderson just days ago on March 9th.

As we continue to implement the Building the Domestic Church While Strengthening Our Parish initiative, I am writing to ask every State Council to expand our Holy Family Prayer Program by hosting a diocesan-wide "Holy Family Celebration" one Saturday in October.

These celebrations should be based on the existing, rosary-based Holy Family Prayer Program (#5050) already in use by councils, but should also be expanded to include the Consecration to the Holy Family (#10371) and a period of adoration and solemn Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. The program can also be supplemented in other ways, such as by inviting a Knights of Columbus family — perhaps your jurisdiction's Family of the Year — to give a witness talk. These celebrations could be held in a cathedral, major church or other suitable venue to facilitate the greatest participation possible, both by brother Knights and their families, and by the broader Catholic community.

NUMBER SIX: For number six, you will need to set the date. Number six is my personal invitation to you to join me, if you haven't already done so, as an insurance member of our order. What has this got to do with "first things?" Consider this. An insight came to me at the Madison Diocese "Into the Breach" event, as I prayed before the Blessed Sacrament. That is, a lot of Catholic men are really busy and might avoid making another commitment, such as joining the ranks of The Knights of Columbus. For that reason, it is very good to share with them that they can make a positive difference without spending any time. How, you may ask? Simple; just become a Knight and meet with thier Field Agent. They can help build a "Civilization of Love" by making sure the money they spend to protect their family is used only for good. In this battle in which we find ourselves, it is very good that we have a wholesome alternative to offer. They do not have to be subjected to having their own money used to undermine virtue, and damage their family members. Praise God that as Knights we have a better option!





Brother Knights,

This Past month we made a great push toward our goals for recruitment. We achieved over 9% of our yearly goal this past month. We also recruited a higher percentage of members than any other jurisdiction in Division 2 (states with membership 25,000 to 50,000 members). I thank all the members that helped bring in a new member. Your help with recruiting is what will help our order continue to make an impact is our Church and community for years to come.

The race for best Diocese in the state is getting close. The members in La Crosse are still on top with over 100% of their year to date goal. Close behind and back in second is Green Bay with 90% of the year to date goal. Falling to third is Superior with 84% of the year to date goal. In fourth and way behind is Madison with 61% of their year to date goal. Finally Milwaukee made some strides this month but still is off the pace with 50.4% of the year to date goal. We need to keep the momentum up and push through to June 30 with recruitment. Keep your schedules of the your first degrees and let no obstacle keep you from recruiting to the first degree date.

Make sure that you order your supplies for your March recruitment drive. The directions on where to find the order blank on the Supreme website were in you winter council packets you received from your District Deputy. Please make an effort now to organize with your local Parish Priest to have a recruitment drive soon. Always remember to help him and he will be in a better position to help you recruit and expand your presence in the parish.



*To be eligible for both the Family Fraternal Benefit Program, and the Orphan Fraternal Benefit Program, the member must be in good standing, and either he or his wife must be insured under a Knights of Columbus certificate requiring an annual premium of at least \$150, or providing at least \$5,000 in permanent life insurance coverage. Eligibility for the Orphan Fraternal Benefit Program is also contingent on the child being covered by an individual Knights of Columbus certificate.








Culture of Life Committee



On Saturday, November 19, about 15 people, KC members and their wives and children, will give one or two hours of time to prayer and fasting on the sidewalk near our local Planned Parenthood clinic. 40 Days for Life officially started in 2007. Since then there have been 3,895 total campaigns in:

- 607 cities
- 32 countries
- 675,000 individual participants
- 18.000 churches
- 11,165 lives saved from abortion
- 127 abortion workers quit
- 64 abortion facilities closed



Contrary to some politically correct beliefs, I think it is self-evident that men and women are different... Praise God! Women's bodies, minds and spirits are made to give and nurture life, to hold families together; men's bodies, minds and spirits are made to protect life and fight, if necessary, to defend life, the born and unborn. Let's take a stand for life, from conception to natural death, so that one day our children's children can proudly say "My grandpa took at stand for life" and that was when the whole country, supported by the government, supported by the Supreme Court, promoted abortion up to and including partial birth. How will we be judged if we don't make our voice heard on this issue?



At the culmination of the history of salvation, when God reveals his love for humanity through the gift of the Word, it is precisely the marriage of Mary and Joseph that brings to realization in full "freedom" the "spousal gift of self" in receiving and expressing such a love. "In this great undertaking which is the renewal of all things in Christ, marriage — it too purified and renewed — becomes a new reality, a sacrament of the New Covenant. ...

The Savior began the work of salvation by this virginal and holy union, wherein is manifested his all-powerful will to purify and sanctify the family — that sanctuary of love and cradle of life."

How much the family of today can learn from this! "The essence and role of the family are in the final analysis specified by love. Hence the family has the mission to guard, reveal and communicate love, and this is a living reflection of and a real sharing in God's love for humanity and the love of Christ the Lord for the Church his bride." This being the case, it is in the Holy Family, the original "Church in miniature (*Ecclesia domestica*)" that every Christian family must be reflected. "Through God's mysterious design, it was in that family that the Son of God spent long years of a hidden life. It is therefore the prototype and example for all Christian families."






