# State Chaplain's Message

My Brother Knights,

Students of history know that the Arian heresy – the worst crisis in the Church before our present age – was rooted in the belief that Jesus Christ was merely a created being, not equal to God the Father. But, there is something similar that is pervasive in our times; something I call, "Stealth Arianism." Stealth



Arianism follows the same fatal error as the original heresy, but with a twist: while the Arians of the fourth century openly denied Christ's divinity, today's Arians will profess Jesus as God, and yet through their actions deny it. In other words, they don't even know they are heretics. Many even believe that they are doing God's work in their attempts to elevate Christ's humanity at the cost of His divinity.

How do we recognize this pervasive Stealth Arianism? There is a story of two friends – a Catholic priest and a Protestant minister. They stood in the doorway of the priest's church, staring at the tabernacle in the sanctuary at the other end. The Protestant minister said to his priest friend, "You don't believe that is God in that tabernacle." The priest was startled, and said, "What do you mean? Of course I do." The Protestant minister said, "Listen, if I believed that was God, I would, right here and now, fall prostrate on my face and crawl toward that tabernacle, with tears of joy running down my face … you don't believe that is God."

In the second reading of the 5th Sunday of Easter, St. John says, "Children, let us love not in word or speech but in deed and truth" (1 John 3:18). Not many today openly deny the divinity of Christ by their words, but far too many deny His divinity by their actions.

In the Gospel from that same Sunday, Jesus says, "Just as a branch cannot bear fruit on its own unless it remains on the vine, so neither can you unless you remain in me. I am the vine, you are the branches. Whoever remains in me and I in him will bear much fruit, because without me you can do nothing" (John 15:4-5). When we deny His divinity – and our actions can sometimes prove that – we are cut off from that supernatural power to bear the fruit of becoming great disciples, great husbands, great dads, and great citizens. Without that divine life – state of grace – we are left to become base and savage ... merely homosapiens ... just another animal species, satisfying our base desires. *That* is why our world is the way it is today!

We must always worship and serve God in a way that says we believe He really is God. I believe that starts by dressing up for Sunday Mass. It is a simple thing, but our actions reflect what is in our hearts. If this is not something you see too much in your parish, start a trend; be the leader we knights are called to be, and let us always honor God as truly God.

(State Deputy continued) A year ago I wrote "When I was railing against the deep divisions in our Church and in our Order which allowed many to adopt a somewhat casual attitude toward one of the most profound issues of our day, the slaughter of innocents, Father Rick Heilman taught me to help build up a strong sense of the Sacred in our Church. And when I was railing against the unjust attacks upon our Church in this, our time, Bishop Donald Hying taught me to help build up a strong sense of the role of men as the spiritual leaders of their families."

Since that time I have had the distinct honor of having them both accept an appointment to the position of your State Chaplain. Praise be to God!

I am very happy to report that lately I have had the honor of representing you at the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of councils. While doing so I find it to be a bit of fun to talk about how different things were 100 years ago. Pretty much everything that is referenced evokes some gratitude for the great progress we have enjoyed in America over that time, thanks be to God and to our Veterans! Some of the items listed are:

Only 14 percent of the homes had a bathtub.

Only 8 percent of the homes had a telephone.

There were only 8,000 cars and only 144 miles of paved roads.

More than 95 percent of all births took place at home.

The American flag had 45 stars...

Arizona, Oklahoma, New Mexico, Hawaii and Alaska had yet to be admitted.

On the other hand, not every statistic from the past gives us a sense of progress. Statistics from 100 years ago were a little difficult to come by, so I looked at the last 50 years and found:

The number of seminarians has dropped dramatically, from over 41,000 to nearly 4,000.

Over 2,000 parishes in the U.S. now have no resident priest.

The divorce rate has way more than doubled.

The abortion rate was less than 1%, today it is 16%

But this is not a time for despair or for looking back. The number of seminarians is growing again and rates of divorce and abortion are both dropping. The majority of people now define themselves as Pro-Life and more Pro-Life legislation has been enacted in the last 3 years than in the entire previous decade. As we embrace our Vocation to Brotherhood, suspensions in our jurisdiction have dropped dramatically and there are new councils forming. Programs like This Man is You (TMIY) are giving young men a new way to connect and many of them are joining our ranks. The trends are turning in our favor. Momentum is on our side.

Tom Smith, the representative of our Supreme Knight at your State Convention noted some dramatic trends in our time and asked, "If not us, who, and if not now, when." Let our answer be that now is the time for us, the strong right arm of the Church, the Knights of Columbus, to continue to show by our steadfast example that these positive trends are not a fluke, but they are instead the sure signs of a great spirit of renewal that is growing in our world today.

For those of you who have kept the faith through the dark days, thank you. Your reward is close at hand. For those who have recently joined our ranks, you could not have come at a better time. Our record of Charitable giving is at an all-time high, both in dollars and in time volunteering. And in just one program example, in the first 5 years of the Ultrasound initiative the number placed into crisis pregnancy centers by our Order reached 500. In the 6 months since that number has reached 650!

There has never been a better time to be a Knight. It is a great treasure, and like all of the best treasures in life, the more we share it, the more it grows in value.



I will close this article with the same words with which I closed my first article one year ago. "My Brothers, let us beseech God that He will bless our "Charity that Evangelizes" by attracting men to our order in ever greater numbers that we may be His army, the "Strong Right Arm of our Church", building a "Civilization of Love." St. Joseph will provide the tools."

We, as a state do have a few issues to overcome to make our state a "growing state". The biggest issue is the amount of councils that have not recruited a new member this year. At the 5/10/15 mark in this fraternal year we have 98 of our council in the state that have not yet recruited a member. Another big issue is the amount of suspensions and withdrawals we have had. Again as of 5/10/14 we have had 485 member either withdrawn or get suspended. The issue that we have no control over is our members passing on to their final reward. As of 5/10/15 we have had 791 members die in this fraternal year. So in a span of 304 days we have lost and average of more than 2.6 members per day in the state. So if you are reading the monthly table correctly, we are 263 members behind of what we started 7/1/14 with. This is why we, as a state, need to think and act on membership recruitment. The need for member recruitment starts with everyone keeping positive and committed to asking every eligible Catholic male to become a member of the Knights of Columbus.

# **Holy Family Consecration**



# State Programs Coordinator, Bill Frayer

Brothers,

With 2 months left in our Fraternal Year, it's time to buckle down and ensure that you have completed, or will shortly be doing so, those requirements to earn your Star Council and Complete Council status! To do so you need to do the following:

- 1) Get those Church Drives in so that you are ensured of a +1 net for membership (gains over all losses) for the year for Complete Council. (meet or exceed your quota for Star!)
- 2) Hold that Benefits Night; work with your Field/General Agent to be sure you have a +1 net for insurance members for the year for Complete Council. (meet or exceed you quota for Star!)
- 3) Earn the Columbian Award get your Form SP7 in SOON!
- 4) Be sure that you had your Fraternal Survey (#1728) and Service Program Personnel Report (#365) were due on time for 2014-15! (For Complete Council they simply need to be in.)
- 5) Be in good standing with Supreme.
- 6) For Complete Council, meet the expectations in each of the 6 categories that are on the checklist you've all received at Diocesan/District meetings, on the state website or check with me for details.
- 7) Remember to get all your Supreme/State Report forms in promptly, with copies to your DD and your Diocesan Program Coordinator or me, as well as to State and Supreme! Also, be sure to let your DD and Diocesan Program Coordinator know if you have held a Memorial Mas, held a Faith Formation program, held a Benefits Night, participated in a pro-life march, contributed to an ultrasound initiative, etc. as there are no report forms for these activities.

As always, if you need help with any of these programs or forms, feel free to contact me at any time! Work with your DDs and Coordinators to get those Columbian Award forms in, any missing forms in; RSVP form, Food for Families form, Form 185 Officers Report in by June 30! Your Roundtable reports for the year were due in January and should be sent in soon if not already done.

As we wrap up our focus on Supreme's 8 featured programs for the year, we conclude with one that is both a wonderful program and one that Wisconsin has done very well with - the Ultrasound Initiative! It seeks to provide medally certified pro-life pregnancy centers with modern technology to allow prospective mothers to hear/see their babies in utero and monitor their development ("a window to the womb" as noted by Supreme Knight Carl Anderson.) Since the program began in 2009, over 400 ultrasound machines have been purchased through this program. When a Council(s)/District raises half of the cost of purchasing a machine, the Supreme Council will match the other half of the machine's cost. (Incidentally, the matching money comes from profits from the insurance arm of the Order!)

Before fundraising can begin, however, the Council(s)/District must locate/work with a pro-life pregnancy center prepared to use, receive, maintain the machine. They must also receive approval from the Diocesan Culture of Life Director. The Council(s)/District must be actively involved in raising the funds for half the purchase price. Refer to "Ultrasound Initiative Guidelines" and "Frequently Asked Questions" on the Ultrasound Project available at <a href="https://www.kofc.org/ultrasound">www.kofc.org/ultrasound</a> for complete guidelines for participation in the ultrasound initiative.

Finally, here in May I urge you and your Brothers to honor our Blessed Mother during her month with Council or parish rosary or other devotions. Also, honor all those who've died to preserve our freedom around Memorial Day all that you can - fly your flags proudly! I hope to see you all Friday, June 26 on KC Night at the Brewers! # A founding notion: protecting the breadwinner's income




## **Western District Fourth Degree**

## SUPREME INCENTIVE TO EARN THE STAR COUNCIL AWARD

If a council earns the Star Council Award (any level) in the 2014-15 fraternal year, it will receive a credit of \$4.50 (\$3.50 per capita and \$1 Catholic Advertising) for each billable member on its roster as of July 1, 2015.

The Star Council Award is Comprised of the: Father McGivney Award for membership growth, Founders' Award for insurance growth, Columbian Award for well-rounded council service programs and activities. Your council must submit the Annual Survey of Fraternal Activity (#1728), the Service Program Personnel Report (#365), and remain in good standing with Supreme Council assessments in order to earn the Star Council Award. The Star Council Award Plaque represents your council's earning of the Father McGivney, Founders' and Columbian Awards.

# 2015 Silver Rose Run for Our Lady of Guadalupe, Wisconsin Sunday, 7 June 2015, to Sunday, 28 June 2015 - One Life, One Rose

This is the 55th year of the program which began in 1960 as a project of the Columbian Squires of North America to honor the

Blessed Virgin under her title of Our Lady of Guadalupe, Patroness of the Americas. The First Rose was a natural rose. The program has continued as a project of Columbian Squires circles, councils and Fourth Degree assemblies working in unison to promote devotion to Our Lady of Guadalupe.

In the 1990s Supreme Knight decided to make the Silver Rose a Supreme Council program. The first effort consisted of one route carrying a Silver Rose from London, Ontario through the central U.S. to Texas for transfer to Mexico. Soon there were three Silver Rose routes, one mimicking the original route; another starting in Manitoba and moving to British Columbia, then down to the Pacific Coast before turning east into Arizona and on to Texas; and a third route starting in New York, then down the eastern seaboard, then to several southern states to Texas.



In 2001 the Supreme Knight expanded the program by establishing the "Running of the Rose" from <a href="www.runningoftherose.org">www.runningoftherose.org</a> the 119th Annual Meeting of the Supreme Council in Toronto. The "Running of the Rose" honors not only Our Lady of Guadalupe and the unity of the Order, but reaffirms the Order's dedication to the sanctity of human life. It is to the Blessed Mother that we turn in prayer as we work to end the Culture of Death that grips our society. As we think in terms of "One Life, One Rose," it is most appropriate that we turn to Our Lady of Guadalupe who made known her will through Juan Diego and the miracle of the roses."

In 2015, one rose begins in Alberta and heads west to British Columbia before heading south along the Pacific coast and turning east on a winding path through the southwest and mountain states before reaching Texas. A second rose starts in Saskatchewan and heads south entering the United States in Montana and traveling through the northern US Rockies and the Great Plains on its way toward Texas. A third rose starts its run in Manitoba, moving south through the central United States and along the Mississippi before turning to Texas. A fourth Rose begins its journey in Ontario moving through the Midwest and some of the Mid-Atlantic States before ending in Washington, D.C. A fifth Rose begins in Virginia and journeys throughout the south on its way to Texas. A sixth Rose starts in Maine and travels throughout the northeast, completing its journey in Connecticut.

The four Roses going to Mexico will conclude their journey on Dec. 12, 2015, the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe, Patroness of the Americas, at the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Monterrey, Mexico. Also on December 12, 2015, the other two roses will have similar ceremonies to conclude their journeys, in Washington DC and Connecticut.

This is the second year that the Wisconsin Knights are part of the program. We will receive the Silver Rose from Minnesota on Sunday, 7 June, by the St. Croix River in Hudson. The Rose will be in Wisconsin for three weeks. The locations and dates are listed below. The details of the prayer services are being developed. We transfer the Rose to Iowa on Sunday, 28 June, by the Mississippi River, Hwy 18 at Prairie du Chien.

# Our Marriage Prayer

# Hello Brother Knights!

I want to thank everyone who stopped by the Our Marriage Prayer table at the State Convention! It was great to hear all your stories of how you celebrated the Our Marriage Prayer in February. I would like to share with you some of the ideas we heard as well as what we learned during our celebration of the event as well.

One council handed out prayer cards as parishioners arrived before mass. This allowed the parishioners to read the card beforehand so when the Our Marriage Prayer was led by a knight after communion, they already have an idea of what to say. The council said that as the parishioners were leaving, the parishioners said that they thought of a lot more couples who would want a prayer card so the council was able to hand out more prayer cards after mass as well. **This is brilliant!** 

Last year, our council printed out the Our Marriage Prayer print and its supplement and handed them out to couples as they were leaving mass. This year, we experimented with asking the parish to include the Our Marriage Prayer print and its supplement in their bulletin and then knights handed out the bulletin after mass. The intent of this was to help ensure everyone gets the print and supplement as well as leverage the cheaper cost of how the parish gets the bulletin printed. Our council simply reimbursed the parish for the additional printing expense. We learned a few lessons in this process.

This is cheaper than printing it separately

Some parishes can't print color

It reaches more people with a print they can hang on their wall at home

For the parishes that can't print color, we are looking at what it would take to make the Our Marriage Prayer print available in color that can be either inserted into the bulletin or just simply handed out separately after mass.

# **Preparing for Next Year**

As your council raises money throughout the year, I would prayerfully ask that you consider raising money to help pay for the Our Marriage Prayer event which will be held next year on February 14<sup>th</sup>, 2016, Valentine's Day!

Prayer cards cost \$12.50 for 500 cards

If you choose to reimburse parishes for including the OMP print and supplement in their bulletin, it will cost them about \$0.12/ bulletin. We are looking into ways to making these available separately as well.

Lastly, the OMP celebration is the only Knight event that offers the opportunity for Knights to be so visible in a mass setting. They can hold doors open as people enter, greet inside, lead the rosary, read the word, sing in the choir, distribute communion, lead the OMP after communion and hand out bulletins afterwards. If your council doesn't have a way to be visibly recognizes as knights, you may want to raise money to purchase vests or whatever your council chooses to help identify yourselves as Knights.



Celebrating the OMP event shows every parish couple that the council cares for their marriages. Perhaps during your next membership campaign at the parish, the impression left during the OMP event will cause a few more men to step forward and ask to be part of this fantastic organization!

# Because the family is the subject of the New Evangelization, we want to share our faith with other families.

# Important Tax Information for KofC Councils and Assemblies

As you know, the Knights of Columbus, including all subordinate councils, assemblies, and chapters (collectively referred to as councils), is a tax-exempt organization, recognized by the Internal Revenue Service as a fraternal benefit society under Section 501(c)(8) of the Internal Revenue Code. Notwithstanding our tax exempt status, each council is required by law to file an annual informational tax return with the Internal Revenue Service.



Most councils will file the IRS Form 990-N electronic postcard (also known as the e-postcard). If your council's gross receipts are more than \$50,000 but less than \$200,000 and its total assets are less than \$500,000, you will need to file a Form 990-EZ. If your council's gross receipts are more than \$200,000 and its total assets are more than \$500,000, you will need to file Form 990.

# Deadline to file annual return (all forms)

Each council must file its own tax return; there is no group or consolidated Form 990 filing. The returns must be filed by the fifteenth day of the fifth month following the end of the council's annual accounting period. For example, if your council's accounting period ends December 31, you must file a tax return by May 15 of the following year; if your council's accounting period ends June 30, you must file a tax return by November 15.

# Need more time to file a Form 990 (paper forms only)?

If you need more time to file your council's informational return, you must file a request for an extension at least one month before the due date. For example, if your council's accounting period ends December 31, you must file a request for an extension no later than April 15; if your council's accounting period ends June 30, you must file a request for an extension no later than October 15. Federal law imposes a penalty of \$20 per day, up to a maximum of \$10,000, for incomplete or late filings, unless you can show reasonable cause. # The website will not allow me to file a Form 990-N

If your council has recently been reinstated with the IRS or if your council is a new council, the filing system may not allow you to file a 990-N for your first year. A council cannot file a Form 990-N unless it is on the Supreme Council's Group Exemption List, which is updated annually by the Knights of Columbus Legal Department. If you are unable to e-file, please contact the Legal Department by email at <a href="mailto:tax.ein@kofc.org">tax.ein@kofc.org</a>

#### Conclusion

In addition to the annual filing requirement, each council is also responsible for conducting its affairs in a manner that is consistent with what is expected of tax-exempt organizations. Failure to do so may result in a council losing its tax exempt status.


