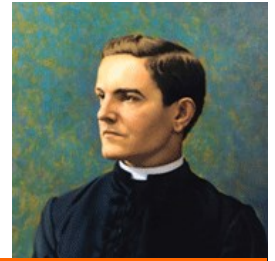

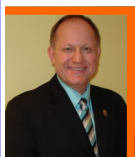

SK State Youth Program Director's Date Reminders

“Keep Christ in Christmas Poster Contest” district winners should be sent to me by the end of January for regional judging by January 31st and State judging for February 15th. All State winners need to be at Supreme by February 28th. See the “Keep Christ in Christmas Poster Contest” guide for full details.

“Substance Abuse Awareness Poster Contest” – district winners should be sent to me by March 15th as all posters are due to Supreme office by April 30th for International judging. See the “Substance Abuse Awareness Poster Contest” for full details.

Don't forget the “Substance Abuse Awareness Poster Contest”, “Keep Christ in Christmas Poster Contest”, “Catholic Citizenship Essay Contest”. All information is found on the Supreme website.

“Catholic Citizenship Essay Contest” district winners should be sent to me by March 15th as all essays are due to Supreme office by April 15th for International judging. See the “Catholic Citizenship Essay Contest” guide for full details.

BBFT should be running now in your schools and your district competition should be done in February and regionals done beginning of March. I need the regional / state results by March 15th - for Supreme and our State convention in April. If I get an exact

date from Supreme as to when they want their results – I will send that out. Be sure to coordinate with your fellow DD's within your region to set the regional date.

It is likely that most of our Brother Knights have, by now, heard or read about the Federal Governments' imposed requirement for employers to sign an attestation supporting reproductive and transgender rights in order to receive summer job grants.

We ought all to be very concerned about such a Policy being thrust upon employers, one that the Canadian Bishops along with other religious leaders have deemed as a discriminatory, ideological test that violates their Charter rights.

The Ontario Knights of Columbus have issued their clear backing of Canada's Catholic Bishops in opposing the Liberal Government's ban of pro-life and pro-family groups from receiving summer job grants.

We, as Saskatchewan Knights of Columbus can do our part by writing our MP to express our personal concern with the attestation and/or sign a petition to Prime Minister Trudeau. There are currently two petitions available and these can be accessed by going to MP Kelly Block's web-site and/or the Campaign Life Coalition web-site.

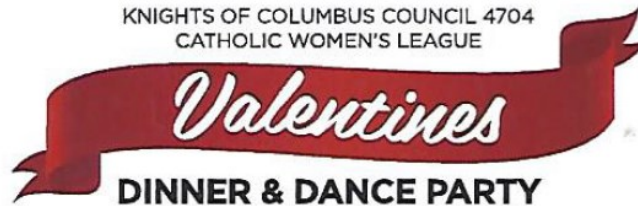
