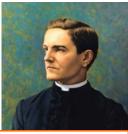

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Holly Butcher is an Australian women who died Thursday January 5, 2018 following a battle with Ewing's sarcoma, a rare form of cancer that affects mostly young people. She was 27 years old. Prior to her death, she wrote an open letter which she asked her family to post on Facebook following her death. The following is that letter.

A bit of life advice from Hol:

It's a strange thing to realise and accept your mortality at 26 years young. It's just one of those things you ignore. The days tick by and you just expect they will keep on coming; Until the unexpected happens. I always imagined myself growing old, wrinkled and grey- most likely caused by the beautiful family (lots of kiddies) I planned on building with the love of my life. I want that so bad it hurts.

That's the thing about life; It is fragile, precious and unpredictable and each day is a gift, not a given right.

I'm 27 now. I don't want to go. I love my life. I am happy. I owe that to my loved ones. But the control is out of my hands.

I haven't started this 'note before I die' so that death is feared - I like the fact that we are mostly ignorant to it's inevitability. Except when I want to talk about it and it is treated like a 'taboo' topic that will never happen to any of us. That's been a bit tough. I just want people to stop worrying so much about the small, meaningless stresses in life and try to remember that we all have the same fate after it all so do what you can to make your time feel worthy and great, minus the bullshit.

I have dropped lots of my thoughts below as I have had a lot of time to ponder life these last few months. Of course it's the middle of the night when these random things pop in my head most!

Those times you are whinging about ridiculous things (something I have noticed so much these past few months), just think about someone who is really facing a problem. Be grateful for your minor issue and get over it. It's okay to acknowledge that something is annoying but try not to carry on about it and negatively effect other people's days.

Once you do that, get out there and take a freaking big breath of that fresh Aussie air deep in your lungs, look at how blue the sky is and how green the trees are; It is so beautiful. Think how lucky you are to be able to do just that - breathe.

You might have got caught in bad traffic today, or had a bad sleep because your beautiful babies kept you awake, or your hairdresser cut your hair too short. Your new fake nails might have got a chip, your boobs are too small, or you have cellulite on your arse and your belly is wobbling.

Let all that shit go. I swear you will not be thinking of those things when it is your turn to go. It is all SO insignificant when you look at life as a whole. I'm watching my body waste away right before my eyes with nothing I can do about it and all I wish for now is that I could have just one more Birthday or Christmas with my family, or just one more day with my partner and dog. Just one more.

I hear people complaining about how terrible work is or about how hard it is to exercise - Be grateful you are physically able to. Work and exercise may seem like such trivial things ... until your body doesn't allow you to do either of them.

I tried to live a healthy life, in fact, that was probably my major passion. Appreciate your good health and functioning body- even if it isn't your ideal size. Look after it and embrace how amazing it is. Move it and nourish it with fresh food. Don't obsess over it.

Remember there are more aspects to good health than the physical body. Work just as hard on finding your mental, emotional and spiritual happiness too. That way you might realise just how insignificant and unimportant having this stupidly portrayed perfect social media body really is. While on this topic, delete any account that pops up on your news feeds that gives you any sense of feeling shit about yourself. Friend or not. Be ruthless for your own well-being.

Be grateful for each day you don't have pain and even the days where you are unwell with man flu, a sore back or a sprained ankle, accept it is shit but be thankful it isn't life threatening and will go away.

Whinge less, people! And help each other more.

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Give, give, give. It is true that you gain more happiness doing things for others than doing them for yourself. I wish I did this more. Since I have been sick, I have met the most incredibly giving and kind people and been the receiver of the most thoughtful and loving words and support from my family, friends and strangers; More than I could I ever give in return. I will never forget this and will be forever grateful to all of these people.

It is a weird thing having money to spend at the end. When you're dying. It's not a time you go out and buy material things that you usually would, like a new dress. It makes you think how silly it is that we think it is worth spending so much money on new clothes and 'things' in our lives.

Buy your friend something kind instead of another dress, beauty product or jewellery for that next wedding. 1. No-one cares if you wear the same thing twice 2. It feels good. Take them out for a meal, or better yet, cook them a meal. Shout their coffee. Give/ buy them a plant, a massage or a candle and tell them you love them when you give it to them.

Value other people's time. Don't keep them waiting because you are shit at being on time. Get ready earlier if you are one of those people and appreciate that your friends want to share their time with you, not sit by themselves, waiting on a mate. You will gain respect too! Amen sister.

This year, our family agreed to do no presents and despite the tree looking rather sad and empty (I nearly cracked Christmas Eve!), it was so nice because people didn't have the pressure of shopping and the effort went into writing a nice card for each other. Plus imagine my family trying to buy me a present knowing they would probably end up with it themselves. Strange! It might seem lame but those cards mean more to me than any impulse purchase could. Mind you, it was also easier to do in our house because we had no little kiddies there. Anyway, moral of the story- presents are not needed for a meaningful Christmas. Moving on.

Use your money on experiences. Or at least don't miss out on experiences because you spent all your money on material shit.

Put in the effort to do that day trip to the beach you keep putting off. Dip your feet in the water and dig your toes in the sand. Wet your face with salt water.

Get amongst nature.

Try just enjoying and being in moments rather than capturing them through the screen of your phone. Life isn't meant to be lived through a screen nor is it about getting the perfect photo. Enjoy the bloody moment, people! Stop trying to capture it for everyone else.

Random rhetorical question. Are those several hours you spend doing your hair and make up each day or to go out for one night really worth it? I've never understood this about females.

Get up early sometimes and listen to the birds while you watch the beautiful colours the sun makes as it rises.

Listen to music. Really listen. Music is therapy. Old is best.

Cuddle your dog. Far out, I will miss that.

Talk to your friends. Put down your phone. Are they doing okay?

Travel if it's your desire, don't if it's not.

Work to live, don't live to work.

Seriously, do what makes your heart feel happy.

Eat the cake. Zero guilt.

Say no to things you really don't want to do.

Don't feel pressured to do what other people might think is a fulfilling life. You might want a mediocre life and that is so okay.

Tell your loved ones you love them every time you get the chance and love them with everything you have.

Also, remember if something is making you miserable, you do have the power to change it - in work or love or whatever it may be. Have the guts to change. You don't know how much time you've got on this earth so don't waste it being miserable. I know that is said all the time but it couldn't be more true.

Anyway, that's just this one young gals life advice. Take it or leave it, I don't mind!

Oh and one last thing, if you can, do a good deed for humanity (and myself) and start regularly donating blood. It will make you feel good with the added bonus of saving lives. January 2018 Reflection

Convinced of God's Love and Power -The Family as Domestic Church and as Missionary Disciples

"Keep up with the Jones'!"

We have all heard this phrase or even thought of how to do this. As much of a temptation as it might privately be, we still have to ask ourselves "What is normal? Are we an average family?" The answer we give these comparative questions leads to decisions that are minor and sometimes major.

Comparing ourselves to the Holy Family is definitely more suitable. Rather than looking for an *average result* about who we are called to be, we should be aspiring to the Holy Family and the example given us. Today then, material possessions are no where near the goal we should set when compared to a family that still talks to each other, spends time with each other, goes on vacations together, goes to the lake with each other, even has regular meals together and wholesome socializing and interaction.

Evangelizing and being Missionary Disciples might feel like a high pressured call, but it can be described in a very simple manner. In fact, you are probably missionary more often than you know. You evangelize but never really knew it. **Step 1:** Pray for the grace and courage to let God use you today as a missionary disciple. **Step 2:** Share with another person a spiritual and prayerful moment you have had with God. It is easier to recall praying after receiving great news or very sad news. These moments often lead us to pray. The moment you prayed earnestly was indeed an encounter with Christ. Share a bit about the circumstances and what that prayer meant to you and that's it. That is evangelization in a very simple form. When we learn to do this in the family, we can understand why the pope's over several decades have encouraged families to be missionary disciples.

At the recent Plenary Session during the Convocation Of Catholic Leaders – The Joy Of The Gospel In America – on July 3, 2017, our Supreme Knight Carl Anderson quoted the Holy Father and the document *Familiaris Consortio.* "The family has the mission to guard, reveal and communicate God's love. It is to be an icon of God's love."

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Christ give couples the capacity to live the love necessary to form Missionary Disciples. The family is essentially missionary. Mr. Anderson quotes Pope Francis in *Amoris Laetitia*, who quotes the Vatican II document *Lumen Gentium*, "Spouses are consecrated and by means of special grace they are called to build up the body of Christ and form a Domestic Church." Do this by sharing your Christ encounters. God doesn't give us a call without giving us the grace to be whom we are called to be.

Pope Francis also remembers the wisdom proclaimed by Pope Paul VI.

Blessed Paul VI, in the wake of the Second Vatican Council, further developed the Church's teaching on marriage and the family. In a par-ticular way, with the Encyclical *Humanae Vitae* he brought out the intrinsic bond between conju-gal love and the generation of life: 'Married love requires of husband and wife the full awareness of their obligations in the matter of responsible parenthood, which today, rightly enough, is much insisted upon, but which at the same time must be rightly understood... The exercise of responsible parenthood requires that husband and wife, keep-ing a right order of priorities, recognize their own duties towards God, themselves, their families and human society' (No. 10). In the Apostolic Exhor-tation *Evangelii Nuntiandi*, Paul VI highlighted the relationship between the family and the Church. (AL Ch 3: 68)

You, as a knight and especially as a father, are an important part of the missionary team found in the family. Continue to reflect on this profound honour and mystery. Pray for grace. Share a prayer experience. That's it. May Our Lady of Guadalupe continue to give you the desire to lead your family as missionary disciples. The "Jones'" will hopefully want to be like your family.

Good planning brings success to your council, keeps your members active and possibly will encourage new members to join your council. The planner will also remind you of important Supreme and State programs. It is a great tool to keep track of all your council activities and to track your council's progress each month. Use the Success Planner to plan, track and report on your results.

Reminder of upcoming Report Form due dates:

Building the Domestic Church While Strengthening Our Parish – Building the Domestic Church initiative is a series of programs that will help members, their families and Catholics grow and develop in their faith. Many councils are successfully incorporating Domestic Church programs such as Family Rosary Services, the Journey to the Inn and Consecration to the Holy Family into their programming schedules. If your council has not yet done this here are a few suggestions on how to get involved:

1). Meet with your pastor to plan your 2018 event calendar. Parish priorities should drive your council's activities.

2). Read or watch the Supreme Knight's Domestic Church address, found at kofc.org/domesticchurch, under "Latest News."

3). Explore kofc.org/domesticchurch. There you can find resources to help your council plan activities.

4). Promote Building the Domestic Church: The Family Fully Alive (#10162). Order copies of the program for your members, and ask your Chaplain or lecturer to incorporate the monthly theme into your meetings.

5). Start a study group for your parish and council using Bishop Olmsted's Into the Breach (#340). In particular, focus on discussing and implementing the "Practices of a Committed Catholic Man" mentioned in the booklet.

It is important to note that Building the Domestic Church programs are not intended to replace those that your council is already successfully implementing. It is however, recommended that every council evaluate each program they sponsor, modifying or eliminating those that do not meet the needs of the members, parish and community.

To earn the Columbian Award, SP-7, councils must now conduct at least four Surge with Service activities that are also designated as Domestic Church activities.

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STATE COUNCIL RECOGNITION PROGRAM

ACTIVITY PROGRAM AWARDS:

Each year, the Activity Program Awards recognizes those councils conducting outstanding activities in each of the ten category activities: Church Activity, Community Activity, Council Activity, PR/Communications Activity, Culture of Life Activity, Family Activity, Membership Activity, Special Olympics Activity, Youth Activity and Young Adult Activity.

Activity has to be submitted on the Council Activity Program Description Form and forwarded (electronically preferred) to the State General Program Director with copies to District Deputy and Council file before December 31, 2017.

Copy of the form can be located on the State website, <u>www.kofcsask.com</u>.

Councils can submit their reports to me, whether it be in electronic format or a hard copy. E-mail address is www.kofc.saskstate.sgpd@kofcsask.com.

Activity Program Awards will be based on two levels:

- 1. Large Council 70 plus members
- 2. Small Council 69 and less members

Award will be based upon the **total activities** conducted in each of the ten categories by the council from March 1, 2017 to December 31, 2017.

Judging will be based on:

- 1. Activity originality was this a new 2017-2018 activity for the Council.
- 2. Nature of the activity was it designated as one of the Domestic Church programs.
- 3. Participation of members in activity how many members and percent of membership participated?
- 4. Results what was the purpose of the activity? Did the results affect the Church, community council, family or youth?

ACTIVITY PROGRAM STATE-WIDE RECOGNITION

Each individual State Program Director (SPD) will be responsible for selecting the single best Church, Community, Council, PR/Communications, Culture of Life, Family, Membership, Special Olympics, Youth and Young Adult total activities conducted by an individual council in the twelve month period between the state conventions. Each SPD will review their respective category Council Activity Program Description Form for completeness and accuracy. Each SPD will have control over what activities councils can claim on reports for their respective categories. Each SPD must establish a reason for disallowing an activity claimed in their respective category.

Plaques will be awarded to each council selected for best total activities in each of the ten categories. Certificates will be awarded to each 2nd place council selected in each of the ten categories. All plaques and certificates will be handed out at the annual convention of the State Council.

SUPREME/STATE COUNCIL SERVICE PROGRAM AWARDS:

Form STSP - State Council Service Program Awards form for Church, Community, Council, Family, Culture of Life and Youth.

Supreme Council is looking for one activity that best exemplifies each Service Program Category. Describe in great detail the Service Program activity that you have chosen. Include pictures of Brother Knights and their families who were involved with the activity. The pictures should have a written narrative explaining what is contained in the picture. Councils can also include letters, newspaper clippings, pamphlets, etc.

The completed STSP form, with all supplementary material, can be submitted at any time during the year to the State General Program Director. It is recommended that the report be sent in by March 1, 2018 with the nominations for the individual awards.

OVERALL PROGRAM AWARD - ONE PER CLUSTER AREA

- Council must fulfill all 8 of these requirements to be eligible of consideration for this award:
- 1. File Form 185 Report of Officers Chosen for the Term by June 30, 2017.

- 3. File Form 1728 Annual Survey of Fraternal Activity by January 31, 2018.
- 4. File Form 1295 Semi-Annual Council Audit Report for period ended June 30, 2017 by August 15, 2017.
- 5. File Form 1295 Semi-Annual Council Audit Report for period ended December 31, 2017 by February 15, 2018.
- 6. All State and Supreme bills paid.
- 7. Show membership increase.
- 8. Conduct at least four programs in each of the six major categories (Church, Council, Community, Culture of Life, Family and Youth). Four of these activities must be designated as Domestic Church programs.

OVERALL PROGRAM STATE-WIDE RECOGNITION

One council in each of the six (6) State Cluster Areas will qualify for this award. The council must meet all 8 of the above listed requirements to be selected for the award. The State Deputy and State General Program Director will be responsible for selecting the Overall Program Award for each of the six cluster areas.

Plaques will be awarded to each council selected in each of the Cluster Areas for meeting all of the necessary requirements. Plaques will be handed out at the annual convention of the

CULTURE OF LIFE REPORT

I would like to comment on three initiatives that have been proposed to be conducted in this Columbian year for which Brother Knights are asked to assist with. These include:

- A Province-wide "<u>Conscience Protection</u>" <u>Postcard</u> distribution campaign asking for all Catholics and various other Christian Faith Followers to sign the Postcard. It is intended to request our Saskatchewan MLA's to provide, through Law, protection for the conscious rights of Health Care Professionals from having to act against their conscience with respect to medically assisted dying and abortion. Of particular interest is the medical assistance in dying bill that was passed in the Manitoba Legislature this past November which can be accessed by the following link: http://web2.gov.mb.ca/bills/41-2/b034e.php.
- The Dying Healed Program, a project of 'Life Canada' seeks to educate and prepare lay people in the fact that their presence at the bedside of a lonely or dying person is an invaluable service. It is an attempt to reach out to those who feel that life has no value; the elderly, disabled, ill and dying – those most at risk of giving up and most susceptible to the ideas that have come with the advent of legalized euthanasia and assisted suicide. This Program is presently underway within the Diocese of Saskatoon and within the Ukrainian Catholic Eparchy of Saskatchewan. We are very optimistic that this Program will soon also be made available within the Dioceses of Prince Albert and Regina.
- The 2018 <u>March for Life planning is underway with Sask. Pro-Life, Campaign Life and Saskatchewan Knights of Columbus working together towards formulating this Event. The Saskatchewan March for Life at the Legislature is set to be held on Tuesday, May 8, 2018.

Planning will continue to proceed and develop for all three of the above endeavors and, as they do, we will attempt to keep Brother Knights informed through the Sask. Knightline and, if need be, through specific notices.

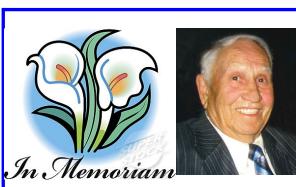

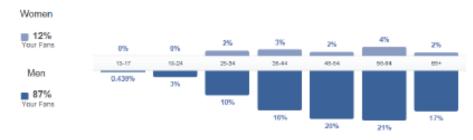
