At this meeting we discussed if the councils in the Wisconsin Jurisdiction are relevant in the programing they do today. We asked if our councils are relevant in membership growth. Our membership is starting to show some increase but we have a long way to go. State Membership Director Jon Olson and his membership team are committed to doing everything they can to help your Council achieve your goals. It is not just about numbers, remember without members there are no programs and with no programs there are no members.

We have many programs that are successful today, but what about tomorrow? If we do not grow our membership these programs may not have the manpower to help all those who are in need. Remember "One Member – Per Council – Per Month" We also asked if our councils are relevant in protection of our families. One of Father McGivney's dreams was the protection of a member's family if a member dies. Our General Agents and Field Agents are charged with this duty. We need to help them do their duty by inviting them to your council meetings and our homes to insure we are protected.

We also had a chance to explain the changes to the Wisconsin's Charity Raffle and the relevance to helping people who are in need, the first principle of you order, Charity. These changes have not been taken lightly by the Charity Committee or the State Officer but

need to be made for us to stay in compliance with Wisconsin Gaming Commission as a result of the audit done in the early part of this year. If you still have any question after your district meeting, please contact a member of the Charity Committee or one of the State Officers for further clarification. I think PSD and Good of the Order Chairman, Wenzel Felber summarize the effect to the councils most elegantly when he stated; "Like in the movie Fields of Dreams if you build it, they will come and for our Charity Raffle if you sell the tickets, the council will have money for their charity fund."

The Food for the Family Project will demonstrate your council is relevant. Your Council needs to \$500.00 to a local food bank or 500 pounds of food to a local food bank and the Supreme council will rebate you \$100.00 with a maximum rebate per fraternal year of \$500.00. The report form is on both the State and Supreme web sites.

Another program to show your council is relevant is Coats for Kids Program. If your home Council wishes to order coats contact Robert Ennis at Supreme with your order. Robert's E-mail address is robert.ennis@kofc.org or look on Supremes web page at www.kofc.org and click on the link. Let's do all we can to help our kids keep warm this winter.

One of the programs that tell me the councils in the Wisconsin Jurisdiction are relevant is the collection for Sentiments for Seminarians program, which was again a huge success. We received enough sentiments to send each of the diocesan Vocation Directors approximately 500# of soaps, deodorants and other sentiments. We also received over \$4,000 in gift and/or gas cards to help the seminarians in their travels. The Seminarians with be well taken care of in the upcoming year because of your generosity. Thank You to all of the Councils that participated.

Finally, watch your mail boxes between Christmas and New Year for your Convention packets. It's very important to open it and make your reservation early. The Convention will be in Wisconsin Dells Bay the weekend of April 26th and 27th. Let's do our part to bring the attendance up this year.

#### 2014 KNOWLEDGE CONTEST

#### Council Level

The countdown to the State Contest at Assumption H.S. in Wisconsin Rapids begins on January 4, 2014. Participating councils may obtain master copies of the 2014 Math and Spelling Contest Booklets and Answer Sheets from their District Deputies AFTER the December D.D. Meeting. Be sure to fill in the Council and District Numbers and the Diocese on the COVER PAGE of each Master Copy BEFORE you have the booklets printed!

All students in Grades 5 - 8 in private or public schools or home schooled are eligible for this contest.

Council Knowledge Contests should be completed by February 8th and the First Place winners and the number of participants at each grade level must be submitted to the Diocesan Coordinators promptly!

- 1. "Double" winners in Math, Spelling or Free Throw Shooting must choose ONE event at the Diocesan level.
- 2. Winners advancing to the Diocesan Contest must be given a TRAVEL CARD to be shown at the registration table and to be used to gain admission to the contest room. The cards are to be collected after the contestants have filled out the cover page of the contest booklet.
- 3. TRAVEL CARDS must be filled our COMPLETELY and ACCURATELY!
- 4. Efforts should be made to send an alternate (the 2nd Place winner) if the 1st Place winner opts out of the Diocesan Contest.
- 5. Each participating council is responsible for awards the State Council provides medallions for the Diocesan and State winners.

#### Diocesan Coordinators

The place, date and times of all Diocesan Contests must be made known to all participating councils so that NO eligible contestants miss their opportunity to compete!

Your Diocesan Contests should be held by March 8, 2014. The date of the State Contest makes this necessary!

- 1. First and Second Place winners at the Diocesan Level are eligible for ONE event at the State Contest.
- 2. Each contestant must have a specific TRAVEL CARD with them when they register for the State Contest.
- 3. Diocesan Coordinators must make sure that their winners have enough time to make travel arrangements for the State Contest.
- 4. Arrange for alternates if necessary in a timely manner.

#### State Level

I respectfully ask Diocesan Coordinators to send me the names of their First and Second Place Winners and the number of Council Participants at each grade level PROMPTLY!!

This information is included in the packets for each of the councils, handed out by the District Deputies at their local meetings. Some of the information, that was presented is included here with this article, and I hope you find it helpful. Send all applications to my home address listed at the bottom of this article.

- Start working now by selecting a family you want to nominate for Family of the Year.
- The FOY nomination deadline is February 15<sup>th</sup> 2014.
- It takes time to put together a good nomination.
- The State Family of the Year winning nomination is sent to Supreme for consideration for the International Family of the Year award.
- Good families are those that are continuing to do the work of Jesus Christ.
- Nominations should be assembled into binders, up to a 2 or 3 inch size binder.
- Include photos of family members participating in activities.
- The selection committee uses only the information provided to make FOY selections.
- Include letters of recommendation from their Pastor and other Community leaders.
- Involve the family in gathering nomination information, they are the best source.
- Glean scrapbooks for information on selected families.
- Please don't expect the family to fill out and prepare their own nomination.
- Last year one diocese did not participate in the Family of the Year program.
- Last year many nominations consisted of only 2 sheets of paper.
- Take some time in your council meetings to talk about the Family Programs.
- Ask your Family Committee how they are doing on their nominations for Family of the Month and Family of the year.
- Honoring families and publicizing who they are and what they do will encourage other families to become Knights of Columbus families.

This form is used by the Supreme Council to determine the amount of grant we receive each year. It is important that ALL councils file this form on time, whether or not they have been active or donated anything. This year I would like to see 100% of councils file this form.

I will be sending a report to the Grand Knight in late December or early in January listing donations received Tootsie Roll checks and Recycling income for the year 2013. Please include this with any other donations your Council may have made to local Special Olympics groups.

On it you will find areas for volunteer hours, event specific volunteers, year around volunteers, number of events volunteers worked, and total funds contributed. This all factors in to determine the amount we receive from Supreme, as well as percentage of councils that file this form on time.

When filing this form by mail, be sure to send a copy to the State Deputy and myself. If you efile the form be sure to send to the state deputy as well, and he will send me a copy. I do keep track of all the forms that are filed and compare with the Supreme office. If any discrepancies I can get them changed.

#### **Resolutions** - Gordy Kremer, State Advocate

#### Resolutions for the 113<sup>th</sup> Annual Wisconsin State Council Knights of Columbus Convention

Resolutions are due into the State Advocate by Feb. 1, 2014.

Each council can propose a resolution. The resolution must be adopted at the respective council meeting. Then the resolution must be signed and submitted by the Grand Knight to the State Council.

It is through the Resolution Process that the State and Supreme Programs and Bylaws are changed.

**Strategies for writing a Resolution** 

Reference: Robert's Rules in Plain English (Second Edition)

A resolution is a main motion submitted in writing.

A resolution consists of two parts:

The **preamble**, which begins with "Whereas"—providing the reasons and background information for support.

The second part begins with "resolved"—containing a motion to be adopted.

Keep the resolution brief and well-written.

Punctuation of a properly written resolution is a high priority. Each clause is written as a paragraph that is punctuated with a semi-colon. No matter how lengthy the resolution is, the only period appears at the end. The first word of each clause in the **preamble** and "That" in the **resolved section** are capitalized.

#### **Acting On A Resolution**

The resolves of a resolution are stated (by the presiding officer) and acted upon like any other motion. They are also open to amendment. When it is adopted, the preamble is presented. Presenting the preamble last allows for any amendment of the resolves, which may also require amendment of the preamble.

- Throughout the program, the State Warden will periodically ask for updates on the number of services and the number of attendees...these completed log books will be the only means to access that information.
- A supply of Immaculate Conception Prayer Books and Immaculate Conception Prayer Cards for each image will be provided. These will come in a sturdy plastic briefcase, again to allow safe transportation throughout the jurisdiction. Supreme has also post electronic versions of these books and cards to the Order's web site at <a href="www.kofc.org">www.kofc.org</a>. These supplies will not last the duration of the program, you'll be able to order additional quantities at any time through our State Warden... please allow about two weeks for delivery.


