Sir Knights,

The January 21st March for Life in Washington, DC was an awesome event. Temperatures hovered around 20 degrees; never above freezing as organizers, Virginia Knights of Columbus Marshals (approximately 80) and thousands of supporters from all over our Nation gathered to show growing sentiment against the Roe vs Wade. The decision needs to be overturned and this may be the year as many believe it should not be a Federal Law but decided at the state level. The March occurs near the anniversary of the Supreme Court's Roe vs Wade decision making abortion legal. March for Life President Jeanne Mancini said "Roe is not settled law", and the crowd was in agreement. There is a growing number of congressmen and Americans who agree that the law should be overturned.

DEACON BRIAN'S REFLECTION

My brother Sir Knights,

I did not attend the March for Life this year. I'm at an age now that I can use it as an excuse for any number of things. And it was bitter cold to boot! Nevertheless, thousands did attend and as I listened to the talks and watched the march on TV I was very heartened by the strength and perseverance of our Catholic witness. My son came down from NYC with his and his wife and baby boy to march. They joined countless numbers of other young families and youth whom we should all be grateful to for continuing the fight and for not buying into the pressures and lies of today's society that would have them believe that life before birth is no life at all. They are today's obstacle to a secular philosophy that would have them surrender all sense of the divine and of the humanity of a child in the womb. Each is a unique person from that moment of conception and whose existence will long survive this life, for they, like all of us, have been created for eternity and they will not be denied because of the passion, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

EWTN had a reporter moving among the marchers asking their reaction and thoughts about the day's event. One she briefly interviewed was Supreme Knight of the Knights of Columbus, Patrick Kelly. Supreme Knight Kelly noted that the Knights of Columbus were proud to have been among the original organizers of the March for Life 49 years ago, and have participated every year since. But it was a particular comment of his that struck me as one that could stand as a motto of the Knight of Columbus alongside that of "In service to one, in service to all." He said being a Knight is "to sacrifice for others." Can there be a higher calling?

"To sacrifice for others" is, of course, precisely what Jesus did for all humanity; the spotless lamb who became the Lamb of God sacrificed for our salvation, the ultimate sin offering. But what does it mean for us to say, as the Supreme Knight noted, that being a Knight is "to sacrifice for others." We might say it is simply putting the needs of others first. It is being generous with our time and treasure for the good of others. The four pillars of the order: Charity, Unity, Fraternity and Patriotism all imply sacrifice for others.

Consider that we live in one of the most prosperous and highly educated nations on earth. In that regard we are both blessed and highly privileged. But, as we are well aware, prosperity and higher education have not always produced social contentment or justice.

Privilege can cut two ways. Privilege can engender a sense of superiority and aloofness, or it can arouse a deep sense of humility. A Knight understands that the privilege we enjoy in the gift of our Catholic faith, and the privilege we enjoy as citizens of this great country, are themselves gifts from God. We do not disparage our flag or attack the institutions of government as some in our society have done. We do, on the other hand, peacefully and earnestly seek to overturn unjust laws. With humility we recognize we are but stewards of the privileges we enjoy, actively using them for common good. This too, in a phrase, is "to sacrifice for others."

On behalf of the Virginia Catholic Conference, the Dioceses of Arlington and Richmond, and Virginia Society for Human Life you are invited to the first annual Virginia Defending Life Day on February 9, 2022!

On this day, pro-life Virginians will come together in Richmond to meet directly with their legislators to encourage them to defend human life from the moment of conception to natural death. The goal is to assemble advocates from every district in the Commonwealth in order to advocate on behalf of the unborn.

The host organizations will gather pro-life constituents (that's you!) in the morning at the Richmond Convention Center to organize advocacy teams, receive guidance for meeting with members, and gain inspiration from pro-life leaders. District groups will then walk over to their legislators' offices to meet with Senators and Members of the House of Delegates.

Your personal presence is vital. Not only can your voice powerfully support pro-life members of the General Assembly, but also encourage those who have voted against pro-life bills in the past to reconsider their views. We need our legislators to see we are engaged and expect to see them pass life-affirming legislation.

MARCH FOR LIFE

His Excellency, the Most Reverend Timothy P. Broglio, J.C.D., Archbishop for the Military Services, led the AMS delegation through the heart of the nation's capital in sub-freezing temperatures. The peaceful, demonstration in defense of human life was joined by tens of thousands on the one-mile route from the Washington Monument to the steps of the U.S. Supreme Court, where the Roe v. Wade decision legalizing abortion was handed down 49 years ago Saturday. The theme of March for Life 2022 was "Equality Begins in the Womb."

Just before the march, in his homily at the daily noon Mass in the main chapel of the Edwin Cardinal O'Brien Pastoral Center, Archbishop Broglio reminded marchers a strong prayer life must feed outward demonstrations of witness to the Gospel. He borrowed from Saint Bernard of Clairvaux (1090-1153) the analogy of a reservoir:

"We fill up with Christ so that we are in a position to share of our abundance. The reservoir retains water until it is filled and then discharges the overflow without loss to itself. We depend on reservoirs for our water supply and in times of trouble there is no water if it has not been stored. There is no ability to announce the truth if we have not spent time with the Lord, been nourished by His word, and strengthened in sacrament. We cannot get up and march if we are not filled up with Jesus Christ and a desire to share His life with others. We cannot teach if we do not draw the fullness of the Gospel of Life."

Having spent time with the Lord at Holy Mass, Archbishop Broglio noted, "We will go forward to give witness to our faith and proclaim the dignity of human life."




