
MARCH FOR LIFE

The Annual March for Life held in Washington D.C is run and coordinated by the MARCH FOR LIFE Education and Defense Fund (www.marchforlife.org). The "March for Life", is against the U.S Supreme Court ruling, responsible for a documented 56 million abortions through the Roe v Wade decision. This year due to the Presidential Inauguration, the 2017 March for Life will be held on Friday, January 27, 2017.

Our Supreme Knight Carl A. Anderson is very supportive of this event and wishes that State Councils, also actively show their support to Life's Principles and Jeanne Monahan. She is the new president of the March for Life Education and Defense Fund, taking over for the late Nellie Gray.

For the past 42 years, the Knights of Columbus of New Jersey have been participating in the March for Life. This march gives us the opportunity to publicly express our abhorrence of the decision to allow abortion on demand, and let it be known to our elected representatives of our concern for life. More than ever we should have greater word and visibility. Grand Knights or Coordinators should plan on contacting their elected officials. Request a meeting with them on the day of the march. If they're not going to be in Washington, we advise that attempts should be made to meet with them at their respective home office other than that day. Good long- term planning is needed in the participation for the March for Life.

With the rising prices of not only the buses, but gasoline also, now is a good time to group councils in the same district and have a general departure location. So, we can still have noticeable presents for the trip to Washington D.C in January. Groups that are organized under the auspices of the Knights of Columbus should notify the State Chairman, (address below) of their intentions for the March in December, so that adequate information could be posted on our State Council Web Site and diocesan newspapers of your buses. New Jersey Right to Life will be holding a state LIFE RALLY in Trenton letting our state officials know that there should be an end to abortion. It would be a great gesture if councils could support both events with those who are not able to make the long trip to DC and show up in Trenton. Councils that are unable to physically attend the march in Washington, DC and the life rally in Trenton can find some charity by making a donation to groups that would like to attend. The Christmas season is a wonderful time to celebrate Life! We are reminded of all the great things that one person can do if given a chance to live. What if Mary, a single girl who found herself pregnant, had had an abortion instead of relying on her faith in God that everything would be all right?

We Are Saving Lives! The ultrasound machines we have placed have been having a positive effect and have been saving lives! If you look on the home page of [the State Council Web Site](#) you will see a “slider” showing the current count. Together, we have saved thousands of lives! This counter will continue to update as time passes and information comes in from more pregnancy care centers. Be encouraged; we are making a difference!

Memorial Service for the Unborn. Consider holding a memorial service for all of those children killed by abortion. Their souls deserve to be prayed for! If your council has erected a monument to the unborn, consider holding it there. This would be a great activity to focus your parish’s attention on the scourge that is abortion.

March for Life. As we move into January, we have several Pro-Life programs approaching, and for which we must prepare. First, there is the March for Life in Washington on January 27 (so as not to conflict with the inauguration. If your council or parish has a bus going, be sure to submit the details to the State Council. There may be many people around the state who would like to go and would love to join you on your bus, if the even knew about it. Please fill out the form at this [LINK](#) by December 16 and help us spread the word.

Also, don’t forget the Life Rally in Trenton run by NJ Right to Life! It will be held on Monday, January 23, so you could really attend both! But if you can’t make it down to Washington, you and your council should support this local show of solidarity for the Pro-Life cause and the 20/20 Project. Save a Life/Share in Life. We have placed 25 ultrasound machines in our state, which are saving lives every week. But these machines (and the pregnancy care centers where they reside) need our support to continue in their work. Be sure to touch base with these centers regularly to find out what they need and how you can help. Do you have money sitting in your treasury (or that of your chapter or federation) for a machine, but have no place to put it? Then consider participating in these programs by donating that money to help defray operating expenses.

Catholic Citizenship. We need to turn the hearts of our fellow citizens away from abortion. Check out [this video](#) for some great suggestions on how to start a dialog! We also need to turn the hearts of our lawmakers. Here are [some good tips](#) for how to get their attention!

From Our Webmaster

More Than “*Just A Plaque*”

When you belong to a volunteer organization you do so with a commitment to its principles. If you are like most of my Brother Knights, you serve at the will of your superior officers and the indulgence of your family.

Most members don't wake up each morning with the forethought, “What can I do today to earn a plaque or a certificate for my hours of sacrifice from my family and in recognition of my generosity toward my fellow man?”

The smiles on the face of those we serve is satisfaction enough, and sometimes it is nice to be appreciated above and beyond. In the corporate world it is akin to saying, “I love my job, oh, and the paycheck is nice also!” And so it comes to pass...that in our volunteer sphere, to those individuals or councils who exemplify what it means to be charitable, may receive recognition for the passion and compassion given to their fellow man.

BUT with very few exceptions, no one individual or council can be recognized if the paperwork is never filed! It was the writings of Philosopher George Berkeley, Bishop of Cloyne, who in his *Treatise Concerning the Principles of Human Knowledge* (1710) gave rise to the more expanded question, “If a tree falls in a forest, and nobody is around to hear it, does it make a sound?”

Each month, only a handful of Councils name, or at least submit, a Knight of the Month form to State or Supreme. As of November 1st, New Jersey has 59,058 active members. So is it possible that only 3 or 4 Brother Knights did anything significant in the month of November?

Likewise with the monthly Family of the Month recognition – the recipient does not even need to be a Knight! As of the most recent census numbers (2010-2014), there are 3,188,498 families in New Jersey. Can it be that only 2 or 3 per month / year achieve the status worthy of recognition?

Last year, of 175 Councils with Council websites, only 11 took the 4 minutes to complete the website contest entry form. 4 minutes! One diocese had zero entries. Did the webmasters for the remaining 164 council websites not do an effort worthy of recognition?

To facilitate the process, the New Jersey State Council website (www.njkofo.org) has provided the means to complete and submit an application for virtually every State Council and Supreme Council program. Deadlines are going to be coming up fast and furious. In addition to the looming deadlines for Keep Christ Before Us Books (11/15); the Keep Christ in Christmas Card sets (11/25); and the March For Life Bus Report (12/15) forms, we have the following State forms available on-line:

- 9 forms with a February 1st deadline,
- 5 forms with a March 1st deadline,
- 17 forms with a March 31st deadline,
- 2 forms with a April 15th deadline
- 7 other forms with deadlines prior to June 30th, and 14 other forms to be filed “As Needed”

And that is *just* New Jersey State Council forms, there are scores of Supreme Council forms as well. Tempus Fugit!
