A WORD FROM THE FAITHFUL FRIAR

Dear Brother Knights,

The Four Gospels, Matthew, Mark, Luke and John, all have different starting point in the life and ministry of Jesus.

The Gospel of Mark, the shortest Gospel, does not mention the birth of Jesus. Mark's Gospel goes straight into the beginning of Christ's ministry with the opening words, "The beginning of the gospel of Jesus Christ." (Mk 1:1) The Gospel speaks of the events of Jesus's ministry proclaiming the Kingdom of God and our salvation won for us through Christ's death and resurrection.

The Gospel of Matthew begins with the genealogy of Jesus Christ. Matthew's Gospel goes through a long list of names beginning with Abraham through King David and finally to "Joseph, the husband of Mary. Of her was born Jesus who is called the Messiah." (Mt 1:16) In this Gospel, the birth of Jesus and the events of his life proclaiming God's Kingdom, all fulfils the Old Testament prophecies and law, and culminates in the death and resurrection of Christ.

The purpose of the Gospel of Luke is to record the events "that have been fulfilled among us, just as those who were eyewitnesses from the beginning and ministers of the word have handed them down to us." (Lk 1:1-2) Luke is telling us what he has heard and investigated surrounding the events of Jesus' proclamation of God's Kingdom. Luke shows that Jesus's birth, ministry, death and resurrection were all a part of God's eternal plan. Luke's Gospel particularly reveals that the Messiah intimately enters all the realities of our weak and fragile human existence. Jesus is Emmanuel, God with us! God mysteriously enters our lives and is closer to us than we realize.

The Gospel of John, like Mark's Gospel, doesn't mention the birth of Jesus. Rather John states, "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God." "And the Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us, and we saw his glory, the glory as of the Father's only Son, full of grace and truth. (Jn 1:1,14) Both in John's Gospel and his letters, the Apostle tells us that the reason for Jesus's coming into the world was to reveal the depths of God's love. "God is love." (1 John 4:8) God's love for us is fully revealed in the passion, death and resurrection of Jesus. The coming of God's Kingdom is the reign of love.

All the Gospels point to the same reality ... Jesus came to proclaim God's Kingdom of love, to die and rise for us because of the Father's love. We are loved!

Jesus's life is a gift of love. So may our lives be throughout the New Year of 2023.

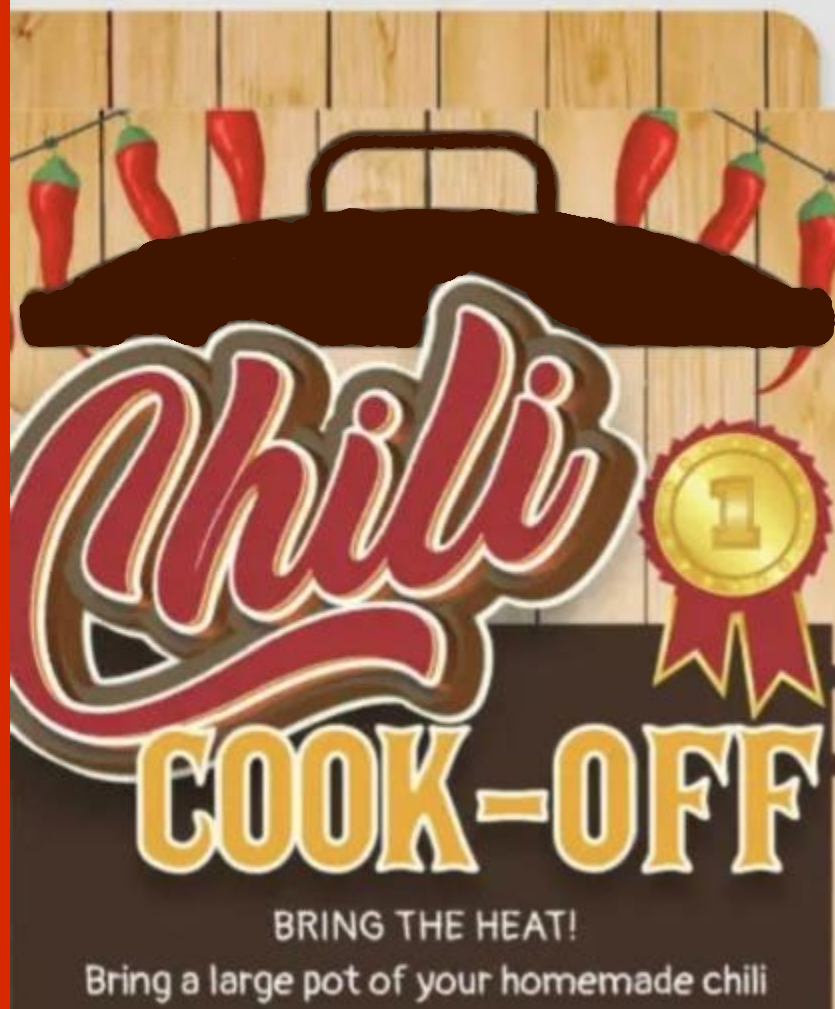

IN MEMORIAM

POPE EMERITUS BENEDICT XVI (1927-2022)



Born Joseph Aloisius Ratzinger on April 16, 1927, in Marktl, Germany. The youngest son of father Josef a police officer, and mother Maria, he grew up in a Germany infected by Nazism.

Joseph entered the seminary in the early years of World War II, and was bitterly opposed to Adolf Hitler and the Nazi regime. In the final years of the war he was conscripted in the German Army. With the Allies on the verge of victory, Benedict deserted and went home. After a brief stint in a prisoner-of-war camp, he returned to the seminary and, along with his brother, Georg, was ordained a priest on June 29, 1951.

Unlike most priests, Joseph logged little time in parishes. Instead, he embarked on an academic career and found himself moving to the conservative right as German campuses moved to the liberal left in the 1960s.

On 24 March 1977, Ratzinger was appointed Archbishop of Munich and Freising, and was ordained a bishop on 28 May. He took as his episcopal motto *Cooperatores veritatis* (Latin for 'cooperators of the truth') Joseph was considered a dominant intellectual figure in Roman Catholicism as he moved toward more conservative positions in the 40 years before he assumed the papacy. By 1981, he had become the prefect of the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith, the council — known during the 16th century as the Spanish Inquisition — that promotes and enforces church doctrine.

On 19 April 2005, Ratzinger was elected the 265th Pope in the history of the Roman Catholic Church. He took the name Benedict in recognition of his predecessor Benedict XV a renowned theologian. As pope, Benedict continued his theological writing and produced three important encyclicals or papal letters. The first encyclical, *Deus Caritas Est*, or “God is Love,” defends “charity” as love that is freely given. Charity is not simply a good deed but an act that changes both the giver and the recipient. His fierce resistance to what he saw as campaigns to secularize the church, promote women as priests, “normalize” homosexuality and encourage a liberal Latin American strain of Catholicism known as liberation theology led to his characterization as “God’s Rottweiler.”

On 11 February 2013, citing advanced age and health concerns, Benedict became the first Pope in nearly 600 years to resign as head of the Roman Catholic Church. He retired to a private living quarters in the Vatican and remained involved in church affairs, offering advice and imparting wisdom to his successor, Pope Francis. Benedict was received into Heaven on December 30, 2022.

Benedict was instrumental and influential in helping shape the modern church. He lived a holy life, a saintly life, and the church and all Catholics throughout the world were made better by his shepherding.

Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God

The Solemnity of Mary, the Holy Mother of God is a feast day celebrated on the Octave of Christmas, January 1, of the Blessed Virgin Mary under the aspect of her motherhood of Jesus Christ. It is recognized as the first of the 4 Marian Dogmas and celebrated as a Holy Day of Obligation in the Roman Catholic Church. Solemnities are the highest rank of liturgical celebration, higher than feast days or memorials. By celebrating a solemnity dedicated to Mary's motherhood, the Church highlights the significance of her role in the life of Christ. As we begin another year, we draw inspiration from the selfless love of the Blessed Virgin, who never hesitated to do the will of God. And we trust in her prayers to God for us, that we might, as the years pass, become more like her. O Mary, Mother of God, pray for us!



KNOW YOUR COUNTRY

Martin Luther King Jr. Day

Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. was born on January 15, 1929 and grew up in a racially divided southern United States under harsh Jim Crow Laws and segregation. In adulthood, King became active in fighting for voting rights of African-Americans and other ethnic minorities, against desegregation laws, labor rights, and as a leader in the Civil Rights Movement from 1955 until his assassination in 1968. King is best known for advancing civil rights through nonviolence and civil disobedience, inspired by his Christian beliefs and the nonviolent activism. His "I Have A Dream" speech in 1963 before crowds on the steps of the Lincoln Memorial in Washington D.C. is widely regarded as one of the defining moments of the Civil Rights Movement and among the most iconic speeches in American History. In 1983, the United States Congress and then President Ronald Regan signed into law that the third Monday of every January would be recognized as a Federal, civic holiday we commemorate the birthday of one of America's most renowned and regarded Civil Rights activist leaders and humanitarians.

A candidate may wear either a black, dark blue or dark grey business suit with a white shirt and tie or a black tuxedo, black bow tie, plain white shirt, black socks and black dress shoes.

Those who wish to observe the exemplification will follow the same dress code as the candidates.
