A WORD FROM THE FAITHFUL FRIAR

Dear Brother Knights,

We have entered our Lenten journey. Lest we can get caught up in the externals of Lent forgetting the purpose of the season, it is good to remind ourselves of its central purpose. Lent is certainly more than external symbols of ashes, processions and palms. It is certainly more than giving up candy, the Friday Fish Fries ... or cheese pizza.

The central purpose of the Lent season is to help us draw closer to God. To help us set our hearts on this Lenten journey look at the [Gospel of the First Sunday of Lent \(Matthew 4:1-11\)](#), The Temptation of Jesus.

"Jesus was led by the Spirit into the desert to be tempted by the devil." Jesus' heart was open to the Spirit and willingly lead into the desert, a lonely and dangerous place, to be tempted by the devil. In other words, Jesus willingly went into the desert to know our weaknesses. In this event, Christ is calling us too to go open our hearts to the Spirit to know and recognize the desert that is our weaknesses and sinfulness.

"Command that these stones become loaves of bread." Bread represents nourishment that satisfies our hunger, and it also means those things what provide false satisfaction. In our day, we command, demand and expect immediate satisfaction or gratification. Only God's word can provide us true nourishment, satisfaction and fulfilment. God, who is love, should be the deepest longing of our hearts.

"With their hands they (the Angels) will support you, lest you dash your foot against a stone." These words are test our sense of security, trust and reliance. There is no home security system, GPS, government agency, insurance police, amount of money or medical intervention that can provide true security in life. In the end, no matter what happens, our lives are in God's loving and divine Providence.

"The devil ... showed him all the kingdoms of the world in their magnificence." This is about the illusions of power and authority we think we have over people, situations or even our own lives. Whatever power or authority we think we might have, in the end, it's not about what we think we have or possess. Do we recognize the presence of God in the lives of other people? Do we recognize the presence of God in our own lives? Recognize the God's presence in the lives of other, God's Divine Providence and action in the daily situations of life and even in our own lives should humble us to bend the knee and worship the Almighty God of wonder who fills our hearts with joy! It's not about us and what we think, plan or want. Our lives should be about God's mission.

Lent is about focusing on God and letting God fill the void of our lives. Let God be God to make us whole. I pray that you and your loved ones have a grace filled Lenten experience.

Feast of St. Patrick (March 17)

The Feast of St. Patrick is a cultural and religious celebration held on 17 March, the traditional death date of Saint Patrick (c. A.D. 385–461), the foremost patron saint of Ireland. Saint Patrick's Day was made an official Christian feast day in the early 17th century and is observed by the Catholic Church. St. Patrick is historically recognized as the Christian Bishop who converted the island of Ireland to Christianity. Celebrations generally involve public parades and festivals, céilís, and the wearing of green attire or shamrocks. Historically the Lenten restrictions on eating and drinking alcohol were lifted for the day.



Feast of St. Joseph (March 19)

St. Joseph's Day is a Roman Catholic feast day commemorating the life of the earthly father of Jesus and husband of Mary. This day is celebrated each year on March 19. Many people — especially those of Italian descent — observe the day as a holiday. In Sicily, where Saint Joseph is regarded by many as their Patron saint, and in many Italian-American communities, thanks are given to Saint Joseph for preventing a famine in Sicily during the Middle Ages. Families build altars in their houses dedicated to St. Joseph or tables served with meatless dishes as the date occurs during the Lent season.



Annunciation of the Lord

The Feast of the Annunciation, commemorates the visit of the Archangel Gabriel to the Virgin Mary, during which he informed her that she would be the mother of Jesus Christ, the Son of God. It is celebrated on 25 March each year. In the Roman Catholic Church, when 25 March falls during the Paschal Triduum, it is transferred forward to the first suitable day during Eastertide. It is a major Marian feast, classified as a solemnity in the Catholic Church. Two examples in liturgical Christianity of the importance attached to the Annunciation are the Angelus prayer, and the event's position as the first Joyful Mystery of the Rosary.

“I received the sacraments as a kid, but never practiced or really understood the faith on my own. I bought into the modern mindset that religion was at best unnecessary or at worst a deceptive, therapeutic personal choice. However, during my freshman year of college at Michigan, I found two converging movements. First, I really started to question whether the life I was living and saw others living was morally good, and in parallel I was introduced to the writing of St Thomas Aquinas by a friend. Once I started seeing the Church’s teaching on faith and reason and reading the five ways, I actually consciously believed in God for the first time, and began to seek the mercy and forgiveness of that God. Then I began to start praying, learning more and more about God and the Catholic Church, and became convinced of the truth of the faith. After developing a basic prayer life, I began to fall in love with Jesus, and felt a tug in my heart and persistence in my prayer life to consider the priesthood after I graduated. I began to follow those pulls, and it led me to Mundelein!”

U.S. CAVALRY GUIDON

THROUGHOUT HISTORY, ARMIES HAVE CARRIED FLAGS. FLAGS PROVIDE A SENSE OF IDENTITY FOR A UNIT TO BUILD PRIDE AND MORALE. THIS IS THE REGULATION CAVALRY GUIDON THAT WAS CARRIED BY MOUNTED UNION TROOPS IN THE CIVIL WAR. IT USUALLY WOULD BE "CUSTOMIZED" BY PLACING A TROOP LETTER OR OTHER DESIGNATOR INSIDE THE CIRCLE OF GOLDEN STARS. THE U.S. CAVALRY LATER USED GUIDONS IN THE PLAINS INDIAN WARS. IN FACT, THE CAVALRY WAS THE LAST OF THE THREE BRANCHES OF SERVICE OF THE U.S. ARMY TO CARRY THE STARS AND STRIPES INTO BATTLE. THIS WAS ALSO ONE OF THE THREE FLAGS THAT COLONEL GEORGE A. CUSTER AND THE SEVENTH CAVALRY CARRIED AT THE BATTLE OF LITTLE BIG HORN.

THE U. S. ARMY REGULATIONS OF 1861 CALLED FOR INFANTRY REGIMENTS TO CARRY TWO FLAGS, THE NATIONAL COLORS AND THE REGIMENTAL COLORS. BOTH WERE NEARLY SIX FEET SQUARE, MADE OF SILK, AND FRINGED IN YELLOW SILK. THE REGULATIONS CALLED FOR EMBROIDERED WHITE STARS AND EMBROIDERED UNIT DESIGNATIONS ON THE CENTER STRIPE OF THE NATIONAL COLORS. IN PRACTICE, SILVER AND GOLD PAINT OFTEN SUBSTITUTED FOR THE REGULATION EMBROIDERY. SINCE SILVER PAINT TENDED TO TARNISH, IT WAS ABANDONED IN FAVOR OF GOLD. NO PATTERN WAS SET FOR THE PLACEMENT OF STARS ON THE FLAG AND THEY APPEARED IN ROWS, CIRCLES AND OVALS. THERE WAS LITTLE STANDARDIZATION AND MANUFACTURERS MADE FLAGS ACCORDING TO THEIR OWN INTERPRETATION OF THE REGULATIONS.
