FAITHFUL FRIAR MESSAGE

Dear Brothers in Christ,

The Ascension of the Lord, in most US Dioceses, will be celebrated on Sunday, May 12, which is also Mother's Day. In the Gospel that day (Mark 16:15–20), "Jesus said to his disciples: 'Go into the whole world and proclaim the gospel...' These words have echoed throughout the ages down to our day, to the disciples of today ... you and me!

The "whole world" is a big concept because it is a large sphere. As a missionary, I have traveled a lot of places for the sake of the Gospel, but I cannot say I have gone out to the entire world. For me, the whole world means your sphere of influence, i.e., where you are! That That is your family, friends and place of work. You can proclaim the Gospel in your sphere of influence.

The main question is how do you proclaim the Gospel? Answering the question and doing it is the hardest and most challenging part. The challenge we face today is no different than challenge the disciples faced ... well, at least we are not starting from scratch.

This being the month of May, it is appropriate to reflect upon your primary place of evangelization, your family. Evangelizing of any family is not an easy task in our modern world where individual freedom is highly valued and exalted. Nevertheless, family is important because that is where "love" is both nurtured and formed, and, ultimately, points to real and true love for as the scriptures tell us, God is love. (1 John 4:8, 16)

The best way to help each other grow in love for each other and God is through some form of family prayer. There are many creative ways to help a family to live in love and living in God's love. Family sharing and family nights is a way to grow in love and understanding. Participating in various community service projects or groups is a way to teach love of neighbor. Family prayer is also important to grow in love. Traditionally, the Rosary is used for family prayer. When I was a boy, as a family, we would pray the devotional prayer to the Sacred Heart of Jesus (short and sweet) after every evening meal. My sisters like to read bible stories to their grandchildren. The family of St. Arnold Janssen, the founder of my religious community, would read from the Prologue of John's Gospel (John 1:1-14) every Sunday after their evening meal. How is your family a witness to love and to God's love? Remember "the family that prays together, stays together." (Venerable Patrick Peyton, C.S.C., Priest)

IN HIS SPARE TIME, ENJOYED PLAYING MEMBER OF THE FR. RYAN COUNCIL MEMBER OF AMERICAN TOOK METICULOUS WILL BE REMEMBERED NEPHEWS (AND AS WELL) AS A STRICT HEART OF GOLD, WISDOM AND CARE. LEGENDARY AND HIS RIBBON AWARD COMPETITION.

KNOW YOUR FAITH

Pentecost Sunday (May 19)

Pentecost, which is celebrated fifty days after Easter Sunday, commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit in the form of tongues of fire upon the Apostles, Mary, and other followers of Jesus Christ while they were in Jerusalem celebrating the Feast of Weeks, as described in the Acts of the Apostles. Following the Crucifixion, the Apostles were hiding in locked ones in fear. Jesus appeared to them over a period of 40 days following Easter before ascending into heaven. At Pentecost, however, the Holy Spirit descended upon them, filled the entire house in which they were staying, and they began to speak in tongues so that everyone who heard them heard them in his own native language. Pentecost represents the turning point of the Church, where it becomes fortified by the Holy Spirit and boldly proclaims itself to the world instead of hiding in fear for its lives.



KNOW YOUR COUNTRY

Memorial Day (May 27)

On the last Monday of May, we dedicate this solemn date in honor and tribute to honor the men and women who have died while serving in the military. These fallen soldiers, sailors, airmen, and marines all made the ultimate sacrifice in the name of liberty, freedom, and democracy for countless millions of American citizens past, present, and future. Traditionally on Memorial Day, people visit cemeteries and memorials, and volunteers often place American flags on each veteran's grave site at national cemeteries. A national moment of remembrance takes place at 3:00 P.M. local time. We see people wearing red poppies, a tradition originating from World War I as a reference to the poppy flowers across the battlefields of Europe, to honor the dead.

The custom of honoring ancestors by cleaning cemeteries and decorating graves is an ancient and worldwide tradition, but the specific origin of Memorial Day—or Decoration Day, as it was first known—is unclear.

Memorial Day should not be viewed today as a day for parades and barbecues, but recognized for its existence thanks to the brave men and women who gave their lives in defense of our Country! Be sure to thank Veterans and active-service members, observe a moment of silence or visit veterans' graves if possible, and raise the American flag with honor and respect!

BROTHER MATHEW ZEMEL, S.V.D.

Celebrating 60 years as a Divine Word Missionary

Professed vows on May 1, 1964



BORN IN ROCHESTER, NEW YORK, IN 1943, BRO. MAT FOUND OUT ABOUT THE SVD IN THE 7TH GRADE THROUGH A FRIEND AT HIS CATHOLIC SCHOOL. HE ENTERED THE ORDER IN 1961 AT CONESUS, NEW YORK—WHERE HE ALSO LEARNED ABOUT WINEMAKING AT THE FORMER VINEYARD THE SOCIETY OPERATED THERE—AND PROFESSED HIS FIRST VOWS THREE YEARS LATER. TRANSFERRING TO TECHNY NEAR CHICAGO, HE ATTENDED THE MILWAUKEE VOCATIONAL COLLEGE WHERE HE WAS TRAINED IN CARPENTRY. THEN IN 1969, HE TRAVELED TO THE SUMMER JOB AT MIRAMAR AND THE COURSE OF HIS LIFE AS AN

SVD CHANGED.

BRO. MAT'S DUTIES CONTINUED TO EXPAND. IN 1988, HE BECAME TREASURER OF THE TECHNY SVD COMMUNITY. HE ALSO BECAME MANAGER OF ITS CEMETERY AND LIAISON WITH THE COMPANY THAT MANAGED A MUNICIPAL LANDFILL, WHICH HAD BEEN ESTABLISHED ON TECHNY PROPERTY. IN THE LAST FEW YEARS, THOSE DUTIES HAVE LEFT HIS DESK, THOUGH HE STILL HOLDS HIS POSITIONS REGARDING TLC AND HAS ADDED A NEW ONE—ASSISTANT NOVICE DIRECTOR AT THE TECHNY NOVITIATE.

BRO. MAT ZEMEL BEGAN HIS MISSIONARY VOCATION LOOKING TO BE A BUILDER AT A MISSION OVERSEAS. INSTEAD, HIS MINISTRY HAS GENERATED FUNDS THAT SUPPORTS THE WORK IN SVD MISSIONS IN THIS COUNTRY AND AROUND THE WORLD.

“MY LIFE IN THE SVD, WAS IT WHAT I PLANNED TO DO? NOT REALLY,” HE SAID. “HAS IT TURNED OUT? I THINK IT'S TURNED OUT PRETTY GOOD.”

BROTHER MAT BECAME A MEMBER OF THE DIVINE WORD COUNCIL #7331, NORTHBROOK ON APRIL 11, 1985. HE HAS HELD POSITIONS ON BOTH THE COUNCIL AND STATE LEVEL. HE HAS BEEN THE RECIPIENT OF THE COLUMBIAN AWARD, MASTER'S MEDALLION AND STATE MEDALLION.

APPROPRIATE DRESS CODE FOR CANDIATES AND/OR OBSERVERS

Faithful Navigators are also asked to ensure that all Assembly Members and Candidates are made aware that **PROPER ATTIRE MUST BE WORN** to the Exemplification.

Candidates/Observers are expected to wear:

- **Business Suit** – either black, dark grey or dark blue in color
- **Plain white shirt** - with lay down collars – no wing tips
- **Black Tie** – plain black tie or bow tie
- **Black Socks** – dress socks
- **Black Dress Shoes** – only black dress shoes are permitted

Clergy (candidates/observers) are permitted to wear:

- **Blacks or cassock**

Active Military (candidates/observers) are permitted to wear:

- **Class A or Dress Uniform** - instead of the Black Tuxedo or dark suit. Candidates will have the option of not wearing the baldric (provided by us) with your dress uniform.

Observers are encouraged to wear their fourth-degree uniforms while attending the exemplification.

**If proper attire as described above is not followed,
you will not be permitted into the exemplification chamber.**

All food and drink provided by the hospitality rooms must remain in the hospitality rooms.
