ASSEMBLY BY-LAW CHANGE TO BE VOTED AT MARCH MEETING

**Proposed By-Law Change
Holy Spirit Assembly #3588
of**

Article VIII - Section 5

Fellow Holy Spirit Assembly members, as reviewed during our last monthly Assembly meeting on February 15, we will be voting on the following By-Laws change during our next monthly meeting on Wednesday, March 22. All active members present are allowed to vote.

As the By-Law Currently Reads:

Section. 5. No Officers shall receive any compensation for services rendered to Assembly, except the Faithful Comptroller, who shall be entitled to a fee of eight percent (8%) on all collections of dues from members; and the Faithful Purser, who shall receive expense reimbursement of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) per annum; such amounts being payable semi-annually at the January and July meetings.

By-Law Change as Proposed:

No Officers shall receive any compensation for services rendered to the Assembly, except the Faithful Comptroller, who shall be entitled to a fee of eight percent (8%); and the Faithful Purser, WHO SHALL BE ENTITLED TO

A FEE OF SIX PERCENT (6%) on all collection of dues from members.

OFFICER ELECTIONS FOR FRATERNAL 2024

The election of Holy Spirit Assembly officers for the 2023-2024 fraternal year will be held during the General Assembly meeting on Wednesday, May 22. All members in good standing are entitled to vote. All members must be present in order to vote.

All Assembly members are eligible to serve as officers. Nominations are being accepted now for all elected positions and will be accepted until the vote is taken at the May Assembly meeting. Please provide any qualifying attributes of anyone you nominate.

A description of the duties of all officers is listed later in this newsletter. Please note that, similar to Councils, the Friar and Comptroller are not elected positions.

The 1-year and 2-year Trustee positions will be filled by the current 2- and 3-year Trustees who will automatically roll up.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF OFFICERS OF A 4TH DEGREE ASSEMBLY

The Laws and Rules Governing the Fourth Degree of the Knights of Columbus specifically set the duties and responsibilities of Assembly Officers. This guide is meant to help new Sir Knights and interested parties become informed about each position.

Assembly Officer Position (Equivalent Council Officer Position) Position Description

FAITHFUL NAVIGATOR (Similar to Grand Knight):

The Faithful Navigator is the chief executive officer of the assembly and acts as the Presiding Officer, with all the powers and duties assigned to such office. He appoints committees, countersigns orders and checks. He serves as the Chairman of the Board of Trustees and is an ex-officio member of all committees. He is responsible for establishing a Color Corps and annually appoints or reappoints the Assembly Color Corps Commander. He may perform such other

duties as the Supreme Assembly may impose.
FAITHFUL FRIAR (Non-elected Officer; Similar to Chaplain): The Faithful Friar is the Spiritual Advisor of the Assembly. He is expected to make a report at Assembly Meetings on religious matters. The Faithful Navigator, Faithful Captain, Faithful Admiral, and Faithful Pilot appoint a Priest annually in accordance with such rules established by the Bishop of the Diocese to serve the Assembly.

FAITHFUL CAPTAIN (Similar to Deputy Grand Knight): The Faithful Captain shall, in the absence of the Faithful Navigator, perform the duties and exercise the powers of that office. He shall also, to assure a good attendance at meetings and other functions, have charge of social and other activities under the Good of the Order.

FAITHFUL PILOT (Similar to Warden): The Faithful Pilot shall have charge of all properties of the Assembly excepts monies, accounts and record books of the officers, but including ceremonials. He shall be responsible for arrangement of the Assembly Chamber and shall direct and be responsible for the activities of the Sentinels.

FAITHFUL ADMIRAL (Similar to Immediate Past Faithful Grand Knight): The Faithful Admiral shall preside in case of the absence of both

the Faithful Navigator and Faithful Captain. He may also perform other duties as assigned him by the Faithful Navigator. In the absence of the Faithful Friar, he performs his duties at assembly meetings.

FAITHFUL COMPTROLLER (Non-elected Officer; Similar to Financial Secretary): The Faithful Comptroller shall keep a roll and the records of the members with the date of their initiation in the Fourth Degree. He shall collect and receive all monies due the Assembly and all funds obtained from any source and transfer the same to the Faithful Purser, and obtain a receipt from him. He shall keep accounts of the charges and receipts of each member and issue to each member not indebted to the Assembly for dues, a Fourth Degree Membership Card. He shall upon request by a member transferring to another assembly, issue a transfer card, signed by the Faithful Navigator and attested by the Faithful Comptroller. He shall keep such necessary Official Records and forms as furnished by the Supreme Secretary. He shall notify the District Master of the names of all candidates awaiting initiation. He is the custodian of the Seal of the Assembly and affixes the same to all proper papers.

FAITHFUL PURSER (Similar to Treasurer): The Faithful Purser is the custodian of all funds obtained from any source. He makes deposits and keeps records, pays all orders drawn on him by the Faithful Comptroller and Faithful Navigator and makes records available to the Board of Trustees as required.

FAITHFUL SCRIBE (Similar to Recorder): The Faithful Scribe shall keep a record of the minutes of all regular and special meetings in a bound book furnished for that purpose by the Assembly.

FAITHFUL INNER & OUTER SENTINELS (Similar to Inside and Outside Guards): The Faithful Inner and Outer Sentinels shall be responsible to see that all in attendance at meetings are in possession of appropriate valid Third- and Fourth-Degree membership cards and shall perform such other duties as directed by the Faithful Pilot.

3 TRUSTEES (Similar to a Council's Board of Trustees): Together with the Faithful Navigator, Trustees serve as the Board of Trustees. The Board is responsible for auditing the record books of the Faithful Comptroller and Faithful Purser semiannually. Trustees shall perform other duties as directed by the assembly, assembly officers, District Master and Vice Supreme Master.

WHY THE 4TH DEGREE IS IMPORTANT

Why should you talk to your 3rd Degree Brother Knights about getting their 4th Degree? The 4th Degree allows a Knight to fully complete their commitment to the Knights of Columbus. Sir Knights express their Patriotism by serving Veterans who have bravely served their country. As our Faithful Navigator has mentioned, Covid restrictions have limited our access to the Veterans Hospital, the Fisher House and Welcome Home Vets. **Those opportunities are beginning to open up again.**

Some Sir Knights serve as Honor Guard Members who serve at wakes and funerals of fellow Sir Knights who have been called home to God. They also are called upon to serve at other church functions.

All Sir Knights in good standing receive long term Mass memorials upon their passing. *The options for this are shown on a form later in this newsletter.* All current Sir Knights are encouraged to fill out this form now. Choices may always be changed at a later date.

The Knights of Columbus Supreme Council has recently introduced a new uniform for Honor Guard members. Holy

Spirit is offering \$200 to Sir Knights who volunteer to serve in the Honor Guard to help defray the cost of the uniform purchase. Please fill out the form included with all 4th degree information in this newsletter.

Please carefully review the 4th Degree materials presented in this newsletter and share them with your brother knights.

What is the Fourth Degree?

Another degree open to members in the Knights of Columbus is the Fourth Degree. The first exemplification of that degree was held in New York City, on February 22, 1900. The ritual added Patriotism to the three principles of the Order: Charity, Unity and Fraternity.

The primary purpose of the Fourth Degree is to foster the spirit of patriotism by promoting responsible citizenship and a love of and loyalty to the Knights' respective countries through active membership in local Fourth Degree groups (called "assemblies"). Fourth Degree members must retain their membership as Third-Degree members in their council to remain in good standing with the Fourth Degree.

Certain members of the Fourth Degree serve as honor guards at civic and religious functions, an activity that has brought worldwide recognition to the Knights of Columbus.



To the left is pictured the Fourth Degree Emblem. Bearers of this emblem are committed to conduct themselves honorably as Christian gentlemen in their private and public lives, as well as acting patriotically for the good of their nations. Likewise, the Fourth-Degree sword represents the bearer's reverence for the Eucharist and the Pope, Bishops and hierarchy of the Church, and displays publicly his willingness to protect his Church and Priests.

The triad features the dove, the cross and the globe. The dove, classic symbol of the Holy Spirit and peace, is shown hovering over the orb of the Earth (globe). Both are mounted on a variation of the Crusader's cross, which was found on the tunics and capes of the Crusading Knights who battled to regain the Holy Land from the pagans. Spiritually, the sacred symbols on the emblem typify the union of the Three Divine Persons in one Godhead, the most Blessed Trinity. □ The Globe - God the Father, Creator of the Universe

- The Cross - God the Son, Redeemer of Mankind
- The Dove - God the Holy Spirit, Sanctifier of Humanity

The colors of the symbols are: A blue globe with the land of the Western Hemisphere in white

- A red cross with gold borders and gold knobs at the end of the points forming the ends of the arms of the cross, also known as the Isabella cross
- A white dove

Red, white and blue are the colors of the flag of the country in which the Knights originated. They are used to stress Patriotism, the principle of the Fourth Degree.

Considered under a religious aspect, we have the honor and privilege of wearing on our swords and our lapels the sacred symbol of the Most Blessed Trinity. This should always remind us to live a good Christian life, and that we should never bring dishonor on the emblem we have been privileged to wear. By this, others may see our good works, through which we will glorify our Holy Religion, our Honored Order and our Beloved Country.
