The Virginia Knights of Columbus Ecumenical Chalice

*Commissioned in honor of the 100th Anniversary of the Knights of Columbus in the
Commonwealth of Virginia
(May 21, 2001)*

The Chalice, 10 inches tall with an 8-inch base, crafted in solid sterling silver with 24-carat gold plate. The style is a modified Exultet I chalice, a classic Gothic design, crafted in October 2001 in the atelier of the master engraver of Adrian Hamers, Inc.

The symbolic representation was conceived by Charter Grand Knight Edward M. Scheidt, in consultation with Council Chaplain, the Rev. Thomas P. Ferguson, who also serves as Chairman of the Ecumenical & Interreligious Affairs Committee of the Diocese of Arlington.

At the cup level, one finds enameled illustrations of the Knights of Columbus and the State of Virginia facing the celebrant; engraved are three words: UNITY, CHARITY, and FRATERNITY, in blue, completing the cup circumference. The chalice is set with 15 semi-precious stones.

The base has a raised relief of proportionately scaled symbols. The letters **"I H S" with Cross**, symbolizing Christ's presence, facing the celebrant. "I H S" are the first 3 letters of "JESUS" in Greek. The **Anchor**, an early Christian symbol for Christ and symbol associated with Knights of Columbus. Our faith is anchored in Christ. The **Lotus**: a symbol of purity, a symbol from the East; the symbol also represents the Primrose, an ancient Judaic and Christian symbol. Used in Solomon's temple and on the High Priest's robe, the primrose symbolizes immortality, royalty, fertility, and, later, for Christians, the resurrection of our Lord, immortality, the virgin, and the hope & unity of the Church. The **Crescent Moon**, a symbol associated with Islam, draws its light from the Sun. Light comes to humanity when submitting to God's will. Through the Eucharist our lives conform more and more to Christ, his sacrifice, and his love for the Church. The **Lamb of God**: an early symbol of Christ – sacrificial love. God spared Abraham's son Isaac with a ram. Our sins are remitted by the sacrifice of God's innocent Son, Jesus. The Sacrificial Lamb links the symbolism of Judaism and Christianity. **The Bible** ("book") with the Greek characters: **Alpha (Α)** and **Omega. (Ω)** Christ is the Word of God's creation spoken in the beginning of time, and the fulfillment of the Final Days (Ω). The Book calls to mind great religions of the Book, Judaism, Islam, and Christianity. The Alpha and Omega symbols are common to both the Eastern and Western Christian traditions.

The paten is in a classical dish style. The inside of the well carries the hand carved **emblem of the Knights of Columbus**. The left and right rims carry the hand carved **Chalice with Grapes/Vine** motif and three leaf Shamrock. Grapes in a chalice symbolize Christ's blood truly present in the form of wine. The **Three Leaf Shamrock** is a Christian symbol associated with Ireland; St. Patrick is said to have used it to explain the mystery of the Trinity.

The bottom plate of the chalice carries the following memorial inscription: "St. Luke Council, McLean, Virginia Knights: Faith, Hope, and Love—and the greatest of these is love: The Scheidt Family."

The Virginia Ecumenical Chalice was presented to His Holiness, St. John Paul II, the Ecumenical Pontiff at the time, for his blessing. His Holiness celebrated the Holy Eucharist with this chalice in the Papal Apartment, Vatican City, on November 8, 2001, making the State Chalice a 2nd class relic.

Symbols of the Fourth Degree

The Baldric:

The Baldric, a part of the Official Regalia of the Fourth Degree, sustains the sword of liberty. It is trimmed with the national Colors and worn from the right shoulder toward the left hip, with the emblem of the Order near the heart of the wearer.



The Sword:

The sword of liberty being displayed is one of the emblems of the Fourth Degree. Although used by the Knights in the Middle Ages as a weapon in defense of their faith, the Knights of today use it as a token of honor to others. Sir Knights pledge “to keep it bright for Liberty’s sake.”



The Chalice:

The Chalice being displayed here is symbolic of the Sacred Vessel presented by living members of the Fourth Degree in memory of a deceased Sir Knight at the time of his death.



The Flag of the United States of America:

The flag of our country, which is the source of the colors of Red, White, and Blue, are symbolic of our Patriotic Degree dedicated to love of our country, love of our Church, and love of family.



The Rose:

The rose is symbolic of our Order’s support and involvement with the Right of the Unborn and the Right to Life movement.



The Rosary:

The Rosary of the Knights of Columbus is symbolic of our Order’s devotion to the cause of our Blessed Mother, whose love has encircled all of us.

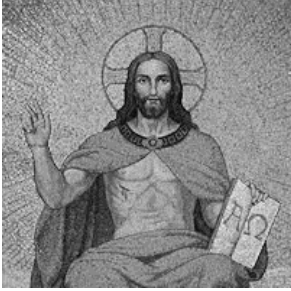

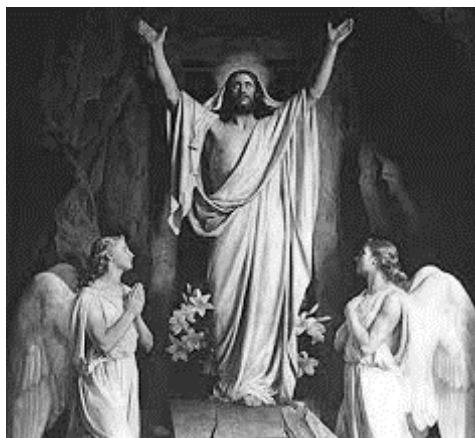

Glory to you, O Lord.

Jesus said to His disciples, "I am the true vine, and my Father is the vine grower. He takes away every branch in Me that does not bear fruit, and every one that does He prunes so that it bears more fruit. You are already pruned because of the word that I spoke to you. Remain in Me, as I remain in you. Just as a branch cannot bear fruit on its own unless it remains on the vine, so neither can you unless you remain in me. I am the vine, you are the branches. 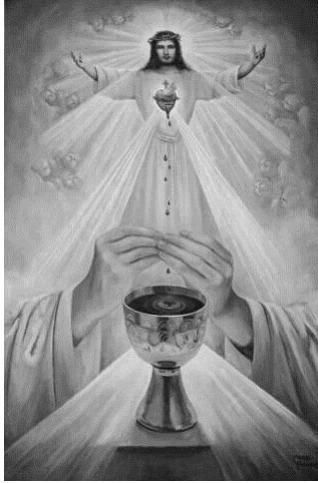

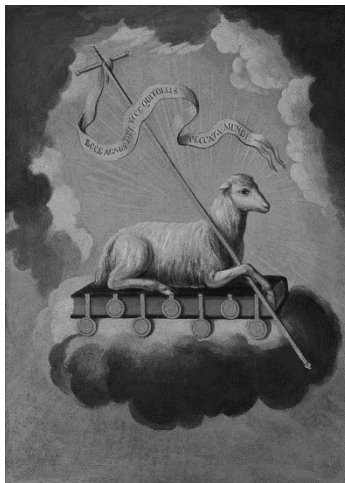

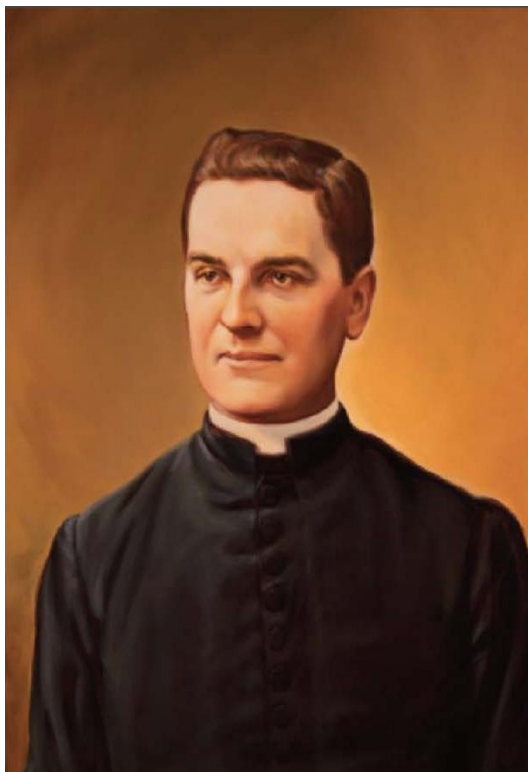
