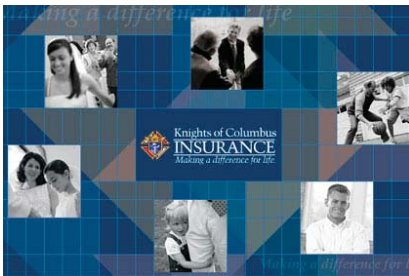

Only Having Insurance “Through Work” Doesn’t Work



Do you know anyone whose life or career has drastically changed during these years of economic downturn? It’s very likely that someone in your immediate or extended family or

group of friends is facing financial uncertainty. Maybe there’s a possibility that you (or your spouse) could lose your job or change employers.

Too many people have often relied on group term life insurance as their only safety net. Often, this insurance is an employee benefit provided at low or no cost. The existence of this coverage might convince someone that personally-owned life insurance is not necessary.

But only having “through work” insurance can leave you and your family vulnerable. Most group life insurance policies are limited in amount, which may be tied to salary or some other benchmark. These numbers are often capped, and this cap may be dangerously low when compared to your family’s actual needs. In fact, a detailed needs analysis that evaluates your specific situation, will likely show that any employer-provided coverage falls short.

In addition, the amount of group insurance offered is almost always reduced, sometimes dramatically, when you retire. You could one day find yourself without coverage, and if your health has changed (which it will as you age), you might also find yourself unable to secure individual protection. At the very least, it will definitely be more expensive.

While group life insurance can help, it does not replace the need for individually owned life insurance. I’ll be happy to meet with you and provide a no-cost needs analysis, so you’ll know exactly where you stand.

Holidays appear in **LIGHT BLUE**.

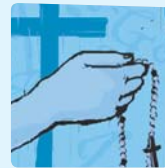
The event calendar on our new web site provides some powerful features you should be aware of. There are several types of events and one of them is a "Sign Up" event. Sign Up events allow you to sign up to attend or be a volunteer worker at the event. This helps us manage our events and communicate with the attendees. You can sign up simply by clicking on the event in the event calendar. If it is a sign up event, you will see a button labeled "CLICK HERE TO SIGN UP". If there is no button, it is not a sign up type event. You can remove your sign up later if you need to. You can also email the event chairman.

Each event has one event chairman and up to two event co-chairmen. An event chairman can manage events using the Event Management button on the main menu. You will need to log in using your member number.

Once logged in, you can send reminder emails to those signed up, add or remove members from the sign up roster, print the roster or make changes to the event information content or times (to reschedule an event, you need to contact an administrator).

For past events, you can still update or print the roster and send email to the roster members (such as a thank you note). This helps us keep track of how our events turned out.

Also, want to see who has a birthday? Click on "Show birthdays" and those that have birthdays will be visible on the calendar!
