## Grand Knight's Message

This message will start from the big picture. The world is shocked and Ukraine is traumatized by Putin's invasion. Let us pray that Pope Francis can wield some influence with his unprecedented personal visit to the Russian embassy at the Vatican. It is pretty clear already the Russian people are also already suffering from western imposed sanctions. Pope Francis appealed again on Feb. 27, for an end to the war in Ukraine, for "the silencing of the guns" and the opening of humanitarian corridors to those fleeing the war. "God is with those who work for peace, not with those who use violence. The pope's words were also directed to hundreds of pilgrims from many countries. He said, "I invite everyone to make March 2, Ash Wednesday, a day of prayer and of fasting for peace in Ukraine," he said, repeating his appeal of last week. He called on people to make it "a day to be close to the suffering of the people of the Ukraine, a day to feel that we are all brothers and sisters and to implore God for the end of the war."

Locally, the recent months have been both very

## Tri-Tip Fundraiser Results

Our second annual Super Bowl Tri-tip Fundraiser by the Knights of Columbus of Council 1990 was another very successful event. We generated \$5,800 in profits to support our council seminarians!

Like last year, the initial planning efforts started in the Fall, and involved reviewing what was successful about our first fundraiser, and how we could make our second one even more successful. We decided not to change the menu of tri-tip, green beans and mashed potatoes. And we agreed that pre-selling the meals in advance worked out great the year before, because it really helped us with **our planning and purchasing “just what we need.”**

One major improvement over last year, though, was that we did elect to try taking advantage of the loosening Covid restrictions to promote our event in person at our three parishes. As a result, beginning in early January and over five consecutive Sundays, we set up a tent outside of either St. James, St. Lawrence Martyr, or St. John Fisher and advertised our fundraiser after the Sunday morning Masses.

This was a great way to make people aware that they could go

# Chaplain's Reflection

February 2nd was, of course, Groundhog Day, when lots of Americans pause early in the morning to watch a furry little rodent from Punxsutawney, PA predict the weather for the next six weeks. **There's a well-defined ritual surrounding the event but, more than anything, it's a harmless little celebration giving folks an excuse to party and break the mid-winter doldrums.** The 1993 film, *Groundhog Day*, starring Bill Murray and Andie MacDowell, captures well the spirit of the day. Most importantly, however, February 2nd is a beautiful day in the life of the Church, the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, when in fulfillment of the law of **Moses, "Mary and Joseph took Jesus up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord."** There in the Temple they were met by a **"righteous and devout"** man, Simeon, who took Jesus into his arms and recognized him as **"a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for your people Israel."** (Cf. Lk 2: 22-40) To emphasize that Jesus is indeed light for the world, on that day, also called Candlemas Day, the Church



blesses candles to be used in our churches and homes throughout the year. In this ceremony the Church prays that in using the sanctified **candles, we too may "tread the path of virtue so that we will reach that light which never fails, Christ our Lord."** **We need the light of Christ in the world today, don't we?** In place of the darkness, division and confusion of our time, we need the light, peace and truth that Jesus offers us. Remember that Jesus solemnly proclaimed that he is the **"light of the world."** (Jn 8: 12). But sharing light with the world is not a task for Jesus alone. Jesus told his disciples, **"You are the light of the world . . . Your light must shine before others that they may see your good deeds and glorify your heavenly Father"** (Mt 5: 14,16) The task of being light of the world belongs properly, then, to

on to our council website and pre-purchase their Super Bowl meals, or even to make their orders directly with us that morning at our tent.

Our ability to promote the event this way really paid off. By many accounts we doubled our effort from last year. In fact, we had to end our pre-sale activities a day earlier than planned, because we effectively sold-out. As a result, we grossed over \$12,500 in collections.

And just as importantly, the food turned out great. We used the same recipes and from-scratch approach to prepare everything, and people let us know that they noticed. When the cooking was complete, we had steamed 192 pounds of green beans, peeled and mashed 250 pounds of potatoes, and cleaned, seasoned, and cooked 926 pounds of tri-tip.

Dozens of Knights worked many hours leading up to and including the event on February 13, 2022. It was a great opportunity for fellowship, and to do what we Knights enjoy doing most – serving others.

If you were able to support us this year, we thank you for **helping us make this event a resounding success. And if you weren't** able to try our food this year, we encourage you to think of us for the next Super Bowl, which will be on February 12, 2023. Just remember to get your pre-orders in early. We aim to sell out!

 After missing last year completely due to COVID we are back for in-hall dining, outside seating, and take-out orders!

For this year only [I hope], we are bypassing the make your own salad bar as well as other traditional self-serve stations that will be manned, to limit the germ/virus transmissions

Everything is more expensive so we had to up the price, something **we haven't done in several years. The menu still offers baked or fried, Icelandic Cod and potatoes, with green salad, dinner roll, and dessert for \$15 Adult and \$10 for children [\$7 if two or more]**

**Weifeng Tong's Autobiography**

**My name is Weifeng "Joseph" Tong.** I was born on February 27<sup>th</sup>, 1990, and grew up in a devoted Catholic family in the Nanqi Parish within the Weinan diocese in China. I am an only child. My grandparents had ten children: six daughters, and four sons. On both sides of the family, there are cousins who are diocesan priests **and members of a women's religious order.** They are my role

models. I told myself that I would be a priest just like them in the future.

I grew up in a village Church, and if our Church had Mass, my parents would always bring me **to attend the Church's rite.** On days that my home parish did not have Mass, my parents, like other Catholic families, would have us pray at home. During my childhood, I spent most of my days in the church, where I was surrounded by the love and influence of the many priests, nuns, and seminarians of the church. I spent as much time with them as I could because they helped me to understand the lessons of the Bible. I was instilled with a very strong sense of the Catholic faith in my childhood. For example, I remember when I was 6 years old, my pastor Fr. Bai asked me to help him during Mass, so I became an Altar Server. It was very beautiful when I helped the priest to celebrate Mass. There were many youth activities in my parish, and I spent a lot of good times with young people, priests, and nuns who taught us about the Church which helped me better understand God. I learned the catechism and beautiful Church songs and I think that it was during this period that I started to hear my calling from God little

by little.

I was 16 years old when I went to see my Bishop after I graduated from middle school. I went to him to tell him I wanted to become a priest. However, he advised me to finish high school first and then enter the seminary. I accepted his advice and went to finish high school, followed by a Vocational College which led me to a job during the third year of my college. So, in the last quarter of school, I went to work. I worked from November 2011 to February 2013 **in the industry of Shannxi Xi'an. I quit my job on Feb 20, 2013, and** joined my diocese in preparing for the seminary. On March 8, 2013, I went to stay with my Bishop and prepared to enter the **Seminary at the Bishop's residence. I was living together with the** Bishop for about six months at the diocesan center, and then I entered Jilin Seminary in the North-East of China in September 2013. At the Jilin Seminary, I practiced building up my spiritual life and fitting in with all my brothers. I was happy to study and stay with seminarian brothers together in the very simple seminary, and I always tried my best to study hard. I have one year of experience in seminary, and this one-year of seminary life helped me to understand my vocation more clearly and vividly.

I have my personal time to practice having a relationship with our God, and my heart has been touched. When I am praying and opening my heart to God, I get so overwhelmed my eyes fill up with tears. I know that Jesus Christ our Lord calls me for a great mission, and I must prepare well spiritually and intellectually. I give my best with Jesus Christ to do more to work with God in serving our brothers and sisters anywhere he places me.

Time flies. I have been living in the USA since 2015, and I have been living in the parish of St. Frances of Rome for six years. The first two years, I worked on my English and lived a completely different life from my experience in China. I think the biggest **challenge was the language because I didn't speak English. I know** God always takes care of me anywhere, and I never give up on myself at moments of difficulty.

I lived in the Queen of Angels Center for Priestly Formation (QofA) from 2017 to 2019 and graduated from Marymount **California University. I have been studying theology at St. John's**

Seminary (SJS) for two years. I am very grateful to have experiences in QofA and SJS community, and these two communities helped me with my priesthood formation. As a seminarian, daily and personal prayer are necessary to build a closer relationship with God. The formators and seminarian brothers help me with my studies, and the community gives me a warm environment for the formation and deeper friendships with seminarian brothers. I know we gather for the same mission, which is to become a tool of God, as a missionary to spread the words of the Lord and to evangelize the good news to all creatures.

I have already completed my second year of theological study, so I am currently on my internship year at The Beatitudes of Our Lord in La Mirada. The seminary program for priesthood formation requires all seminarians to have a one-year internship at a parish after their second year of theological studies. The seminarian is supervised and observed by the pastor and a group of parishioners from the parish. Why is this? Pastoral internship is very important to seminarians because it gives the seminarian an opportunity to have a full-time experience in the rectory with another priest. They can learn about parish life that aids the discernment process and the call to the ministerial **priesthood. One year of the internship can help seminarians'** continuous personal growth and the development of their human, spiritual, intellectual, and pastoral formation which will help them to make a clear goal towards the priestly ordination.

I want to thank the Knights of Columbus and all the people who have prayed for me and supported me. Thanks be to God, and with the grace of God, I have more confidence to **prepare myself to become God's servant to serve our brothers** and sisters throughout my life. I will keep you all in my prayers, and please pray for my classmates too.
