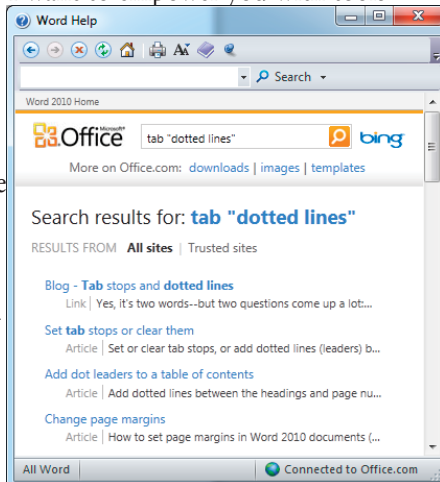
**Computer Tips**

How many times have you needed help when you are trying to accomplish something with your computer program? You basically know *what* you want to do but do not know *how* to do it.



I frequently receive calls for help with requests that, with a little looking, can be answered either right from the program itself, or in many cases simply “googling” the question in the Google text box the answers are right at your finger tips.

I am **NOT** suggesting that those of you that ask for my help quit, but rather I want to empower you with tools that will give you concise answers as quickly as possible. I almost always copy and paste the answers found in the program help files or from the Google website to answer your questions. You can just cut out the middle man and save a little time.



The easiest way to find your answers is to do a search on a word that is associated with what you want to do. For instance if you want to know how to set up Tabs that will include leading dots as you see in the Birthdays in December you can search on the word “tab” and find references to many different options concerning tabs. **Note: Putting words in your search criteria surrounded by quotes (“dotted lines”) will look for those specific words together.** This can help narrow down your search to specific things you are looking for rather than everything that has to do with tabs.

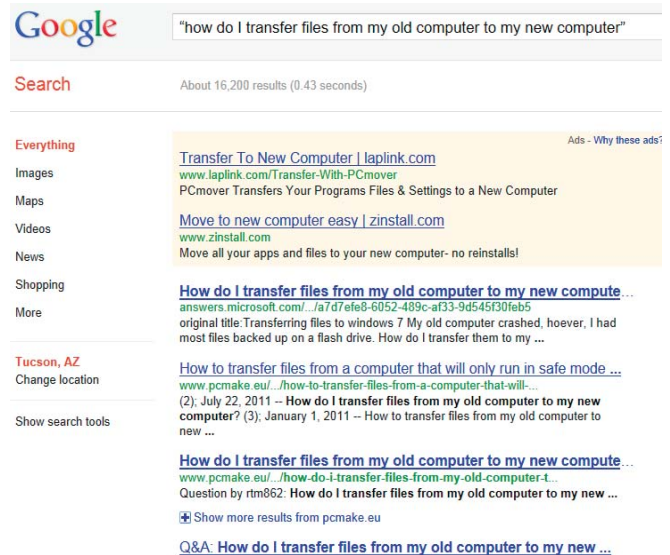
Using Google to find the answers is just as easy. However you now will have the benefit of not only the program help files but also forums, technical documents from many different sources and online help files from the people who

wrote the program (such as the Microsoft website for this question concerning Word 2010).

You can even ask a question like “how do I transfer files from my old computer to my new computer” in Google and you will find all the help you need. As you can see, asking that question surrounded by quotes narrows your



answers. So, give this a try. The more you try playing with search criteria the better you get. I haven't been skunked yet!

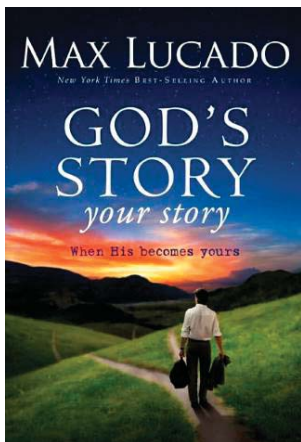


## Readers Review

### *God's Story, Your Story*

By Max Lucado



I first fell in love with Max Lucado's writings while taking a class in preparation for my daughter's First Holy Communion five years ago. He has that down to earth style, speaking to you as if a friend or relative. Most of what he writes is common sense, however, the reader almost always experiences that 'ah ha' moment.

God's Story, Your Story, lived up to Lucado's other writings, bringing inspiration and renewed faith. He artfully demonstrates how our lives are intertwined with God's Word, and helps the reader find deeper meaning in your circumstances by clinging to the Scriptures while your story unfolds.

"It's not that our plans are bad, but that God's plans are better."

How many times have we prayed for something to go our way, and when it doesn't, we feel remorse, upset, perhaps lost? Lucado points the way through the Bible to show us that God's plan is better than ours, sometimes it may not feel that way, but if we can remember that we are in His hands, and have faith, than we know that we are not alone.

Of course, we do not know what God's plan for us is, and I liked the way that Lucado included stories of people like Nelson Mandela, Moses and Paul, who all went through a long wait and had their trials and tribulations before God finished preparing them for what he needed them to accomplish!
