

BROOKVILLE BICENTENNIAL CELEBRATION FRIDAY THRU SUNDAY – AUGUST 29-31, 2014

In 1814, as the British burned the capital, refugees from Washington and Georgetown poured into Brookeville, Maryland and the townspeople took them into their homes. American soldiers leaving Bladensburg and militiamen on their way to Baltimore came to Brookeville, where the citizens gave them food and spirits and a place to camp and pasture their horses. Washington's banks sent the specie (money) and clerks brought the U.S. Senate's papers to Brookeville for safekeeping. And finally, after being on the

run in northern Virginia for two nights, the President of the United States and members of his Cabinet came to Brookeville, taking refuge at the home of its postmaster. The town became known as the "U.S. Capital for a Day."

During the weekend of August 29-31 Brookville will celebrate the 200th anniversary of this historic event by throwing a huge party! Georgia Avenue will be shut down in Brookville and all kinds of period activities are planned, re-enactments, carriage rides and much more. They expect 10,000 visitors including the Governor of Maryland and a host of other dignitaries. Please visit www.uscapitalforaday.org for additional information.

On Sunday August 31, Fr. Maher Council will be serving dinner, under the main tent, in front of the Longwood Recreation Center from 4 – 6 pm. 

MARYLAND STATE COUNCIL NEWS



The 116th Maryland State Knights of Columbus Convention was held in Ocean City, MD May 2 through 4, 2014. All 152 of the State's councils participated in the convention, which resulted in, among other things, the election of Christopher Powers as State Warden. Powers was one of six candidates for the post.

Another convention highlight was the announcement of awards for the various service programs. GK Giacalone was gratified to accept five (5) awards on behalf of Council 6793:

1. Surge with Service Plaque (Awarded for participation in all six of the program areas.)
2. A 2nd Place Certificate for Church Activities (Division-A) 45 councils participated in the Division-A group.
3. A 1st Place Certificate for Community Activities
4. A 3rd Place Certificate for its Fr. Maher's Knightly News newsletter. This is a first win for Council 6793.
5. A plaque representing a special award for Council 6793's Church Activities. This award is voted upon only by the State Officers and recognizes the best five reports among all six categories, regardless of division. This award represented council 6793's work on the Christmas 2013 "Catholics Come Home" program, spearheaded by, then, Chaplain, Rev. Father Joseph Rogers. Any Council, which receives these awards are automatically entered in a judging by the Supreme Council. Council 6793 looks forward to the outcome of that judging. And more importantly, highlighting this most worthy program.

Warriors to Lourdes Source: Supreme KofC Website



The Knights of Columbus supported the *Archdiocese for the Military Services* in its 2014 Pilgrimage to Lourdes for Wounded Troops. More than 125 wounded or disabled troops and veterans, family members, chaplains and support staff joined other U.S. pilgrims for the annual Warriors to Lourdes Pilgrimage for Wounded or Disabled Military Personnel organized by the Archdiocese for the Military Services, USA (AMS) and supported by the Knights of Columbus.

The May 14-19 pilgrimage is part of the 56th International Military Pilgrimage, which included delegations from more than 40 countries. The AMS pilgrims attended many events and a number of other religious and spiritual activities, including Masses, the Stations of the Cross and times of reflection. They also had the opportunity to bathe in the waters of Lourdes, which annually draw millions of the faithful, many of whom seek spiritual, physical or emotional healing.

Members of the Knights of Columbus, headed by Supreme Knight Carl Anderson also joined the pilgrimage. "No one knows the value of peace better than those who endured war," Supreme Knight Anderson said. "The Knights of Columbus are honored to be able to support — and pray with — these soldiers and veterans as they come to Lourdes to seek the help of the Blessed Mother in their lives, enrich their faith, and pray with those in uniform from around the world for peace."

The Knights of Columbus has worked closely with the AMS for many years, and the organization's support of the military goes back even further. Nearly a century ago, during World War I, the Knights took a decisive leadership role in supporting the temporal and spiritual needs of the troops.

At that time, Knights were active in serving American troops at home and abroad through the organization's "Army Hut" program, which provided hospitality centers for the troops in the United States and Europe and served as a precursor to the United Service Organizations (USO). Under the banner "Everybody Welcome, Everything Free," the Knights provided centers in a number of countries, including France, Germany, Italy, Belgium, the United Kingdom and the United States. During and immediately following World War I, the Knights also ran such a center in Lourdes itself and assisted American soldiers in France with pilgrimages to the Marian shrine. At that time, the Knights also produced a guidebook to Lourdes to assist the American pilgrims.
