From the Desk of the Financial Secretary

I hope everyone had a wonderful Christmas with their families and I wish you each a Joyful New Year.

I want to take time this month to explain what the two assessments are that appear on your council dues statement. These are both voluntary assessments.

The first is for the Raul G. Navarette Vocations Fund, RNV, and is for \$3.65. This fund was established by the Arizona State Council and is used solely to promote and foster vocations. Each member of the Arizona Knights is asked to donate a penny a day or \$3.65 per year.

Years ago, it was known as the "Pennies from Heaven" program and the donations were made at the annual State Council Meeting. It got to the point where councils were literally bringing wheelbarrows full of pennies to be donated. Today, the funds are collected as an assessment of \$3.65 per member.

The second assessment is the Culture of Life fund and is \$2.00. The Supreme Council established this fund

to help with legal and other assistance in matters affecting life, families, marriage and similar priorities in building a Culture of Life. Supreme Knight Carl Anderson has said "if we truly hope for a Culture of Life and a Civilization of Love, then we must first think and act in new ways."
