



General Agents Corner

May is national Disability insurance month, when the industry tries to focus all of the public on the need for disability insurance. The first problem is no one ever thinks they will be disabled, ever. We all think that we are indestructible and that it's not me it's the other guy who will be "disabled". The problem is that that's the **WRONG** definition. If you are **SICK OR HURT AND CAN'T WORK**, you are disabled. And how will your family pay the bills. We all know someone at church or in the council or in the neighborhood, who got sick, (cancer, heart attack stroke), or got seriously hurt, (car accident, workplace accident, recreational accident) and had to take time off from work. There is ton of confusion about what Social Security Disability Insurance pays, what workman's compensation pays, what group disability pays.

So let's make this simple;

Workman's compensation, pays when you are hurt at work, doing your assigned duties and your company has paid the premiums for a workman's comp policy. You must be hurt at work, doing your job to get coverage, and since you do not personally pay the premiums, the money you receive is taxable as income. You have to be reasonably expected to be out of work for a while before you can get benefits.

Group disability coverage, A. the company pays the premium. It can cover up to 70% of your income, but if the company pays the premium all the money you and your family gets is taxable. B. You pay the premiums on the group coverage, usually covers about 60% of your pay, but the money you receive is not taxable. If you are eligible for this type of coverage, you should maximize it as it is the most economical way to protect your family. Waiting periods for when you get your money can vary with each policy and can be as short as 30 days after your injury or illness starts, or as long as 180 days, (6 months), in most cases your doctor must certify that you will be expected to be out of work for at least two years.

Social Security Disability coverage- The average social security case takes two years to be decided on and that is after a 6 month waiting period to be eligible to submit paperwork. Over 60% of legitimate claims are declined the first time they are applied for, though most are accepted on appeal. You can gauge the maximum you would be paid on this program by going to SSA.gov and clicking on My social security and logging in. This will allow you to not only see what you would get if disabled, but also track your retirement benefits. **THE SOCIAL SECURITY ADMINISTRATION IS NO LONGER MAILING OUT STATEMENTS EVERY YEAR IN THE MONTH OF YOUR BIRTH.** You have to search to find out what you are entitled to. The sad part of this equation is that most of the accepted cases are "Partial" disabilities. So, simply put, you get a part of the total you could have gotten. This comes a big surprise to most people.

So if we believe that our ability to earn income is our greatest asset, (it's the engine that drives everything else we do.....buy a house, buy a car, pay for our kids' education, vacations, clothes, the food we eat each week), then **EVERY SOUND FINANCIAL PLAN** must include not only life insurance for the greatest tragedy that could happen, we are killed, but also for the possibility that we could no longer work. The biggest obstacle to our fully protecting our families is not the medical exam, or our health. It is not the financial reporting requirements, (a copy of a pay stub or W-2 or a tax return), or even the money to pay the premiums. The biggest obstacle is the status quo. We think we are OK, because up until this very moment we have been.

The past is the past, it is written in stone, but the future is unknown and if we love our families and want be prepared to care for them, (and ourselves, just because we're sick doesn't mean we aren't going to eat), then we must take our heads out of the sand and meet with our field insurance agents to see if the Order can help protect what matters.....keeping the house, feeding the family, keeping our kids in school.....you know living, even if we are too hurt or sick to go to work.

Take the time to meet with your agent this May, during national disability insurance month, to make sure your family's most valuable asset is protected. It's who we are and what we do, **PROTECTING CATHOLIC FAMILIES SINCE 1882.**

Want another easy way? We will be holding a Diaper Drop at the convention again this year! Please be sure to remind your council's delegates and alternates (and everyone else coming down for the weekend) to pick up a couple boxes of diapers and wipes on their way to Wildwood! Bring them to the convention center and drop them off at our table. All the materials collected will be divided and donated to pregnancy care centers in all 5 dioceses.

Roses for Life. Your council should also be holding a Rose Sale at your parishes. For us to do all that we do for the Culture of Life, we must raise funds. It also helps to raise awareness as people wear these roses on their clothing. If you need to get a roll of roses, you can order them from State Chairman Jim Kukura using the form on page 10-21 of the Grand Knight's Manual.

Special Olympics. After we help women to choose life in May, let's celebrate the quality of life of our disabled citizens through the Special Olympics! The state games will be held June 12-14 at the College of New Jersey in Ewing Twp. On the morning of the 12th will be the Law Enforcement Torch Run across the entire state. The Torch will be brought into the Stadium at the College during the Opening Ceremonies, which begin at 7:30pm. Please encourage your assembly's color corps to participate. To do so, contact Second District Master Chet Kulak. In addition, volunteer help is always appreciated throughout all the events. If some of your members want to volunteer, they can register online at www.sonj.org, or contact Tom Ponting at 609-695-5081.

Disabilities Drive. If your council held a kick-off event last month, please be sure to submit your report this month to State Chairman Gary Seals. If you are holding your kick-off this summer, be sure and let us know when it is scheduled.
